

## Laura Sweater

No. 2003-194-5396

## Materials

$6(7,8)$ balls of 25 g Kid Silk col. 28
$2(2,2)$ balls of 50 g Highland Wool col. 14
Circular needle size $7 \mathrm{~mm}(\mathrm{US} 10,75)$ and 9 mm (US13), 80 cm .
Stitch markers.

## Yarn

Kid Silk, Hobbii
$70 \%$ Kid Mohair, $30 \%$ Silk/ $25 \mathrm{~g}=195 \mathrm{~m}$
Highland Wool, Hobbii
$100 \%$ wool $/ 50 \mathrm{~g}=175 \mathrm{~m}$

## Gauge

12 stitches and 16 rounds/rows on needle size 9 mm and 3 strands Kid Silk $=10 \mathrm{~cm}$.

Size
S/M (M/L, L/XL)

## Measurements

Width: $55(60,65) \mathrm{cm}$
Length: $51(52,53) \mathrm{cm}$, measured at armhole.

## Pattern Information

The sweater is worked in 3 strands Kid mohair and the edges are worked in 2 strands Highland Wool.
The sweater is worked bottom up until armholes on a circular needle. Then piece is separated into back- and front piece and each piece is finished separately. Pick up stitches from armhole and work sleeves top down.

## Pattern

## Rib

CO $120(132,144)$ stitches with 2 strands of Highland Wool on circular needle size 7 mm (US10,75). Work 5 cm rib: knit 1, purl 1.

## Body

Change to circular needle size 9 mm (US13) and 3 strands Kid Silk and increase in first round as follows:

Work *10 $(11,12)$ stitches knitwise, make 1 new stitch by picking up thread between stitches and work it knitwise TBL*, repeat from * to * on entire round = 12 stitches increased = 132 $(144,156)$ stitches.

Continue working in the round in stockinette stitch until piece measures 32 cm . Insert a marker in each side = side markers $=66(72,78)$ stitches for the back- and front piece.

Here you separate the piece by making the armholes. Slip stitches from front piece on to a stitch holder or separate circular needle and work the back piece.

## Back piece

Work back and forth in stockinette stitch until armhole measures 19 (20) 21 cm . Finish with a WS row.

## Right shoulder (when sweater is worn)

## Form shoulder and neck by working short rows:

RS: work $27(30,33)$ stitches knitwise, turn.
WS: slip 1 stitch, work until 7 stitches remain at shoulder, turn.
RS: slip 1 stitch, work until 3 stitches remain at neck, turn.
WS: slip 1 stitch, work until 15 stitches remain at shoulder, turn.
RS: slip 1 stitch, work until 6 stitches remain at neck, turn.
WS: slip 1 stitch, work entire row and work the slipped stitches as 1 stitch, turn.
RS: Bind off these $27(30,33)$ stitches, the slipped stitches are worked as 1 stitch.
Insert a marker after $21(24,27)$ stitches on each side to mark the shoulder, the 6 stitches are for the neck.

## Neck

RS: Bind off 12 stitches and work the rest of the row.

## Left shoulder

## Form shoulder and neck by working short rows:

WS: work until 3 stitches remain at neck, turn.
RS: slip 1 stitch, work until 7 stitches remain at shoulder, turn.
WS: slip 1 stitch, work until 6 stitches remain at neck, turn.
RS: slip 1 stitch, work until 15 stitches remain at shoulder, turn.
WS: slip 1 stitch, work entire row and work the slipped stitches as 1 stitch, turn.
RS: bind off, work the slipped stitches as 1 stitch.
Insert a marker after $21(24,27)$ stitches on each side for the shoulder, the 6 stitches are for the neck.
Please note! There is a total of 24 stitches for the neck.

## Front piece

Work back and forth in stockinette stitch until armhole measures 9 cm . Finish with a WS row.

## Neckline

Work $25(28,31)$ stitches knitwise, bind off 16 stitches for the neck and work the rest of row. Right and left front piece are finished separately.

## Right front piece

Row 1, WS: purl all stitches.
Row 2, RS: knit 2 stitches together TBL, and work the rest of row.
Repeat these 2 rows until you have made 4 decreases $=21(24,27)$ stitches remain on shoulder.

Continue in stockinette stitch until piece measures $19(20,21) \mathrm{cm}$.
Finish with a WS row. Bind off all stitches.

## Left front piece

Begin on the neck side of piece and add yarn.
Row 1, WS: purl all stitches.
Row 2, RS: work until 2 stitches remain, knit 2 stitches together.
Repeat these 2 rows until you have made 4 decreases $=21(24,27)$ stitches remain on shoulder.
Continue in stockinette stitch until piece measures $19(20,21) \mathrm{cm}$.

Finish with a WS row. Bind off all stitches.

Sew shoulder seams together with Kitchener stitches.

Sleeves (worked top down)
Pick up $46(48,50)$ stitches with circular needle size $7 \mathrm{~mm}(U S 10,75)$ and 3 strands Kid Silk.
Begin in the middle of armhole and insert a marker to mark beginning of round.
Change to circular needle size 9 mm (US13) and work 5 rounds in stockinette stitch, using the Magic Loop-technique.

## Begin decreasing

With 2 stitches in between, knit 2 stitches together on each side of marker.
Decrease in every $6^{\text {th }}$ round until you have $32(34,36)$ stitches.
Continue in stockinette stitch until piece measures 30 cm .
In next round decrease 6 stitches evenly $=26(28,30)$ stitches.

## Sleeve edge

Change to circular needle size 7 mm (US10,75) and work 8 cm rib: knit 1 , purl 1.
Bind off loosely in rib (elastic bind-off).
Work the other sleeve the same way.

## Neck edge

Pick up $62(66,70)$ stitches around entire neckline with circular needle size 7 mm (US10,75) and 2 strands Highland Wool.

Work 4 cm rib: knit 1, purl 1.
Bind off loosely in rib (elastic bind-off).
