MATERIALS

9 (12) 12 (15) skeins of Diablo col Hot Pink (45)

Circular needle 7 mm (US 10.75) - 80 cm (32")

Circular needle 4 mm (US 6) - 60 cm (24")

8 stitch markers

1 cable needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Diablo**, Hobbii

40 % Acrylic, 30 % Mohair, 30 % Polyamide
25 g (0.9 oz) = 225 m (246 yds)

GAUGE

13 sts x 18 rows = 10 cm (4")

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)

k = knit

p = purl

rnd(s) = round(s)

M1R: Pick up the bar between 2 stitches from the front and knit it through the back loop.

M1L: Pick up the bar between 2 stitches from the back and knit it.

k3tog = knit 3 stitches together

co = cast on

bo = bind off

col = color(s)

sm = stitch marker(s)

SIZE

S (M) L (XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 62 (69) 76 (82) cm / 24.4" (27.2") 30" (32.3")

Width: 45 (52) 59 (66) cm / 17.7" (20.5") 23.2" (26")

ABOUT THE PATTERN

The Love Is (K)not A Crime sweater is worked with three strands of yarn. The fluffy look complements the dashing pink as well as the aesthetic hearts along the sleeves. The sweater is worked top down with raglan increases.

INFORMATION AND TIPS

The Love Is (K)not A Crime sweater is worked on a circular needle with three strands of yarn and raglan increases. The pattern consists of the following parts: "NECKLINE RIBBING", "RAGLAN INCREASES", "PATTERN REPEAT", "BODY" and "SLEEVES". Stitch markers are used. It is important that there are always two knit stitches between the stitch markers when working the raglan increases. The sweater is worked top down.

NECKLINE RIBBING

Co 36 (36) 42 (42) sts with needle 7 mm (US 10.75). Work 20 cm of ribbing (*k4, p2*).

RAGLAN INCREASES

Now begin working the raglan increases.

Rnd 1: K to end.

Rnd 2: Mark the positions of the raglan increases like this: *Place sm, k2, place sm, k 8 (8) 10 (10) sts, place sm, k2, place sm, k 6 (6) 7 (7) sts*, repeat from * to * to end.

Rnd 3: Work raglan increases like this: *M1R, k to next sm, M1L, k to next sm*, repeat from * to * to end.

Repeat rnd 3 until the work measures 15 (20) 25 (30) cm / 5.9" (7.9") 9.8" (11.8") measured from rnd 1. End at the end of the rnd.

The work is now divided into body and sleeves by putting the sleeve sts on hold.

BODY

K until the 4th sm. Put all sts between the 4th sm and the 5th sm on hold. Cast on 10 (12) 14 (16) sts. K from the 5th to the 8th sm. Put all sts between the and 8th sm and the 1st sm on hold. Cast on 10 (12) 14 (16) sts. K until end of round. The sts that are not put on hold make up the body. K until the body measures 32 (34) 36 (38) cm / 12.6" (13.4") 14.2" (15") measured from rnd 1 of the raglan increases. For the bottom ribbing, work 7 rnds of *k2, p2*. Bo with the Italian bind off method.

SLEEVES

Place the sts on hold back on circular needle 7 mm (US 10.75). Pick up 10 (12) 14 (16) sts under the sleeves. Work one sleeve at a time. Find the middle of the shoulder and place a sm in the 12th st to right the of the middle and in the 12th st to the left of the middle. There are now 24 sts between the 2 sm.

Repeat *k until sm, work pattern* 12 times (see "PATTERN" below).

You have now worked one whole heart.

Continue until you have worked 3 hearts.

Continue like this for the next 4 hearts, making it a total of 7 hearts, but work 2 increases somewhere in the piece with k sts on every 3rd rnd.

Move all sts to needle 4 mm (US 6). Repeat *k3tog* to end. For the ribbing, work 5 rnds of *k1, p1*. Bo with the Italian bind off method.

Same procedure for the second sleeve.

PATTERN REPEAT

Rnd 1: K5, p1, k12, p1, k5.

Rnd 2: K3, p1, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, p the 2 sts on the cable needle, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, k2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, p2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, p1, k3

Rnd 3: K3, p1, k2, p4, k4, p4, k2, p1, k3.

Rnd 4: K3, p1, k2, p4, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, p4, k2, p1, k3.

Rnd 5: K3, p1, k2, p4, k4, p4, k2, p1, k3.

Rnd 6: K3, p1, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, p1, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, p3, k4, p3, place 1 st on a cable needle behind the work, k2, p the st on the cable needle, p1, k3.

Rnd 7: K4, p1, k2, p3, k4, p3, k2, p1, k4.

Rnd 8: K4, p1, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, p1, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, p2, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, k the sts on the cable needle, p2, place 1 st on a cable needle behind the work, k2, p the st on the cable needle, p1, k4.

Rnd 9: K5, p1, k2, p2, k4, p2, k2, p1, k5.

Rnd 10: K6, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, p2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, k4, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, p the 2 sts on the cable needle, k6.

Rnd 11: K7, p1, k8, p1, k7.

Rnd 12: K7, p1, place 2 sts on a cable needle in front of the work, k2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, place 2 sts on a cable needle behind the work, k2, k the 2 sts on the cable needle, p1, k7

Knit or sew down the neckline to the inside of the sweater and weave in the ends.
