## YARN USAGE:

CURLY BASSERNE H 30 CM
Curly (Crochet with two threads): $\quad 150 \mathrm{~g}$
Vintage:
A few meters of black yarn for nose and mouth.

## MATERIAL:

Filling
Eyes: 12 mm
Crochet hook (Curly): 5,0-6,0 mm
Crochet hook (Vintage): 3,0-4,0 mm
All stated yarn lengths are for guidance only.

If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sld st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.

It is recommended that the filling continues on an ongoing basis as the work progresses.

## Mounting of the safety eyes:

The eyes are inserted, and the rear stops to the eyes are pushed from the inside.
The rear stops can and should be a little hard to plug in to ensure that they are sticking well.

> Body crochet with Curly (two threads). Ears crochet with Vintage. Head, Arms and Legs crochet with Curly (two threads) and Vintage.

## BODY

Work with Curly Yarn.
1.) cr with 6 dc
2.) *1 dc inc*
3.) * $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ inc*
4.) *2 dc, 1 dc inc*
5.) *3 dc, 1 dc inc*
6.) * $4 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{inc}^{*}$
7.) *5 dc, $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{inc*}$
8.) *6 dc, $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{inc}^{*}$
9.) *7 dc, $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{inc}^{*}$
10.) *8 dc, $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{inc}^{*}$
11. - 15.) 60 dc
16.) * $8 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{dec}^{*}$

## HEAD

Start with Vintage Yarn.
1.) cr with 6 dc
2.) *l dc inc*
3.) * $1 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ inc*
4.) 18 dc
5.) *2 dc, 1 dc inc*
6.) 24 dc
7.) *3 dc, 1 dc inc*
8.) * $4 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ inc*
9.) *11 dc, 1 dc inc*
10.) 39 dc
11.) $15 \mathrm{dc}, 9 \mathrm{dc}$ inc, 15 dc
12.) *7 dc, 1 dc inc*

Turn the head so that the 9 increased sts from round 11 are facing up (as the forehead).
Add the eyes in round 8 with a distance of 9 st.
Change to Curly yarn.
13. - 16.) 54 dc
17.) *7 dc, $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{dec}^{*}$
18.) *6 dc, 1 dc dec*
19.) *5 dc, 1 dc dec*
21.) *4 dc, 1 dc dec*
22.) *3 dc, 1 dc dec*
23.) *2 dc, 1 dc dec*
24.) *1 dc, 1 dc dec*
25.) *1 dc dec*

Add filling to the head.
Cut the yarn and pull through the stitches, tighten and sew the head together.

## Shape the head and the eye hollows:

With vintage yarn, thread a needle with approx. 25 cm yarn. Put the needle in from under the chin and out at the side of the eye.
Guide the thread around some stitches by the eye and then back out under the chin. Tighten the yarn to form the hollow around the eye, tighten the yarn through a few stitches under the chin.
Repeat for the other side of the same eye.
The hollow for the eye is now completed. Should you want the hollow deeper the process can be repeated and a stitch added towards the top of the eye.
Repeat the process for the other eye.

See illustration.
Embroider nose/mouth as an upside down " $Y$ ". Sew the head onto the body.


## EAR (2 X)

Work with Vintage Yarn.

7.     - 13.) 21 dc

Press the ear together a bit at the opening and attach to the head.

## ARM (2 X)

Start with Vintage Yarn.
1.) Crochet 9 ch st , then start at the 2. chain from the hook.

1 dc inc in $1 . \mathrm{ch}, 6 \mathrm{dc}$, 3 dc in the next ch.
Now crochet 7 dc on the opposite side.
2. -9.) 18 dc
10.) $2 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc}$ dec, $7 \mathrm{dc}, 1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{dec}, 5 \mathrm{dc}(16)$

## UK

Change to the Curly yarn.
11. - 26.) 16 dc
27.) * $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{dec}^{*}$
28.) * $1 \mathrm{dc} \mathrm{dec}^{*}$

Stuff the arms with filling.
Sew the arms onto the body.
Sew through the paws 2-3 times with approx. 25 cm Vintage yarn. Add tension to give the desired shape and fasten the ends.

## LEC (2 X)

Start with the Vintage yarn.
1.) Crochet 11 ch st, then start at the 2. chain from the hook.

1 dc inc in $1 . \mathrm{ch}, 8 \mathrm{dc}$, 3 dc in the next ch. Now crochet 9 dc on the opposite side

Stuff the legs with filling.
Attach the legs onto the bottom of the body.
Sew through the paws $2-3$ times with approx. 25 cm
Vintage yarn. Add tension to give the desired shape and fasten the ends.


## Good to know

## Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size $2,0 \mathrm{~mm}$ and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size $4,0 \mathrm{~mm}$. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.
