



Rubin - Love Mitten

Materials

1 ball Woolpower col. 05, off-white
1 ball Woolpower col. 16, red

Circular needle 80 cm/ 5 mm
Stitch markers

Yarn Quality

Woolpower, Happy Sheep
100 % wool/ 100 g = 160 meters

Gauge, in stockinette stitch
17 stitches = 10 cm on needle 5 mm

Size

One size

Measurements of piece

Circumference: 44 cm
Length: approx. 27 cm

Pattern information

The mitten is worked in the round on a circular needle using the magic loop-technique. First you work 2 cuffs in rib, here after you put the pieces together and you continue working in the round over all stitches.

The hearts are worked in the Fair Isle-technique.

It's important that the strands are not too tight on the WS, or the hat will be too small.

Have fun making this pattern!

Girl cuff

CO 32 stitches on circular needle 5 mm and color off-white.

Work 7 cm rib in the round: k2, p2.

Work 3 rounds in stockinette stitch.

Put piece aside and work the second cuff.

Boy cuff

CO 36 stitches on circular needle 5 mm and color off-white.

Work 8 cm rib in the round: k2, p2.

Work 3 rounds in stockinette stitch.

The mitten

Is worked in stockinette stitch.

Put the 2 pieces together and work 1 round over all stitches = 68 stitches.

In the next round, k2tog at the beginning and in the middle of the round = 2 stitches decreased = 66 stitches.

Place a marker at the beginning of the round.

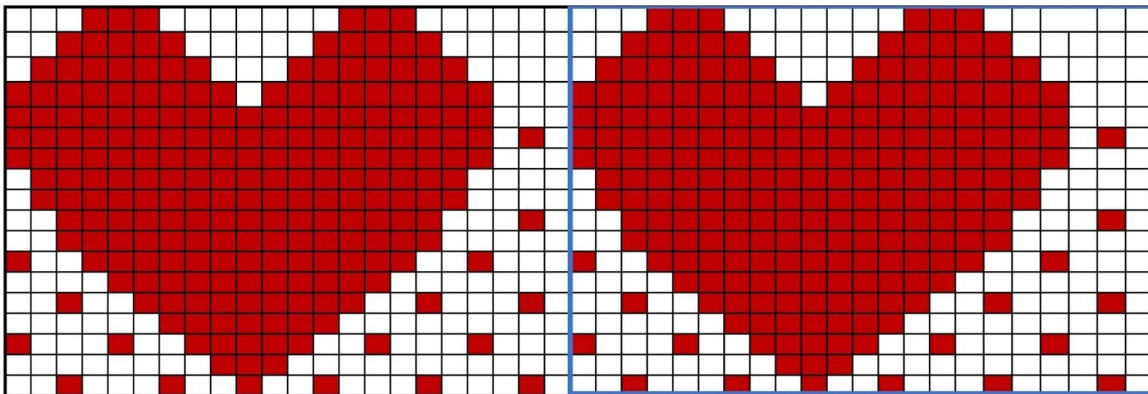
Work the hearts in red according to the diagram = 3 hearts on round.

NB! Work the diagram using the Fair Isle-technique.

Twist the yarn strands after every 3rd-4th stitch, to ensure there won't be any long strands on the WS. Be careful that the strands are not too tight.

Diagram

The pattern in the frame is repeated a total of 3 times.



After the diagram, work 1 round in stockinette stitch and decrease 2 stitches again = 64 stitches.

Begin decreasing

1st decrease: Work *k6, k2tog*, repeat from * to * on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 56 stitches.

Work 1 round.

2nd decrease: Work *k5, k2tog*, repeat from * to * on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 48 stitches.

Work 1 round.

3rd decrease: Work *k4, k2tog*, repeat from * to * on the entire round = 8 stitches decreased = 40 stitches.

Work 1 round.

Continue like this, with 1 stitch less in between each decrease until you have 8 stitches left.

Cut the yarn and pull it through remaining stitches, tighten together and fasten off.
