Pattern Teddy Bears



Crocheted in Go handmades Teddy - a luxurious yarn in the nicest colours. Soft like a dream: 100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

YARN USAGE Teddy H 40 cm: 250 g A few meters of black yarn for mouth, nose and eyebrows.

MATERIALS

Filling Eyes: 14 mm Crochet hook: 3,0 - 3,5 mm

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YARN USAGE:

Teddy H 40 cm: 250 g A few meters of black yarn for mouth, snout and eyebrows.

MATERIALS:

Eyes: 14 mm Filling Crochet hook: 3,0 - 3,5 mm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

If nothing else is specified, work in spiral rounds. To finish the work, join the round with a sl st. Leave a 20 cm length of yarn and cut. Pull the yarn through the stitch.

It is recommended that the filling continues on an ongoing basis as the work progresses.

Mounting of the safety eyes:

The eyes are inserted, and the rear stops to the eyes are pushed from the inside.

The rear stops can and should be a little hard to plug in to ensure that they are sticking well.

Add the eyes after round 46, you should have 8 st between the eyes.

The stoppers of the eyes should be added from the inside, you could use a coin to press them on. Add filler to the lower part of the head.

Stuff the rest of the head with filler.

Close with a sl st and sew in the ends.

Shape the head and the eye hollows:

With Teddy, thread a needle with approx. 25 cm yarn.

Put the needle in from under the chin and out at the side of the eye.

Guide the thread around some stitches by the eye and then back out under the chin. Tighten the yarn to form the hollow around the eye, tighten the yarn through a few stitches under the chin.

Repeat for the other side of the same eye.

The hollow for the eye is now completed. Should you want the hollow deeper the process can be repeated and a stitch added towards the top of the eye. Remember to always keep the yarn tight when the needle is pulled out under the chin, during the sewing to keep the tension and for the hollow to become permanent.

Repeat the process for the other eye.

Sew on eyebrows using the black yarn.

Hook Size + Tension

Crocheters crochet very differently: some crochet with a hook size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design and quality as a person who crochets with a hook size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of crocheters who join us. The key to crochet a specific size is a lot about the crochet style/hands/skills, rather than the size of hook. Therefore, we will recommend a range of hook sizes.
