



Holly - Headband

Materials

Diablo Multi col. 12 Crochet hook size 7 mm

Usage: ca. 30 (35) 40g

Size: 50 (54) 58cm

Width: Ca. 12cm

Gauge:

Approx. 11 sts x 13 rows = 10 x 10 cm – Measured flat and piece may have a 6-10 cm positive ease

Abbreviations:

Ch: chain stitchSt(s): Stitch(es)Sc: Single crochetTbl: Through back loop



<u>Pattern</u> – You can find a picture guide below, under the written pattern.

Please note: From row 2 you work tbl. Work the last st through both loops to make the edge smoother.

- **1.** Ch50 (53) 56. Work 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook. Work sc on entire row. = 49(52)55 sts.
- **2.** Turn with ch1. Work sc tbl on entire row. = 49(52)55 sts.


Repeat the procedure from row 2 until you have worked a total of 16 rows. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.

Guide:

This guide is made with fewer stitches, but the procedure is the same.

Row 1







2. Work 1 sc in 2nd ch from hook.







4. Work sc on entire row. = 49(52)55 m.

3. Like this.





1. Turn with ch1.



2. Work 1 sc tbl. The needle shows in which loop you work your sc.



3. Like this.



1. Work sc tbl on entire row = 49(52)55 sts.



Row 3 and forward



1. Row 3 is worked as row 2. Turn with ch1.




2. Work 1 sc tbl. The needle shows in which loop you work your sc.





3. Like this.



2. Repeat the procedure from row 2 until you have worked a total of 16 rows. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.





Guide – Assembly:



1. Lay piece as shown on photo.



2. Now you have to fold the pieces to make a "knot".



3. Lay the right part over the left part, so it covers half of the left part.



4. Fold the other (and uncovered) half of the left part over the right part.



5. Fold the other (and uncovered) half of the right part over the left part.



6. The end pieces are now folded on top of each other as shown on this photo.





7. Sew the end together through all 4 layers.



8. Like this. Cut the yarn and weave in ends.



Turn the seam around to WS. There is now a pretty little "knot" in the front of the headband, and the headband is finished ^(C)
