MATERIALS

MC: 3 (3) 4 (4) 5 skeins of Kind Feather color 17

CC: 1 skein of Kind Feather color 11

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)

YARN QUALITY

Kind Feather, Hobbii 100 % Premium Acrylic 100 g = 235 m

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4'' x 4'') = 15 DC x 8 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

CC = contrast color

CH = chain

DC = double crochet

DC2TOG = double crochet 2 sts together

FO = fasten off

MC = main color

SC = single crochet

SK = skip

SP = space

SS = slip stitch

ST = stitch/es

TR = treble crochet

__ = Repeat instructions from * to * as

many times as directed

(__) = Instructions within brackets are carried out within the same stitch

SIZE

1-2 years (3-4 years) 5-6 years (7-8 years) 9-10 years

INFO AND TIPS

The body is worked in rounds and turned at the end of each round. You then split the body into two sections and work the top in rows, turning at the end of each row.

I don't join my starting chain because I find it too fiddly, I join after my first row of DC and use my yarn tail to close the gap.

When working into the side of a ST, I like to pick up a loop from the ST next to it to prevent any gaps forming.

Unless otherwise stated, you will be working with MC.

Your turning CH counts as a ST throughout, including when making your pocket.

MAIN BODY

CH 100 (108) 114 (122) 130.

Row 1: DC in fourth CH from hook and each CH along. SS to start CH to join, CH3, turn.

Row 2: DC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH3 to join, CH3, turn. You should have a total of 98 (106) 112 (120) 128 ST.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 15 (18) 18 (20) 20 rows including row 1. At the end of your final row CH3 and turn.

BACK PANEL

Row 1: DC in next 48 (52) 55 (59) 63 ST. CH3, turn.

Row 2: SK ST at base of CH, DC in each ST from the previous row. DC between final 2 ST, CH3, turn. You should have a total of 49 (53) 56 (60) 64 ST.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 10 (10) 12 (12) 14 rows. FO and weave in your ends.

FRONT PANEL

Join your yarn in your first unworked ST next to the back panel, CH3.

Row 1: SK ST at base of CH, DC in each ST from the previous row. DC between final 2 ST, CH3, turn. You should have a total of 49 (53) 56 (60) 64 ST.

Repeat row 1 until you have a total of 6 (6) 8 (8) 10 rows. At the end of your final row CH3 and move onto neckline one.

Neckline one

Row 1: SK ST at base of CH, DC in the next 15 (17) 17 (19) 19 ST. DC2TOG, DC in the next ST. CH3, turn.

Row 2: SK ST at base of CH, DC2TOG. DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. DC between final 2 ST CH3, turn.



Row 3: SK ST at base of CH, DC in each ST from the previous row until 3 ST remain. DC2TOG. DC between final 2 ST. CH3, turn.

Row 4: Repeat row 2.

FO, leaving a long tail for seaming.

Neckline two

Count 18 (20) 20 (22) 22 ST in from the other side of your piece and join your yarn. CH3 and start working into the next ST.

Row 1: DC2TOG. DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. DC between final 2 ST. CH3, turn.

Row 2: SK ST at base of CH, DC in each ST from the previous row until 3 ST remain. DC2TOG, DC between final 2 ST. CH3, turn.

Row 3: SK ST at base of CH, DC2TOG. DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. DC between final 2 ST, CH3, turn.

Row 4: Repeat row 2.

FO leaving a long tail for sewing,



Seaming

Seam your shoulders using your long yarn tails.

Neckline edging

With right side facing you, join your yarn in any ST at the back of the neckline and CH3.

Row 1: SK ST at base of CH. DC in each ST along the back of the neckline, then 2DC in the side of each neckline ST. DC in each ST along the front of the neckline, then 2DC in the side of each neckline ST. DC in each remaining ST along the back of the neckline, SS to CH3 to join. CH1, do not turn.

Row 2: SC in each ST from the previous row. FO and weave in your ends.



SLEEVES

With right side facing you, join your yarn in the side of any underarm ST and CH3.

Row 1: DC in the side of the ST at base of CH. 2DC in the side of each ST around the sleeve edge. SS to CH3 to join. CH3, turn. A total of 40 (40) 48 (48) 56 ST.

Row 2: DC2TOG. DC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH3 to join. CH3, turn.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 rows.

If you prefer a loose cuff, work row 2 until you reach the desired width then stop decreasing. Keep an eye on the length

of your sleeve as you go and work more or less rows depending on your preference.

At the end of your final row, SS to CH3 to join, CH1 and turn.

Frill row 1: Loosely SC in each ST from the row before. SS to CH1 to join, CH4, do not turn.





Frill row 2: TR in ST at base of CH. 2TR in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH4 to join. CH4, do not turn.

Frill row 3: TR in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH4 to join, CH4, do not turn. Repeat frill row 3 one more time, FO and weave in your ends using your yarn tail to close any gaps in the underarm.

Repeat to make the other sleeve.

Hem frill

With right side facing you, join your yarn in any CH along the bottom edge and CH1.

Row 1: SC in each CH along the bottom edge. SS to CH1 to join, CH4. do not turn.

Row 2: TR in the ST at base of CH. 2TR in each ST around. SS to CH4 to join, CH4, do not turn.

Row 3: SK ST at base of CH, TR in each ST from the previous row and between the final 2 ST. SS to CH4 to join, CH4, do not turn. For sizes 1-2 years, 3-4 years and 5-6 years repeat row 3 one more time, then FO and weave in your ends. For sizes 7-8 years



and 9-10 years, repeat row 3 two more times, then FO and weave in your ends.

Pockets

With CC, CH4.

Round 1: (2DC, CH2) in fourth CH from hook then *3DC, CH2* 3 times all in the same space. SS to CH3 to join.

Round 2: CH2 and SK the next 3 ST. *(3DC, CH2, 3DC) in the next CH SP, CH2* 3 times. SS into final CH2 of round 1.

Round 3: CH3. 3DC in next CH2 SP. DC in each of the next 3 ST. *2SC in CH2 SP. SC in each of the next 3 ST* twice. 3DC in next CH2 SP. *SC in each of the next 3 ST, 2SC in CH2 SP* twice. DC in each of the next 3 ST then 3DC in CH2 SP. CH3 and SS into final CH2 of round 2, Round 4: CH3. SK CH3 SP, DC in each of the next 6 ST. SC in each ST until you reach your 3DC at the base of your heart. DC, 2DC in next ST, DC. SC in each ST until 7 ST remain. DC in the next 6 ST, then CH3 and SS to your final CH3 of round 3.

Round 5: Optional for a larger pocket. CH3, DC in each DC from the previous round, and SC in each SC from the previous round. To finish CH3 and SS to your final CH3 of round 4.

FO leaving a long tail and use this to sew your pocket to the front of your jumper after blocking flat.





Weave in all your ends and you're done!
