YARN USAGE

3 months: 350 g

6 months: 400 g



Knitted in Go handmades Teddy - a luxurious yarn in the nicest colours. Soft like a dream: 100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.



Duffle buttons
Knitting needle: 3,5 mm
Gauge: 17 sts/10 cm

YARN USAGE

3 months: 350 g
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MATERIALS

Duffle Buttons
Knitting needle: 3,5 mm

Gauge: 17 sts = 10 cm

Specified yarn quantities are indicative.

The use of a marker or counter is recommended due to the difficulty of identifying sts and rows with the specialty yarn.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Length from the crotch to the shoulders 32 (36) cm
Leg length 21 (24) cm
Sleeve length 15 (18) cm

ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
r	Row(s)
k	Knit
p	Purl
M1B	Increase (lift the loop between the stitches from behind with the left needle. Work it as a knit stitch).
k2tog	Decrease: knit 2 sts together.
Buttonhole	k2, bind off 2, k2. In the next row, cast on 2 sts above the 2 sts previously bound off.
...	Repeat what is shown in these stars to the end of the row.
(.)	Indicates number of sts per r for the 2 sizes: 3 months (6 months)

PRAM SUIT

3 MONTHS (6 MONTHS)

Start with the legs.

Cast on 30 (32) stitches with double pointed needles or circular needles (magic loop) and work 8 (10) cm ribbed knitting, k1 p1.

Change to stockinette stitch and make 2 M1B on the inside of the leg like this: k1, M1B, knit until there are 1 sts left on the row, M1B, k1 - repeat every 2 cm, 6 (7) times, in total 42 (46) sts.

Continue to 21 (23) cm.

Let this leg rest and knit one more.

Now the legs are joined by casting on 6 sts, work one leg 42 (46) sts, cast on 6 sts, work the other leg 42 (46) sts and cast on 6 sts. In total 102 (110) sts **and all measurements are now taken from this point.**

Work back and forth (flat) while the 6 sts in both sides are worked in garter sts (front band). Continue until a length of 3 (4) cm. Make the first buttonhole over the first/last 6 sts (*the buttonholes can be on the left or right front band*). The remaining buttonholes are placed with 6 (7) cm in between and there are 5 (5) buttonholes in total.

At 21 (22) cm divide into back and fronts with 27 (29) sts for front piece, 48 (52) sts for back piece, 27 (29) sts for the other front piece: they are worked separately, with identical increases for the sleeves.

Cast on for sleeves in the side of the right front piece

size 3 months: cast on 6-6-6-7 sts on every second row

size 6 months: cast on 8-8-8-6 sts on every second row

Both sizes: The 6 utmost sts on the sleeves are worked in garter stitch throughout the row.

At 30 (32) cm, bind off the neckline on every second row 5-3-2-1 sts in both sizes. The armhole (the sleeve measured in height from the first increase) measures 11 (12) cm. *Let the front piece rest.*

Work the back and left front piece the same way - but the increases to the sleeves are made on both sides of the back. **No** binding off for neckline here.

Turn work inside out and place the shoulders side by side and knit them together 2 and 2, bind the sts off at the same time.

HOOD

Pick up 50 (50) sts in the neckline.

Knit 4 (4) cm, increase 10 (10) sts evenly throughout the row.

Only size 6 months:

Make the same 10 sts increase again, at 10 cm.

Both sizes:

Knit until the work measures 18 (20) cm.

Divide the sts on 2 needles, turn work inside out and place the needles side by side and knit them together 2 and 2, bind the sts off at the same time or bind all sts off and sew the hood together.

EARS FOR THE HOOD (2 X)

Cast on 6 st.

1.)	p	(6)
2.)	*k1, M1B* x 5, k1	(11)
3. - 6.)	Stockinette st	(11)
7.)	k (bucking edge)	(11)
8. - 11.)	Stockinette st	(11)
12.)	k2tog x 5, k1	(6)

Cut the yarn, use a darning needle to pull the thread through the stitches, pull tight.

Fold the ear at the bucking edge and sew with a few stitches to hold it together.

ASSEMBLY

Sew the sleeves and weave in the ends.

Sew the buttons on front band.

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.



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
