MATERIALS


Long coat
12 (13, 14, 14) skeins of Amigo Giga, color A52
Oblong Wooden Buttons - 30 mm (1.2 inches), 9 pcs

Medium length coat
9 (10, 11, 11) skeins of Amigo Giga, color A04
Oblong Wooden Buttons - 30 mm (1.2 inches), 8 pcs

Short coat
8 (8, 9, 9) skeins of Amigo Giga, color A58
Oblong Wooden Buttons - 30 mm (1.2 inches), 6 pcs

Circular needle 80 cm/9.0 mm (US 13)
Circular needle 80 cm/8.0 mm (US 11)
Stitch markers
Stitch holders

YARN QUALITY

 **Amigo Giga**, Hobbii
100% HB acrylic
150 g (5,2 Oz) = 95 meter (103 yds)

GAUGE

With needle 9.0 mm (US 13) in stockinette stitch:
9 sts and 20 rows = 10 cm (4")

ABBREVIATIONS

CO = cast on
BO = bind off
Tbl = through back loop
WS = wrong side
RS = right side
GSR-DS = German Short Row Double Stitch
M1L = make 1 left leaning stitch

SIZE

S (M, L, XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Width: approx. 50 (55, 60, 65) cm/20" (21 ½", 23 ½", 25 ½")
Length short: 48 cm/19"
Length medium: 78 cm/31"
Length long: 108 cm/43"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This coat can be made in 3 different lengths. It is made with buttons down the front and the two longer models have a vent on each side. Back and front panels are worked separately and seamed together. The length can easily be adjusted to fit your wishes, as back and front panels are worked without any in- or decreases. The model is made with drop-shoulders and a double stand-up collar featuring two buttonholes.

BACK PANEL

CO 45 (50, 54, 59) sts on circular needles size 9 mm (US 13)
 Work back and forth in garter stitch until work measures:
 Short model: 42 (44, 46, 46) cm/16,5" (17,3", 18", 18")
 Medium model: 72 (74, 76, 76) cm/28" (29", 30", 30")
 Long model: 102 (104, 106, 106) cm/40" (41", 42", 42")
 Bind off.

RIGHT FRONT PANEL

Buttonhole

1. row, RS: knit 2, BO 1, knit until end of row.
 2. row, WS: knit until last 2 sts, CO 1 st, knit 2.

CO 27 (29, 31, 34) sts on circular needles size 9 mm (US 13)
 1. row is a WS row

On all models you will be making buttonholes (RS row).

Work 1. Buttonhole when work measures:

Short model: 1 (3, 5, 5) cm/0.4" (1.2", 2", 2")
 Medium model: 11 (13, 15, 15) cm/4.3" (5", 6", 6")
 Long model: 31 (33, 35, 35) cm/ 12" (13", 14", 14")

Now the buttonholes will be worked every 10 cm/ 4". Last buttonhole will be 1 cm/0.4" before the neckline

Continue back and forth in garter stitch until work measures:

Short model: 35 (37, 39, 39) cm/13.8" (14.5", 15.4", 15.4")
 Medium model: 65 (67, 69, 69) cm/25.7" (26.4", 27.2", 27.2")
 Long model: 95 (97, 99, 99) cm/ 37.4" (38.2", 39", 39")

1. row, RS: Let the first 4 sts on the side of the neck rest.
 2.-4. row: Knit the remaining 23 (25, 27, 30) sts.
 5. row: BO 2 sts (all sizes) for the neckline.
 6. row: Knit
 7. row: BO 2 sts (all sizes) for the neckline.
 8. row: Knit
 9. row: BO 1 st (all sizes) for the neckline.
 10. row: Knit (WS row).
 11. row, RS: Knit 8, turn.
 12. row, WS: 1 GSR-DS, knit 7.

13. row, RS, Knit 4, turn
14. row, WS: 1 GSR-DS, knit3.
- 15.-16. row: Knit. Place stitch marker (SM = shoulder marker) to mark the shoulder.
17. row, RS: Knit 1, M1L, knit until end of row.
18. row, WS: Knit.
19. row, RS: Knit 1, M1L, knit until end of row.
20. row, WS: Knit.

Bind off.

LEFT FRONT PANEL

CO 27 (29, 31, 34) sts on circular needles size 9 mm (US 13)

1. row is a WS row.

Continue back and forth in garter stitch until work measures:

Short model: 35 (37, 39, 39) cm/13.8" (14.5", 15.4", 15.4")

Medium model: 65 (67, 69, 69) cm/25.7" (26.4", 27.2", 27.2")

Long model: 95 (97, 99, 99) cm/ 37.4" (38.2", 39", 39")

1. row, WS: Let the first 4 sts on the side of the neck rest.
- 2.-4. row: Knit the remaining 23 (25, 27, 30) sts.
5. row: BO 2 sts (all sizes) for the neckline.
6. row: Knit
7. row: BO 2 sts (all sizes) for the neckline.
8. row: Knit
9. row: BO 1 st (all sizes) for the neckline.
10. row: Knit (RS row).

11. row, WS: Knit 8, turn.
12. row, RS: 1 GSR-DS, knit 7.
13. row, WS, Knit 4, turn
14. row, RS: 1 GSR-DS, knit3.
- 15.-16. row: Knit. Place stitch marker (SM = shoulder marker) to mark the shoulder.
17. row, WS: Knit 1, M1L, knit until end of row.
18. row, RS: Knit.
19. row, WS: Knit 1, M1L, knit until end of row.
20. row, RS: Knit.

Bind off.

Sew shoulders together with Kitchener stitch.

SLEEVES

From stitch marker, SM, measure 26 cm/10" down the back and front panel. From the RS pick up 24 sts tbl on each side of the SM.

Decrease 1 sts in each side every 8 rounds until 30 sts remain.

Continue until the sleeve measures 45 (45, 40, 40) cm/18" (18", 16", 16") from the shoulder seam.

Bind off.

Work the second sleeve the same way.

COLLAR

Pick up sts along the neckline with needles 8,00 mm (US 11) (= 48 (50, 50, 52) stitches including the 4 stitches placed on each front piece).

Work back and forth until the collar measures 18 cm/7".

At the same time make buttonholes when the collar measures – 3, 6, 12 and 15 cm/1.2", 2.4", 5" and 6".

(See buttonhole description above.)

FINISHING

Fold the collar down so WS is facing outwards. Sew together each of the two short ends.

Now turn the collar with RS facing out and sew into place from the WS.

Sew around the buttonholes to make buttonhole 1 and 4 into one buttonhole and make buttonhole 2 and 3 into one buttonhole.

Sew coat together at the sides, vent on the long coat = 45 cm/18" and vent on the medium coat = 15 cm/6". Sew the sleeves together and attach the buttons.
