



Akeleje – Children's Jacket

No. 2004-194-8550

Materials

2 (3, 4) balls of Highland Wool col. 14

Single pointed needle 4 mm (US 6)
Circular needle 4 mm (US 6), 80 cm

5 buttons

Yarn

Highland Wool, Hobbii
100% Wool/ 50 g = 175 meters

Gauge

21 stitches x 27 rows = 10 x 10 cm

Size

1 (2, 4) years

Measurements

Width: 30 (33, 36) cm
Length: 30 (32, 35) cm

Pattern Information

The body is worked bottom up in one piece. Then you work the sleeves and they are subsequently worked together with the yoke in one piece with raglan decreases. The neck edge and front bands are worked at the end.

Body; back and both front pieces

Rib with buttonhole

CO 133 (145, 157) stitches with the circular needle and work back and forth.

Row 1, WS: purl 1, *knit 1, purl 1*, repeat from * - * on entire row.

Row 2, RS: knit 1, *purl 1, knit 1*, repeat from * - * on entire row.

Row 3, WS: purl 1, *knit 1, purl 1*, repeat from * - * on entire row.

Row 4, RS with buttonhole: work until there are 5 stitches left, BO 1 stitch, finish the row.

Row 5, WS: Continue working in rib and CO 1 new stitch above buttonhole.

Body

NB! You first need to slip the stitches for the front bands on to a stitch holder or separate thread. You work the rest of the body in between the bands in stockinette stitch.

RS: Slip the first 7 stitches on to a small stitch holder, work knit stitches until 7 stitches remain and slip these 7 stitches on to another little stitch holder. These stitches will be the front bands.

WS: Purl 119 (131, 143) stitches.

Continue like this until piece measures 16 (19, 22) cm. Finish with a RS row.

Insert a marker in each side = 30 (33, 36) stitches on each front piece and 59 (65, 71) stitches on the back piece.

Armhole

WS: BO 8 stitches above the markers in each side = 26 (29, 32) stitches on each front piece and 51 (57, 63) stitches on back piece. Put piece aside and work both sleeves.

Sleeves

Rib

CO 39 (41, 43) stitches with the single pointed needles and work back and forth.

Work 5 rows in rib, as on body.

Sleeve

Continue in stockinette stitch.

Begin increasing:

RS: Knit 1, pick up yarn between stitches and knit BTF (1 stitch increased), work in knit stitches until 1 stitch remains, increase 1 stitch, knit 1 = 2 stitches increased.

Increase like this in every 8th row until you have a total of 47 (51, 55) stitches.

Continue until piece measures 20 (24, 30) cm and finish with a RS row.

Armhole

WS: BO 4 stitches and work in knit stitches until you have 4 stitches left. BO these last 4 stitches = 39 (43, 47) stitches. Put piece aside and work one more sleeve in the same way.

NB! Now you work the sleeves together with the body.

Yoke

RS: Work the front piece, continue with the stitches of the first sleeve, work the back piece and hereafter the stitches of the second sleeve. Finish with the second front piece = 181 (201, 221) stitches on the row.

WS: Purl all stitches.

Insert a marker in each transition = 4 markers.

Begin decreasing for the raglan

*Work until 3 stitches before marker, knit 2 together, knit 2, knit 2 together TBL *, repeat from * - * a total of 4 times and work the rest of the row = 8 stitches decreased.

Continue decreasing in this way in every 2nd row until you have 18 (20, 22) stitches on each front piece. Finish with a WS row.

NB Now you BO the stitches on the front pieces to form the neckline and at the same time you continue with the raglan decreases as before.

Neckline

RS: BO 5 stitches, work the rest of the row.

WS: BO 5 stitches, work the rest of the row.

RS: BO 4 stitches, work the rest of the row.

WS: BO 4 stitches, work the rest of the row.

RS: BO 2 stitches, work the rest of the row.

WS: BO 2 stitches, work the rest of the row.

Hereafter you BO 1 stitch in each side until there's 1 stitch left on each front piece.

Let the stitches rest.

Front bands

Band without buttonholes

Place the 7 stitches back on the needle and work rib until band has same height as jumper and you stretch piece slightly when measuring. Slip the stitches back on to the stitch holder. Sew the band on to jacket. Sew 4 buttons on to the band, evenly distributed. The last button will be on the neck edge.

Band with buttonholes

Place the 7 stitches back on to the needle. Mark the height of the buttonholes, ensuring they are at the same height as the buttons. Don't forget to stretch piece slightly when measuring.

Work until marker. Work the first 2 stitches, BO 1 stitch and work the rest of the row. CO 1 new stitch in next row above BO stitch, repeat from * - * until you have made all 4 buttonholes. Continue working the band until it has the same height as the other front band. Slip the stitches back on to the stitch holder and sew the band on to the jacket.

Neckline

RS: Place the 7 band-stitches back on to the needle and pick up stitches along the neckline, work stitches for the sleeve, back and sleeve, pick up stitches along neckline and work the last 7 band-stitches = approx. 99 (105, 111) stitches.

Work 5 rows in rib and don't forget to make the last buttonhole.

BO loosely or with the elastic bind-off technique.

Sew the last button on the jacket.

Finish

Sew sleeve seam in outer loop or edge stitches. Sew the holes under the sleeves.
