



Celle - Sweater

Materials

5 (7) 8 (9) balls of Woolpower Big, color 07 (color **A**)

1 (2) 2 (2) balls of Woolpower Big, color 02 (color **B**)

Circular needles approx. US 10½ (7 mm) and US 11 (8 mm), 31.5" (80 cm)

Circular needles approx. US 10½ (7 mm) and US 11 (8 mm), 15.7" (40 cm)

or

Double pointed needles approx. US 10½ (7 mm) and US 11 (8 mm) for the sleeves

Yarn properties

 **Woolpower Big**, Happy Sheep

100 % wool / 1.7 oz (100 g) = 82 yds (75 m)

Gauge

11 sts x 15 rows = 4" (10 cm)

with needle US 11 (8 mm) in st st

About the pattern

Because this pattern features multi-color knitting on the yoke, it requires a certain level of knitting experience. However, this pattern works well as a beginner's project, if you are an experienced knitter, but haven't tried multi-color knitting yet. The sweater is knit bottom up in the round. The sleeves are knit on double pointed needles (at least 7.9" (20 cm) in length) or with the Magic Loop technique on a circular needle.

If you are not familiar with the principal of color dominance in multi-color knitting, it is advisable to search for information about this online, before you start knitting. Color dominance has an impact on how clear the pattern is.

Happy knitting!

The sweater is knit bottom up in the round.

Front and back (in the round)

Co 100 (110) 120 (130) sts with color A on circular needle 31.5" (80 mm) approx. US 10½ (7 mm). Place a st marker bet the first and last st of the rnd. Knit ribbing (k1, p1) in the round until the work measures approx. 1.2".

Change to circular needle US 11 (8 mm) and continue in st st.

Knit st st in the round until the work measures 13.8" (14.6") 15.4" (16.5"). Bo 8 sts for each armhole like this: Bo 4 sts, k 42 (47) 52 (57) sts, bo 8 sts, k 42 (47) 52 (57) sts, bo 4 sts. 84 (94) 104 (114) sts now remain on the rnd.

Put down the work and continue with the sleeves.

Sleeves

Co 26 (28) 30 (32) sts on circular needle 15.7"/double pointed needles (approx. US 10½ (7 mm)). Place a st marker bet the first and last st of the rnd. Knit ribbing (k1, p1) until the work measures approx. 1.2".

Change to circular needle/double pointed needles US 11 (8 mm) and continue in st st. Inc on each side of the st marker every 3.1" (2.8") 2.8" (2.8"). Continue inc until you have done so 4 (4) 5 (5) times (= 34 (36) 40 (42) sts). Continue until the sleeve measures 16.9" (16.9") 17.3" (17.3"). Bo 8 sts under the sleeve (i.e. 4 sts are bo on each side of the st marker) (= 26 (28) 32 (34) sts).

Put down the sleeve and knit another sleeve following the same procedure.

Yoke

Place all sts of the body and of both sleeves on the circular needle. You now have 136 (150) 168 (182) sts on the rnd. On the next rnd, adjust the number of sts by +4 (0) +2 (-2) so that you now have 140 (150) 170 (180) sts on the rnd. Follow the pattern in the chart with colors A and B. Repeat the pattern 14 (15) 17 (18) times per rnd and dec as shown in the chart (be aware that the chart begins in the bottom right corner!) Once you have completed the pattern, 70 (75) 85 (90) sts remain on the rnd. On the next rnd, k throughout the rnd. Evenly distributed on the next rnd, reduce the number of sts by 12 (15) 23 (26) sts. Now 58 (60) 62 (64) sts remain on the rnd.

Neckline

Change to circular needle approx. US 10½ (7 mm), knit ribbing (k1, p1) for approx. 1.2" and bo loosely in ribbing.

Weave in the ends and stitch together the holes under the sleeves.
