



KNITTING PATTERN

Currant

Wrist Warmers

MATERIALS

1 skein of Portobello Eucalyptus (98)

Circular needle US size 10 (6 mm)

31.5 inches (80 cm)

Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Portobello**, Hobbii

60% Cotton, 28% Acrylic, 12% Wool

50 g (1.75 oz) = 120 m (131 yds)

GAUGE

½ chart = 11 stitches = 2.4 inches (6 cm)

SIZES

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 7.1 inches (18 cm)

Length: 8.7 inches (22 cm)

ABOUT THE PATTERN

The wrist warmers are knitted in the round on a circular needle using the magic loop technique.

Pattern



Cast on 33 stitches on a circular needle and knit in the round using the magic loop technique. Place a marker at the beginning of the round.

Rib edge

Knit 0.8 inches (2 cm) of rib: knit 1, purl 1.

Left wrist warmer

Continue by following the chart from the 1st stitch = 1 ½ times.

Knit until your work measures approx. 6.3 inches (16 cm), stop after the 7th round in the chart.

On the next round bind off 5 stitches AFTER the first purl stitch.

On the next round, cast on 5 new stitches over the bound off stitches

Right wrist warmer

Continue by following the chart from the 12th stitch = 1 ½ times.

Knit until your work measures approx. 6.3 inches (16 cm), stop after the 7th round in the chart.

On the next round bind off 5 stitches AFTER the first purl stitch.

On the next round, cast on 5 new stitches over the bound off stitches

Left and right wrist warmer

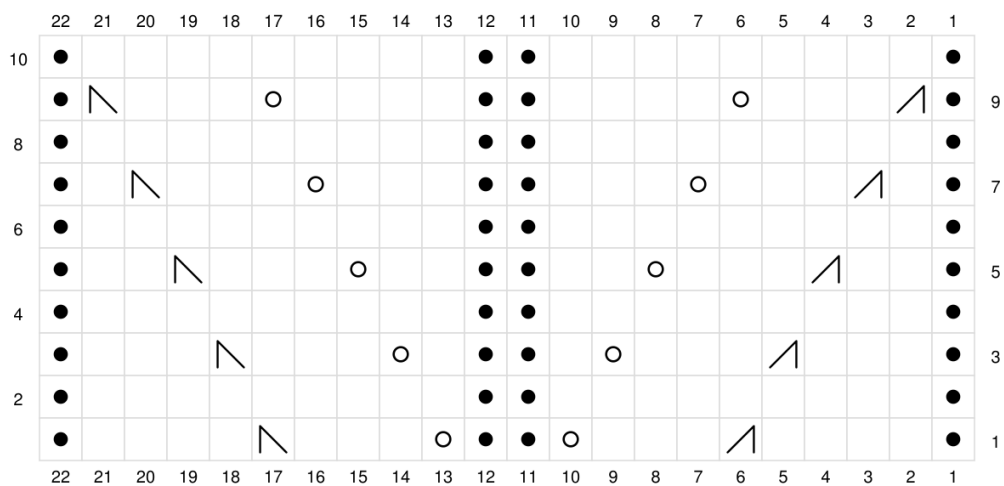
Knit in the round following the chart until your work measures 7.9 inches (20 cm).

Rib edge

Knit 0.8 inches (2 cm) of rib: knit 1, purl 1.

Bind off loosely in rib.

Chart



- Knit
- Purl
- ↗ 2 together knit wise
- ↘ Knit 2 together through the back loops
- Yarn over
