

## Knit Dishcloth - Rib stitch

## Materials

- Knitting Needles US $2 ½$ (3.0mm)
- Rainbow fra Hobbii


## Buy the yarn here:

Gauge: 30 sts $\times 39$ rows $=4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}$

Finished Size: 10 " x 10 "

## Yarn Requirements:

50 g Rainbow, grey color 15

## Abbreviations

st: stitch
k: knit
p: purl
BO: Bind off: knit 2 stitches, pass the first stitch over the second.

## Edge Stitch

With yarn in front, slip 1 stitch as if to purl. Move yarn to back and continue working in pattern. The last stitch of the row should be knit.

Rib-pattern worked in groups of $4+1$ st
$\square$
Pattern: -See the photo tutorial for additional information.

CO 77 sts.

## Continue in pattern as follows:

1 edge stitch, (k2, p2) until there are 4 sts remaining, k2, p1, k1.
Repeat this row until the piece measures approx. 10"
Bind off in pattern.
Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.

Photo Tutorial - Edge stitch:


1. Bring the yarn to the front of the work.

2. Slip 1 st as if to purl: Insert needle from right to left and slip the stitch to the right needle without knitting it.

3. Move the yarn to the back of the work.

## Photo Tutorial - Bind Off:



1. Knit 2 stitches $=2$ sts on the right needle. Pass the first stitch over the second stitch.

2. TIP. If the last st is too loose, you can k2tog with the last stitch and the edge st.

3. The last stitch on the row should be knit. This technique gives the piece a finished look with a smooth edge on both sides.

4. Only 1 st remains on the right needle. Repeat until all sts have been bound off.

5. Pull the last remaining stitch to form a long loop and cut the yarn. Pull the yarn through the stitch to create a knot. Weave in the ends.
