



Anette - Print Moss Stitch Sweater

Materials

5 (6) 7 skeins Woolpower print color 109

Circular needles 40 cm & 80 cm length in 6 mm & 7 mm

Double pointed needles sizes 6 mm & 7 mm

Spare circular needle

Stitch markers

Yarn

Woolpower print, Happy Sheep

100% wool, 100 grams = 160 meters

Gauge

14 stitches & 25 rows = 10 x 10 cm

in moss stitch using 7 mm needle

Sizes

S (M) L

Measurements

Width: 48 (51) 55 cm

Length: 48 (50) 52 cm

Pattern information

The sweater is knit from the bottom up. The body and sleeves are knit separately and connected in the yoke. The shoulders have raglan shaping.

A lovely detail in the stripes is that they vary because of the different stitch counts in the body and the sleeves.

Pattern

Ribbing

Cast on 134 (144) 154 stitches on a 6 mm circular needle and join to knit in the round.

Knit 5 cm of twisted rib: *knit 1 through the back loop, purl 1*.

Body

Change to a 7 mm circular needle.

Knit moss stitch

1st row: *knit 1, purl 1*. Repeat between * - * until the end of the row.

From here on make purl stitches above knit stitches, and knit stitches above purl stitches.

On the first row increase 1 stitch = 135 (145) 155 stitches.

ATT When the total number of stitches is odd, you can knit and purl continuously in the round.

Continue until the body measures 32 (33) 34 cm.

Place a stitch marker at the beginning of the row.

Armhole

Knit until 4 (5) 5 stitches before beginning of row, cast off 8 (9) 10 stitches, knit until there are 60 (64) 68 stitches on the needle after the cast off, then cast off 7 (8) 9 stitches = 60 (64) 68 stitches.

Put the body aside and knit the sleeves.

Sleeves

Ribbing

Cast on 34 (36) 40 stitches on 6 mm DPNs and join to knit in the round.

Knit twisted rib for 5 cm: *knit 1 through the back loop, purl 1*.

Sleeve

Place a stitch marker at the beginning of the row.

Change to 7 mm DPNs.

Knit 1 stitch on each side of the stitch marker = sleeve seam.

Knit moss stitch

1st row: *knit 1, purl 1*. Repeat between * - * until the end of the row.

From here on make purl stitches above knit stitches, and knit stitches above purl stitches.

Knit 4 cm of moss stitch, ending at the stitch marker.

Begin increases

Knit 1, increase 1 (pick up bar between two stitches and knit it through the back loop), knit until 1 stitch before marker, increase 1, knit 1 = 2 stitches increased.

Increase in pattern every 8 rows until there are 52 (54) 56 stitches.

Knit until the sleeve measures 47 (47) 47 cm.

Knit until 4 (5) 5 stitches before the marker, cast off 8 (9) 10 stitches = 44 (45) 46 stitches.

Set sleeve aside and knit the second one to match.

Yoke

Knit over the sleeves of the blouse: Back, sleeve, front, sleeve = 208 (218) 228 stitches total.

Place a stitch marker at every join (4 raglan seams)

Knit 1 stitch on every side of the marker.

Please read all of the following first

On the back and in the front you will decrease every 2nd row.

On the sleeves you will decrease every 2nd or every 4th row.

Decrease in pattern on each side of the two knit stitches in every raglan seam = 8 or 4 stitches decreased in a row.

Raglan shaping

Knit 1 row of moss stitch and 4 raglan seams.

Decrease row: knit 1, knit 2 together, *knit moss stitch until 3 stitches before marker, knit 2 together, knit 2, knit 2 together*, repeat between * - * two more times, knit moss stitch until 3 stitches before next marker, knit 2 together, knit 1 = 8 stitches decreased.

Decrease like so for a total of 7 (7) 5 times.

Proceed to decrease on the front and back every 2 rows, but only every 4 rows on the sleeve until there are 76 (82) 88 stitches.

Neckline

Change to 6 mm DPNs and knit ribbing like so: First row is knit like moss stitch but every knit stitch is knit through the back loop instead.

Knit until ribbing measures 7 cm. Cast off loosely in rib. Fold over the edge and sew it onto the back side.

Finish

Graft underarm seams together.
