Sweater

MATERIALS

12 (13)14 skein(s) of Snowstorm color 23

Knitting needles 9 mm (US 13), 10 mm (US 15)

Tapestry needle for sewing

YARN QUALITY

Snowstorm, Hobbii 100 % wool, 50 m (55 yrd)

GAUGE

 $10 \text{ cm} \times 10 \text{ cm} (4'' \times 4'') = 10 \text{ sts} \times 14 \text{ rows}$

ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit

p = purl

PC = popcorn stitch

CO = cast on

BO = bind off

inc = increase

SIZE

S (M) L

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 48 (55) 62 cm / 18.8" (21.6") 24.4" Length: 52 (57) 60 cm / 20.4" (22.4") 23.6"

PATTERN INFORMATION

The sweater is knitted on straight needles, consisting of separate pieces that are sewn together at the end.

It is soft and stretches easily in width and length.

INFO AND TIPS

Rib stitch: All rib edges are made in double rib. Knit2, purl2.

Stockinette stitch: k on the right side, p on the wrong side.

Popcorn stitch: Increase 1 st to 7 sts, work 8 rows, in the 9th row work together first 3 sts,

then next 4 sts, and pass the remaining stitch over the last stitch.

FRONT PIECE

With 9 mm (US 13) needles CO 54 (58) 62 sts. Work 8 rows in rib stitch. Change to 10 mm (US 15) needles and knit 60 (66) 70 rows with stockinette stitch.

Start forming the neckline as follows: BO 12 (14) 14 sts in the middle of the front piece, and then on both sides of the neckline in every other row 2 sts, 1st and 1 st. Continue working the remaining stitches on both sides for 4 more rows = total 72 (78) 82 rows.

BO sts on the shoulders.

BACK PIECE

Work it like the front piece. Start forming the neckline in the 60th (72th) 76th row as follows: BO 14 (16) 16 sts in the middle of the back piece, and then on both sides of the neckline in every other row 2 sts and 1 st.

BO sts on the shoulders.

SLEEVES

With the 9 mm (US 13) needles CO 30 sts. Work 9 rows with rib stitch.

Row 10: 1 edge st, inc, k2, p2, inc, k2, p2, continue inc after every 4th sts till the end of the row = 38 sts in total. Change to 10 mm (US 15) needle.

Rows 11-12: work in stockinette stitch.

Row 13: 1 edge st, *k5, PC* repeat from * to * 6 times, 1 edge st.

Work 5 rows in stockinette stitch. To make the sleeve wider, in every 6th row increase on each side of the sleeve.

Row 19: 1 edge st, k3, *PC, k5* repeat from * to * 5 times, PC, k4, 1 edge st.

Rows 20-23: work in stockinette stitch.

Row 24: 1 edge st, k1, *PC, k5*, repeat from * to * 6 times, PC, k2, 1 edge st.

Work through in stockinette stitch continuing increasing in each 6th row.

Finish the sleeve in the 55th row.



FINISHING

Neckline

With the 9 mm needles (US 13) CO 86 (86) 90 sts. Work 6 rows in rib stitch. Sew the ends together.

First, sew the shoulders together with a mattress stitch, then sew the neck rib to the neckline flat and the other parts of the sweater again with mattress stitch. Secure all cut ends.
