



C2C "Hygge" Cushion - Cotton

No. 1001-191-7548

Materials:

Rainbow Cotton 8/4 – Double thread Recommended crochet hook size: E/4 (3,5 mm) Cushion 12 x 19.7 inches (30 x 50 cm)

Buy yarn and supplies here: http://shop.hobbii.com/c2c-hygge-cushion-cotton

Crochet gauge: approx. 8 squares x 8 squares = 4 x 4 inches (10 x 10 cm)

Usage: (approx.) **Color A:** 13.23 oz. (375g) (8 skeins) **Color B:** 1.94 oz. (55g) (2 skeins)

- **Abbreviations:**
- s: stitch
- ch: chain stitches
- ss: slip stitches
- **sc:** single crochet
- hdc: half double crochet



Information about the pattern:

"C2C" – Corner to corner are worked in chain stitches, hdc and slip stitches.

As the title of the pattern indicates, the pattern is worked from one corner to the other.

"C2C" consists of small "squares". For each row you crochet, a new square will be added.

The same counts when you decrease: you'll get 1 "square" less for each row you crochet.

NOTE: this pattern is worked in a double thread.

Back piece:


The back piece of the cover is worked in one color without any text in color A.

Increases:

1. Ch 5. In the 3rd ch s from the hook work 1 hdc. Work 1 hdc in the last 2 ch s. Now, you have made 1 "square".










2. Turn your work and ch 5. In the 3rd ch s from the hook work 1 hdc. Work 1 hdc in the next 2 ch s.

Work 1 ss in the left corner of the first "square" in the first row. Now, you have 1 "square".




Ch 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc in the same "hole" in which you just made your ss and 2 ch stitches. Now, you have made one more "square". And now you have 2 "squares" in your row.





3. Turn your work by chaining 5. In the 3rd ch stitch from the hook, work 1 hdc. Work 1 hdc in the next 2 ch stitches.


Work 1 ss in the left corner of the 1. "square" in the previous row. Now, you have 1 "square".







Ch 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc in the same "hole" in which you just worked your ss and the 2 ch stitches. Work 1 ss in the left corner of the 2nd "square" in the previous row. Now, you have made one more "square". And now you have 2 "squares" in your row.



Ch 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc in the same "hole" in which you just worked your ss and the 2 ch stitches. Now, you have made one more "square". And now you have 3 "squares" in your row.






4. – 24. Repeat the rows until you have 24 "squares".



Your cushion shouldn't be any higher, so from now on you start decreasing on this side. Insert a stitch marker or another reminder. A decrease is made by NOT turning with 5 ch stitches. Instead you work ss up along the side. Please see the how-to-guide below:



25. Turn your work. Work ss up along the side of the first "square". Ch 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc. Work 1 ss in the top right corner of the "square" next to it. Work the rest of the row as you normally would.









26. This side still need to grow.

Turn your work by chaining 5. In the 3rd ch stitch from the hook, work 1 hdc. Work 1 hdc in the next 2 chain stitches. Work 1 ss in the left corner of the 1st "square" in the previous row. Work the rest of the row as you normally would.



27. This side should not be any larger, so here you turn and work ss along the side of the first "square". Chain 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc. Work 1 ss in the top corner on the "square" next to it. Work the rest of the row as you normally would.





28. – 39. Repeat the rows and let the long side grow until you have 39 squares.



40. Now, the long side shouldn't be any longer, and from now on you begin making decreases on both sides. Turn your work and make ss along the first "square". Chain 2 (replaces 1 hdc). Work 3 hdc. Work 1 ss in the top corner on the "square"next to it. Work the rest of the row as you normally would.





41. – 62. Now repeat the rows of decreasing until you have 1 "square" left. Turn your work and crochet ss up along the last square till you reach the corner. Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.








Front:

Front piece is crocheted with the text in color B and background color A.



Here you see a picture of the text. Each square equals 1 C2C-square. The pattern begins in the lower left corner.

Work increases and decreases as you did on the back piece of the pillow.



Pattern explanation:

A = background color. B = text color.

The number shows how many C2C squares you should crochet of each color.


E.g.: 2A, 1B, 2A mean work 2 squares in the background colors, and 1 square in the text color and 2 squares in the background color.

Color change is made like this:

The color change is made by working the ss in the new color. So instead of working the ss as normally, you insert the hook in the square and pick up the new color. Then you ch 2 and now you just continue with the new color.







Hvis du vil undgå for mange ender der skal hæftes, kan du med fordel have gang i flere nøgler garn, eller dele dine nøgler op i små nøgler.

If you want to avoid weaving in too many ends, then you can work with more than one skein of yarn or split your skein into smaller skeins.

Assembly:

Join the two pieces together by crocheting them together with color A.



1. Place the two pieces against each other: wrong side against wrong side.



 Start the assembly 0.8 inches (2 cm) from the edge at the top right corner. Insert the yarn and pull it through both pieces between 2 "squares".







4. Work 1 sc between the next 2 "squares".





6. Hækl 1 fm i hjørnet. Work 1 sc in the corner.







8. Work 1 sc between the next 2 "squares".







- 9. Repeat this around the cushion.
- 10. Insert the cushion itself (the filling) before closing the cushion cover completely.



11. Continue around until you're back where you started. Fasten of with 1 ss.



12. Cut the yarn and weave in the ends.
