MATERIALS

Diablo:

Col 44 Azalea – approx 20 (20) 25 (30) 35 (40) g / 0.7 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) 1.2 (1.4) oz.
1 (1) 2 (2) 2 (2) skein(s)

Col 37 Red – approx 20 (20) 25 (30) 35 (40) g / 0.7 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) 1.2 (1.4) oz.
1 (1) 2 (2) 2 (2) skein(s)

Col 17 Mango – approx 10 (10) 15 (20) 25 (30) g / 0.4 (0.4) 0.5 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) oz.
1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) skein(s)

Col 20 Olive – approx 10 (10) 15 (20) 25 (30) g / 0.4 (0.4) 0.5 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) oz.
1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) skein(s)

Col 31 Cobalt – approx 10 (10) 15 (20) 25 (30) g / 0.4 (0.4) 0.5 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) oz.
1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) skein(s)

Col 34 Syringa – approx 10 (10) 15 (20) 25 (30) g / 0.4 (0.4) 0.5 (0.7) 0.9 (1.1) oz.
1 (1) 1 (1) 2 (2) skein(s)

Total amount of yarn approx 80 (80) 110 (140) 170 (200) g / 2.8 (2.8) 3.8 (4.9) 5.9 (7)

Circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) - 40 cm (16") + 60 cm (24"), 80 cm (32") or 100 cm (39")
Circular needle 4 mm (US 6) - 40 cm (16") + 60 cm (24"), 80 cm (32") or 100 cm (39")
Tapestry needle
9 stitch markers
2 stitch holders

YARN QUALITY

 **Diablo**, Hobbii
40 % Acrylic, 30 % Mohair, 30 % Polyamide
25 g (0.9 oz) = 225 m (246 yds)

GAUGE

22 sts x 27 rows in stockinette stitch with
needle 4 mm (US 6) = 10 cm (4")

SIZE

2 (4) 6 (8) 10 (12) years

MEASUREMENTS

Body length (sweater) measured at the middle of the back: Approx 32 (36) 40 (42) 46 (49) cm / 12.6" (14.2") 15.7" (16.5") 18.1" (19.3") (including 3 cm (1.2") of ribbing at the bottom).

Sleeve length measured from the armhole: Approx 32 (34) 36 (38) 42 (44) cm / 12.6" (13.4") 14.2" (15") 16.5" (17.3").

Chest circumference (sweater): Approx 57 (61) 63 (68) 74 (77) cm / 22.4" (24") 24.8" (26.8") 29.1" (30.3").

ABOUT THE PATTERN

This lovely children's sweater is knitted in Diablo. The sweater is worked top down with raglan increases on the yoke. It features a double layered ribbing at the neckline as well as ribbing at the bottom of the sleeves and body. The sweater is worked from the right side in one piece.

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)

k = knit

p = purl

rnd(s) = round(s)

M1R: Pick up the bar between 2 stitches from the back and knit it.

M1L: Pick up the bar between 2 stitches from the front and knit it through the back loop.

co = cast on

bo = bind off

col = color(s)

DPN = double pointed needles

INFORMATION AND TIPS

The sweater is worked with 2 strands of Diablo. The pattern is made by letting the colors of the rainbow fade together.

Color order:

- 1: 2 strands of Azalea col 44.
- 2: 1 strand of Azalea col 44 and 1 strand of Red col 37.
- 3: 2 strands of Red col 37.
- 4: 1 strand of Red col 37 and 1 strand of Mango col 17.
- 5: 2 strands of Mango col 17.
- 6: 1 strand of Mango col 17 and 1 strand of Olive col 20.
- 7: 2 strands of Olive col 20.
- 8: 1 strand of Olive col 20 and 1 strand of Cobalt col 31.
- 9: 2 strands of Cobalt col 31.
- 10: 1 strand of Cobalt col 31 and 1 strand of Syringa col 34.
- 11: 2 strands of Syringa col 34.
- 12: 1 strand of Syringa col 34 1 strand of Azalea col 44.
- 13: 2 strands of Azalea col 44.
- 14: 1 strand of Azalea col 44 and 1 strand of Red col 37.
- 15: 2 strands of Red col 37.

Stripe length (13 stripes, excluding neckline, sleeve ribbing and bottom ribbing) – 2 (2.5) 3 (3) 3.5 (3.5) cm / 0.8" (1") 1.2" (1.2") 1.4" (1.4").

NECKLINE

Co 64 (68) 70 (74) 78 (82) sts for the neckline with circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) - 40 cm (16") or with DPN.

Join in the round and work in the round. Work 7 cm (2.8") rib in the round (*k1, p1*). Remember to place a stitch marker to mark the beginning of the round.

The neckline ribbing is knitted down in rib (k1, p1) in the following way: The sts of the last rnd are worked together with the cast on edge. Use the right needle to pick up the st from the cast on edge and place in on the left needle. K it together with the st on the left needle. Make sure that the sts are aligned with the cast on sts so that the neckline does not become skew.

You can also choose to sew down the neckline ribbing at the end with loose stitches.

Begin the yoke by working all sts onto the circular needle 4 mm (US 6) - 40 cm (16"). (Change to a longer circular needle of 60 cm (24"), 80 cm (32") or 100 cm (39") eventually to accommodate the growing number of sts following the raglan increases.)

Remember to change colors for the stripes as you go along following the stated measurements of the different sizes (see INFORMATION AND TIPS).

YOKE

The yoke is worked in stockinette stitch in the round with raglan increases before and after a raglan st on every other rnd.

Divide the sts in preparation for the raglan increases by placing stitch markers on each side of the raglan sts like this: Be aware that the rnd begins between the back piece and the right sleeve.

Place marker to mark the beginning of the rnd, 1 raglan st, (marker), 9 (9) 10 (10) 12 (12) sts for the right sleeve, (marker), 1 raglan st, (marker), 21 (23) 23 (25) 25 (27) sts for the front piece, (marker), 1 raglan st, (marker), 9 (9) 10 (10) 12 (12) sts for the left sleeve, (marker), 1 raglan st, (marker), 21 (23) 23 (25) 25 (27) sts for the back piece.

Work the yoke by repeating the following rnds:

Round 1: M1R, k1 (raglan), M1L, k the sts of the right sleeve, M1R, k1 (raglan), M1L, k the sts of the front piece, M1R, k1 (raglan), M1L, k the sts of the left sleeve, M1R, k1 (raglan), M1L, k the sts of the back piece.

Round 2: K to end.

Continue working the yoke in the round with raglan increases by repeating rnds 1-2 until you have worked a total of 18 (18) 20 (22) 24 (26) raglan increases.

You now have 208 (212) 230 (250) 270 (290) sts on the needle.

BODY

Now the work is divided into body and sleeves, and sts are cast on for the armholes like this: Be aware that the raglan sts are part of the body.

K1 (raglan st, part of the body), place 45 (45) 50 (54) 60 (64) sts on a stitch holder or a piece of yarn (right sleeve). Co 4 sts (forwards loop) for the armhole (same number for all sizes), k1 (raglan st), k the sts of the front piece, k1 (raglan st), place 45 (45) 50 (54) 60 (64) sts on a stitch holder or a piece of yarn (left sleeve), k1 (raglan st), co 4 sts (forwards loop) for the armhole (same number for all sizes), k1 (raglan st), k the sts of the back piece, k1 (raglan st).

You now have 126 (134) 138 (150) 162 (170) sts for the body.

Continue working stockinette stitch in the round with color changes until you have worked the 13 stripes.

(**Remember** to place a marker to mark the beginning of the rnd and don't forget to change colors.)

Change to circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) - 60 cm (24"), 80 cm (32") or 100 cm (39") and work rib in the round (k1, p1) until the ribbing measures 3 cm (1.2"). Bo all sts in rib.

The sweater measures 32 (36) 40 (42) 46 (49) cm / 12.6" (14.2") 15.7" (16.5") 18.1" (19.3") measured from the neckline to the bottom ribbing

SLEEVES x 2

Place the 45 (45) 50 (54) 60 (64) sts on the stitch holder back on circular needle 4 mm (US 6) - 40 cm (16") or DPN 4 mm (US 6) and pick up 4 sts in the sts you cast on below the sleeve.

Remember to place a marker below the sleeve to mark the beginning of the rnd.

Work the 49 (49) 54 (58) 64 (68) sts in stockinette stitch in the round until the sleeve measures 29 (31) 33 (35) 39 (41) cm / 11.4" (12.2") 13" (13.8") 15.4" (16.1").

Change to circular needle 3.5 mm (US 4) - 40 cm (16") or DPN 3.5 mm (US 4) and work 3 cm (1.2") rib in the round (k1, p1). When the sleeve measures 32 (34) 36 (38) 42 (44) cm / 12.6" (13.4") 14.2" (15") 16.5" (17.3"), bo all sts in rib.

FINISHING

Weave in all ends.
