



# Rubin - Hat with hearts

## Materials

1 ball Woolpower col. 05, off-white  
1 ball Woolpower col. 16, red

Circular needle 80 cm/ 4,5 (6) mm  
Stitch markers

## Yarn

**Woolpower**, Happy Sheep  
100 % wool / 100 g = 160 meters

## Gauge

, in stockinette stitch

18 stitches = 10 cm on needle 4,5 mm  
16 stitches = 10 cm on needle 6 mm

## Size

S/M (M/L)

## Measurements of piece

Circumference: 53 (56) cm

## Pattern information

The hat in size S/M and is worked on needle 4,5 mm and size M/L is worked on needle 6 mm.

The hat is worked in the round on a circular needle using the magic loop-technique.

The heart is worked in the Fair Isle-technique.

It's important that the strands are not too tight on the WS, or the hat will be too small.

## Hashtags for social media

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Have fun making this pattern!

CO 84 (88) stitches on circular needle 4,5 (4,5) mm and color off-white.  
Work 3 cm rib in the round. k2, p2.

### Size S/M

Continue in stockinette stitch and increase 4 stitches evenly on the first round = 88 stitches.  
Work 1 round.

### Size M/L

Switch to needle 6 mm. Continue in stockinette stitch and work 2 rounds.

### Both sizes

Place a marker at the beginning of the round.

Work the hearts according to the diagram = 4 hearts.

**NB!** Work the diagram using the Fair Isle-technique.

Twist the yarn strand after every 3<sup>rd</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> stitch, to ensure there won't be any long strands on the WS. Be careful that the strands are not too tight.

After the diagram is completed you work 3 (5) rounds in stockinette stitch.

### Begin decreasing

**1<sup>st</sup> decrease:** Work \*k9, k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 80 stitches.

Work one round.

**2<sup>nd</sup> decrease:** Work \*8 ret, k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 72 stitches.

Work one round.

**3<sup>rd</sup> decrease:** Work \*7 ret, k2tog\*, repeat from \* to \* on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 64 stitches.

Work one round.

Continue like this, with 1 stitch less in between each decrease until you have 8 stitches left.

Cut the yarn and pull it through remaining stitches, tighten together and fasten off.

### Diagram

The pattern in the frame is repeated a total of 4 times.
