



**Amaryllis - Jacket for children**

## Materials

4 (4, 5) skeins Baby Merino XL col. 25

Single pointed needles 3 mm and 4 mm Circular needle 80 cm/ 3 mm and 4 mm

5 buttons, 15 mm Ø

Yarn **Baby Merino XL**, Hobbii
100% merino/ 50 g = 105 meters

Gauge

22 stitches x 29 rows on 10 cm

### Size

1/2-1 (1-2, 2-3) years

Measurements

Width: 27 (30, 32) cm Length: 30 (32, 35) cm

## Pattern information

The body is worked in one piece. The sleeves are worked separately, and all pieces are then worked together on a yoke with raglan decreases.

Neck edge and bands are worked at the end.

# Body, back and both front pieces

## Rib edge with buttonhole

CO 133 (145, 157) stitches on circular needle 3 mm and work back and forth.

1st row, WS: p1, \*k1, p1\*, repeat from \* - \* on entire row.

2<sup>nd</sup> row, RS: k1, \*p1, k1\*, repeat from \* - \* on entire row.

3<sup>rd</sup> row, WS: p1, \*k1, p1\*, repeat from \* - \* on entire row.

**4**<sup>th</sup> **row, RS with buttonhole:** work until you have 5 stitches left, BO 1 stitch, and finish the row.

**5**<sup>th</sup> **row**, **WS**: work the stitches as before and CO 1 new stitch over the buttonhole.

### **Body**

**Please note!** Slip the stitches for both bands on a stitch holder or thread and continue in stockinette stitch over the remaining stitches.

Change to circular needle 4 mm.

**RS:** slip the 7 stitches on a small stitch holder, work in knit stitch until there are 7 stitches left and slip those 7 stitches on a small stitch holder. These stitches are the bands and will be worked later.

WS: purl 119 (131, 143) stitches.

Continue until piece measures 16 (19, 22) cm. Finish with a RS row.

Insert a marker in each side = 30 (33, 36) stitches for each front piece, 59 (65, 71) stitches for the back piece.

#### **Armhole**

**WS:** BO 8 stitches in each side = 26 (29, 32) stitches for each front piece, 51 (57, 63) stitches for the back. Put piece aside and work both sleeves.

### Sleeve

#### Rib edge

CO 39 (41, 43) stitches on single point needle 3 mm and work back and forth.

Work 5 rows in rib, as on the body.

#### Sleeve

Change to needle 4 mm and continue in stockinette stitch.

## Begin increasing:

**RS:** k1, pick up thread between stitches and knit tbl (1 stitch increased), work in knit stitch until there are 1 stitch left, increase 1 stitch, k1 = 2 stitches increased.

Increase in every 8<sup>th</sup> row until you have 47 (51, 55) stitches.

Continue until piece measures 20 (24, 28) cm. Finish with a RS row.

### **Armhole**

**WS:** BO 4 stitches and work until you have 4 stitches left, and BO these stitches = 39 (43, 47) stitches. Put piece aside and work the other sleeve.

**Please note!** Now the sleeves are worked together with the body.



### Yoke

**RS:** work the front piece, work one sleeve, continue working the back piece, work the second sleeve and finish with the other front piece = 181 (201, 221) stitches in total.

WS: purl all stitches.

Insert a marker in each transition = 4 markers.

### Begin decreasing for the raglan

\*work until 3 stitches before marker, k2tog, k2, k2tog tbl \*, repeat from \* - \* a total of 4 times, work the rest of the row = 8 stitches decreased.

Decrease in every 2<sup>nd</sup> row until you have 17 (19, 21) stitches on each front piece. Finish with a WS row.

**Please note!** Now you bind off stitches for the neckline on both front pieces and continue decreasing for the raglan as before.

#### **Neckline**

RS: BO 5 stitches, work the rest of the row.

WS: BO 5 stitches, work the rest of the row.

**RS:** BO 4 stitches, work the rest of the row.

WS: BO 4 stitches, work the rest of the row.

**RS:** BO 2 stitches, work the rest of the row.

**WS:** BO 2 stitches, work the rest of the row.

Now bind off 1 stitch in each side until there's 1 stitch left on each front piece.

Let the stitches rest.

#### **Bands**

### **Band without buttonholes**

Slip the 7 stitches back on needle 3 mm and work rib to until the band is same height as the jacket, pull the band lightly. Slip the stitches back on the stitch holder.

Sew the band on to the jacket. Sew on 4 buttons, evenly distributed, make sure the last button will be on the neck edge.

#### **Band with buttonholes**

Slip the 7 stitches back on needle 3 mm. Mark the buttonholes on the same height as the buttons. Don't forget to pull lightly in piece.

\*Work until marker, k2, BO 1 stitch, work the rest of the row.

On next row, CO 1 new stitch above the BO stitch\*, repeat from \* - \* until the 4 buttonholes have been worked. Work until this band has the same length as the first band.

Slip the stitches back on the stitch holder. Sew the band on to the jacket.

#### Neck edge

**RS:** slip the band 7 stitches on to a needle 3 mm, pick up stitches along the neckline, work the stitches of the sleeve, back, sleeve, pick up stitches along neckline, work the 7 stitches on the band = approx. 99 (105, 111) stitches.

Work 5 in rib stitch and don't forget the last buttonhole.

BO loosely.

Sew the last button on.



## Finish

Sew the sleeve seams together. Sew opening under each sleeve together.
