## Teddy & blanket

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### Materials

Teddy 37 cm:

Couture: 300 g

Soft: 25 g

Hook: 3,0 - 4,0 mm

Eyes: 14 mm

Toy stuffing

Blanket 70 x 70 cm:

Cosy: 450 g

Needle: 3,0 - 4,0 mm

Hook: 3,0 - 4,0 mm

Crocheted in Go handmades Couture:  
100% Acrylic, 50 g/50 m and Go handmades  
Cosy: 60% Cotton/40% Acrylic, 50 g/100 m.

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## MATERIALS:

### TEDDY

300 g Go Handmade Couture yarn  
25 g Go Handmade Soft yarn (double yarn)  
Embroidery yarn  
2 safety eyes 14 mm  
Filling  
Crochet hook 3,0 - 4,0 mm

### HOODED BABY BLANKET

450 g Go handmade Cosy yarn  
Circular knitting needles 3,0 - 4,0 mm  
Crochet hook 3,0 - 4,0 mm

Gauge on 3,5 mm needles:  
21 sts garter stitch = 10 cm.

*All stated yarn lengths are guideline only and depend on style of crochet/knitting.*

**If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sl st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.**

## ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
cr	Center ring (2 ch, work the specified number of stitches into the second stitch from the hook)
N	Needle
M1	Increase 1 st by lifting the horizontal strand between two stitches, then k the st tbl
ch	Chain stitch
t-ch	Turn chain stitch, 1 ch then turn the work
sl st	Slip stitch
dc	Double crochet
tr	Treble crochet
2 dc inc	Increase (2 dc in one st)
dc 2 tog	Decrease (2 dc worked together)
1 picot	3 ch, 1 dc in the first of the 2 ch, skip 1 dc, 1 dc
{...}	The instructions shown in these brackets must be repeated for the whole round/row.
(..)	At the end of the line - indicates the total number of stitches.

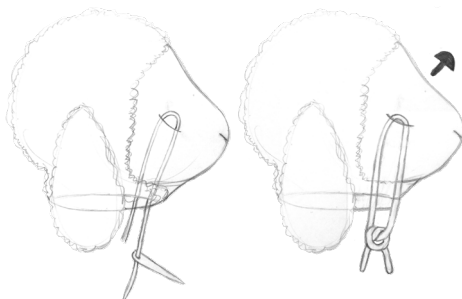

Insert the eyes during round 13 - 14. Position the disks of the eyes from the inside, push with a coin if necessary.

Stuff the head with filling.

Cut the yarn and pull through the stitches, tighten and sew the head together leaving a small opening. Form the head and the eye holes: pull a thread from the opening of the head (the part that will be sewn onto the body) to the place of one eye, guide the thread around a stitch and back. Tighten to form the eye deepening, attach the thread with a knot. Repeat for the other eye. See drawing. Close the last opening.





## SNOUT

With *Couture yarn*.

- 1.) cr with 6 dc (6)
- 2.) {2 dc inc} (12)
- 3.) {1 dc, 2 dc inc} (18)
- 4.) {2 dc, 2 dc inc} (24)
- 5.) {3 dc, 2 dc inc} (30)
6. - 9.) 30 dc (30)

Add filling to the snout.

Sew the snout onto the head between rounds 16 and 24.

Embroider the nose.

## EARS (2 X)

With *Couture yarn*.

- 1.) cr with 6 dc, 1 t-ch, turn the work (6)
- 2.) {2 dc inc}, 1 t-ch, turn the work (12)
- 3.) {1 dc, 2 dc inc}, 1 t-ch, turn the work (18)
- 4.) {2 dc, 2 dc inc} (24)

Sew the ears on from round 4 to 14, approximately mid head.

Sew the head to the body when all parts have been attached.

## ARMS (2 X)

Start with the *Soft yarn* held double.

- 1.) cr with 6 dc (6)
- 2.) {2 dc inc} (12)
- 3.) {1 dc, 2 dc inc} (18)
- 4.) {2 dc, 2 dc inc} (24)
- 5.) {3 dc, 2 dc inc} (30)

Change to the *Couture yarn*.

- 6.) {4 dc, 2 dc inc} (36)
7. - 8.) 36 dc (36)
- 9.) {4 dc, dc 2 tog} (30)

10. - 11.) 30 dc (30)
- 12.) {3 dc, dc 2 tog} (24)
- 13.) 24 dc (24)
- 14.) {2 dc, dc 2 tog} (18)
15. - 30.) 18 dc (18)
- 31.) {1 dc, dc 2 tog} (12)
- 32.) {dc 2 tog} (6)

Add filling to the arms.

Sew the arms to the body.

## LEGS (2 X)

Start with the *Soft yarn* held double.

- 1.) Chain 8, 2 dc in 2nd ch from hook, 5 dc, 5 dc in the final ch, 5 dc in ch on the opposite side, 2 dc in the final ch (19)
- 2.) 2 dc inc, 7 dc, 3 x 2 dc inc, 7 dc, 2 dc inc (24)
- 3.) 2 x 2 dc inc, 8 dc, 5 x 2 dc inc, 8 dc, 2 dc inc (32)
- 4.) 3 x 2 dc inc, 11 dc, 5 x 2 dc inc, 12 dc, 2 dc inc (41)

Change to the *Couture yarn*.

5. - 6.) 41 dc (41)
- 7.) 1 dc in the back loop of each dc (41)
- 8.) 18 dc, 4 x dc 2 tog, 15 dc (37)
- 9.) 2 x dc 2 tog, 13 dc, 3 x dc 2 tog, 14 dc (32)
- 10.) 14 dc, dc 2 tog, 1 dc, dc 2 tog, 13 dc (30)
- 11.) dc 2 tog, 10 dc, 3 x dc 2 tog, 10 dc, dc 2 tog (25)
- 12.) 9 dc, dc 2 tog, 3 dc, dc 2 tog, 9 dc (23)
13. - 17.) 23 dc (23)
- 18.) 6 dc, dc 2 tog, 4 dc, dc 2 tog, 5 dc, dc 2 tog, 2 dc (20)
19. - 23.) 20 dc (20)

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- 24.) 7 dc, dc 2 tog, 7 dc,  
dc 2 tog, 2 dc
25. - 27.) 18 dc
- 28.) 3 dc, dc 2 tog,  
8 dc, dc 2 tog, 3 dc
- 29.) 5 x {1 dc, dc 2 tog},  
finish with 1 dc
- 30.) 5 x dc 2 tog, 1 dc
- Add filling to the legs.  
Sew the legs to the body.*

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## HOODED BABY BLANKET

*The work is knitted in garter stitch, back and forth*

### BLANKET

Cast on 145 sts with 3,5 mm N. Knit until the work makes a square, approx. 70 cm x 70 cm.  
*Bind off.*

### HOOD

Cast on 3 sts, M1 at the start and end of every other row until 71 sts are on the N.  
Knit 8 rows after final increase.  
*Bind off.*

### ASSEMBLY

*Sew the hood onto a corner of the blanket.  
Using a 3 mm crochet hook, crochet a picot edging around the edge of the whole blanket.  
Sew in all ends.*

### THE BLANKET'S FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Approx. 70 cm x 70 cm.



## Good to know

Go handmade's collection is developed and handcrafted by the expert hands of passionate crocheters. All are crocheted to meet what we find is a medium tightness and what suits the animal.

### Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.
