



Single Rib Dishcloth

Materials:

Crochet hook US size C/2 (3 mm). If you crochet tightly, you may benefit from using US size E/4 (3.5 mm) Mayflower Cotton 8.

Buy yarn for the cloths here:

Measurements: approx. 9.4 x 9.4 inches (24 x 24 cm). If you wish a larger cloth, you just add a number of stitches divisible with 2

Amount of yarn used: approx. 1.8-1.9 oz. (50-55 g) per dishcloth.

Abbreviations:

ch: chain stitch

s: stitch

sc: single crochet

dc: double crochet

bpdc: back post double crochet

fpdc: front post double crochet

ss: slip stitch



Pattern:

- 1. Start by making a foundation chain. Ch 68.
- 2. In the 3rd ch from the crochet hook, work 1 dc. Work dc till the end of the row.
- 3. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 1 fpdc, "1 bpdc, 1 fpdc" Repeat from "to" till the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.
- 4. Turn your work by chaining 2. Work 1 bpdc, "1 fpdc, 1 bpdc" Repeat from "to" till the end of the row. Work 1 regular dc in the turning s.

Repeat alternating between row 3 and 4 until you have the desired cloth size.

Edge:

The edge can be left as it is, or you can crochet an edge of single crochet sts. In the corners, work 3 sc to get a rounded corner.

Instructions / bpdc and fpdc:



1. The first dc is replaced by the 2 ch sts, you turned your work with.



2. The first fpdc should be worked around the post of the 2nd dc of the previous row. The needle marks how the crochet hook should be worked around the post from the front.





3. Yarn over, and insert the hook around the post from the front, yarn over, and pull the yarn through as you do, when making a regular dc.



4. Yarn over and finish your dc as you normally would. Now you have worked your first fpdc.



5. Now, you are going to crochet 1 bpdc around the next dc of the previous row. The needle marks how the hook should go around the post from behind.



6. Yarn over, and insert the hook around the post, yarn over, and pull the yarn through as you would do when crocheting a regular dc.



7. Yarn over and finish your dc as you would normally do. Now, you have worked 1 bpdc.



8. Repeat alternating between a fpdc and a bpdc until the end of the row. In the turning sts, work 1 regular dc.





9. Turn your work by chaining 2. They replace the first regular dc



10. Now, work 1 bpdc around the post of the previous row.



11.And 1 fpdc around the next post of the previous row.



12. Repeat alternating between 1 bpdc and 1 fpdc until the end of the row.



13.. In the turning s, work 1 regular dc. Repeat the rows like this until you have the desired cloth size.
