1665 – Women's sweater in fisherman's rib in eggplant Mayflower Easy Care Classic.

Size:	S	(M)	L	(XL)	XXL	(XXXL)
Chest measurement in cm:	100	(104)	108	(112)	116	(120)
Length in cm:	70	(72)	74	(76)	78	(80)
Color 292, Eggplant, balls:	15	(16)	17	(18)	19	(20)
Needles:	US 6/UK 8					
Circular needles (40 cm):	US 6/UK 8 for neckband					
Quality:	Mayflower Easy Care Classic. 100 % Pure New Wool, 106 m pr. 50 gram.					
Gauge:	17 sts x 40 r (= 20 knit sts in height) in fisherman's rib on needles US 6/UK 8 = 10 x 10 cm.					

To get the best result, we recommend using Knit Pro needles, which is the professional tool for knitting and crocheting.

Edge stitches (edge sts): In the beginning of all rows the first sts is slipped knit wise and in the end of all rows the last sts is knitted.

Fisherman's rib, knitted back and forth.

- 1. r:** 1 edge sts, * purl 1, knit 1, repeat from * and end with purl 1 and 1 edge sts.
 - 2. r:** 1 edge sts, * knit 1, slip 1 purl wise with yarn over, repeat from * and end with knit 1, 1 edge sts.
 - 3. r:** 1 edge sts, * slip 1 purl wise with yarn over, knit the slipped sts and the yarn over together, repeat from * and end with slip 1 purl wise with yarn over and 1 edge sts.
 - 4. r:** 1 edge sts, * knit the slipped sts and the yarn over together, slip 1 purl wise with yarn over, repeat from * and end with knitting the slipped sts and the yarn over together and 1 edge sts.
- Knit 1. – 4. r 1 time. Then repeat 3. and 4. r.

Fisherman's rib, knitted on circular needles for the neckband.

- 1. round:** The division of the sts is adjusted for the fisherman's rib at the neckband, since you knit alternately 1 knit sts and 1 slipped purl wise with yarn over as the sts show.
- 2. round:** * knit the slipped sts and the yarn over together, slip the knit sts purl wise with yarn over, repeat from *
- 3. round:** * slip the purl sts purl wise with yarn over, knit the slipped knit sts and the yarn over together, repeat from *.

Back.

Cast on 85(89)91(95)99(101) sts on needles US 6/UK 8 and knit fisherman's rib as described above. When you have knitted 40 r (= count 20 knit sts in height), put a marker for the splits in both sides. Continue straight up, until the work measures 50(51)52(53)54(55) cm and put another pair of markers in the sides for arm holes. Knit straight up until the arm holes measure 20(21)22(23)24(25) cm. Put the middle 29(31)31(33)35(35) sts on a stitch holder for the neckline and finish each side apart. Towards the neck side, on every other row fasten off another 1 x 2 sts and 1 x 1 sts. Put the remaining 25(26)27(28) 29(30) sts on a stitch holder for the shoulder. Knit the other side mirrored.

Front.

Knit like the back, but with a deeper neckline: when the arm hole measures 17(18)19 (20)21(22) cm, put the middle 15(17)17(19)

21(21) sts on a stitch holder for the neckline and finish each side apart. Towards the neckline, on every other row fasten off another 1 x 4 sts, 1 x 3 sts, 1 x 2 sts and 1 x 1 sts. When the shoulder has the same height as on the back, put the shoulder sts knit wise against the corresponding shoulder on the back. Knit the sts together knit wise and fasten them off at the same time. Knit the other side mirrored.

¾-sleeves.

Cast on 67(69)73(77)79(81) sts on needles US 6/UK 8 and knit fisherman's rib as described

above. Knit straight up until the sleeve measures 40(40)41(41)42(42) cm and fasten off all sts loosely. Knit a matching sleeve.

Neckband.

On circular needles US 6/UK 8, knit in knit sts from the left shoulder 15 m up + the waiting 15(17)17(19)21(21) sts + 15 sts up along the neckline of the front piece and 5 sts up + the waiting 29(31)31(33)35(35) sts + 5 sts up along the neckline of the back = in total 84(88)88(92)96(96) sts. Knit around in fisherman's rib as described above. When the edge measures 12 cm, fasten off all sts loosely. Fold the neckband halfway to the wrong side and sew it on along the neckline with elastic stitches.

Seaming.

Sew the sleeves in between the arm hole markings. Sew the side hems (remember to let the bottom 10 cm be open for the splits) and sew the sleeve hems.
