



Gertrud Sweater

Materials

32" Circular needle US 10 ½ & US 11 (7mm & 8mm)

DPN US 10 ½ & US 11 (7 mm & 8 mm)

12 (13) 14 skeins of 50 g Snowstorm color 02

Scrap yarn to hold live stitches

Stitch Markers

Sizes

S (M) L

Finished Measurements

Width 18 (19 ½) 21 ¼ in.

Length 22 ½ (22 ¾) 23 ¼ in.

Gauge

12 sts x 16 rows = 4" x 4"

Abbreviations

st: stitch

p: purl

k: knit

tbl: through the back loop

tog: knit (or purl) 2 sts together

rnd: round

Pattern information

The sweater is knit from the bottom up. Arms are worked separately and then joined to the body before working the raglan style yoke. The turtleneck is worked in rib stitch.

Body

Back and front pieces

CO 110 (120) 130 sts on the smaller circular needle and knit in rib pattern: k1, p1.

Knit 4 inches of rib pattern.

Change to the larger circular needle and continue in stockinette (k all sts) until the piece measures 15 $\frac{3}{4}$ in.

Place a marker on either side of the work to indicate the side seams.

Knit to 3 sts before the marker, bind off 6 sts, knit to 3 sts before the next marker, bind off 6 sts, knit to the end of the rnd = 49 (54) 59 sts on the front and back pieces.

Set aside and work the arm pieces.

Arms

CO 28 (30) 32 sts on the smaller DPNs and knit in rib pattern: k1, p1.

Knit 4 inches of rib pattern.

Change to the larger DPNs and continue in stockinette (k all sts).

Place a marker at the beginning of the round to indicate the seam.

Knit 5 rnds evenly.

Begin Increases: Knit to 1 st before marker, YO, k2, YO, knit to the end of the rnd. On the next rnd knit the YOs tbl to twist.

Work an increase rnd ever 6 rnds until there are 44 (46) 48 sts.

Knit evenly until the piece measures approx. 19 in.

Knit to 3 sts before the marker, bind off 6 sts = 38 (40) 42 sts.

Place live sts on a piece of scrap yarn. Knit a second sleeve to match.

Raglan Yoke

Assemble the piece on the larger circular needle: arm, front, arm, back. K2tog between each piece = 4 sts decreased = 170 (184) 198 sts.

Place a marker at each k2tog = raglan seams.

Begin raglan decreases: Decrease 1 st on either side of the seams on every other rnd:

knit to 2 sts before the next marker, k2tog, k1, ssk repeat *-* to the end of the rnd = 8 sts decreased.

Continue until there are 58 (64) 70 sts remaining.

Turtle neck

Continue in rib pattern k1, p1, until the neck measures approx. 7 $\frac{3}{4}$ in.

Bind off loosely in rib pattern.

Sew the underarm holes closed.
