## Bucket Hat - Tour de France

## MATERIALS

2 (3) 3 skeins of Rainbow Cotton 8/8, Yellow (col. 54)
or
2 (3) 3 skeins of Rainbow Cotton 8/8, Dark Green (col. 22)
or
2 (3) 3 skeins of Rainbow Cotton 8/8,
White (col. 01) and 1 skein of Red (col. 58)
for polka dots

Note! If you make 2 bucket hats of the same color, you will need 4 (5) 5 skeins of yarn.
One skein of red yarn will make approx. 14-15 dots and you will need approx. 12 dots for a hat.

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)
Tapestry needle
Stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

(33) Rainbow Cotton 8/8, Hobbii

100\% cotton
$50 \mathrm{~g}(1.75 \mathrm{oz})=75 \mathrm{~m}(82 \mathrm{yds})$

## GAUGE

15 sc using crochet hook $4 \mathrm{~mm}($ US G/6) = 10 cm (4")

## SIZE

S (M) L

## MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 55 (58) $60 \mathrm{~cm} / 21.6^{\prime \prime}$ (22.8") 23.6"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

This unisex bucket hat is crocheted top down, in continuous rounds.
You can crochet one either in yellow (the leader's jersey), green (the sprinter's jersey), white (the youth jersey) or white with red polka dots (the climber's jersey).

## INFO AND TIPS

The bucket hat is crocheted top down, and at the same time in continuous rounds. Place a stitch marker around the 1st stitch on the round and move it every time you begin a new round.

The increases on the crown and the brim of the bucket hat are staggered to avoid that the shape of the hat becomes angular.

Inc $=$ increase $=2 \mathrm{sc}$ in the same sc.
$1 \mathrm{sc} / 2 \mathrm{sc} / 3 \mathrm{sc} / 4 \mathrm{sc}$ etc. $=1 \mathrm{sc}$ in next sc-1 sc in each of the next $2 s c-1 s c$ in each of the next $3 s c-1$ sc in each of the next $4 s c$ etc.

For all 3 sizes, work until and including rnd 9. From here you must follow the instructions for each individual size.

## PATTERN



Begin with yellow, green, or white and ch 3, join these into a ring with 1 sl st.

Rnd 1: 8 sc around the ring and the starting tail. Mark the 1st st of the rnd.
Rnd 2: Inc in each sc around $=16 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 3: *1 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around $=24 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 4: *2 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around $=32$ sc.
Rnd 5: 1 sc , *inc, 3 sc , rep from * to * 7 times, inc and $2 \mathrm{sc}=40 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 6: *4 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around $=48 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 7: 2 sc , *inc, 5 sc*, rep from * to * 7 times, inc and $3 \mathrm{sc}=56 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 8: *6 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around $=64 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 9: 2 sc, *inc, 7 sc*, rep from * to * 7 times, inc and $5 \mathrm{sc}=72 \mathrm{sc}$.

From here the $\mathbf{3}$ different sizes are worked following the instructions for each individual size.

## Small

Rnd 10: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=72 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 11: *inc, 8 sc*, rep from * to * around $=80$ sc.
3 rnds of 1 sc in each sc, and end 3rd rnd with 1 sl st.
Continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the sl st on the previous rnd. Be careful not to make the sl st too tight. Continue working sc in the loops that are behind the rnd of sl sts. From here work 12 rnds of 1 sc in each sc. After the last rnd, work another 2 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd.

Continue to the brim. Work the first rnd in the loops that are behind the rnd of sl sts. Be aware that the last inc on this rnd is worked in the last sl st of the previous rnd and that it may be a bit difficult to insert the hook into this sl st.

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Rnd 1: *7 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around = 90 sc.
Rnd 2: 1 sc in each sc = 90 sc.
Rnd 3: 4 sc, * inc, 8 sc*, rep from * to * 9 times, inc and 4 sc = 100 sc.
Rnd 4: 1 sc in each sc = 100 sc.
Rnd 5:1 sc in each sc = 100 sc
Rnd 6: *inc, }9\mathrm{ sc*, rep from * to * around = 110 sc.
Rnd 7: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc.
Rnd 8: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc.
Rnd 9: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc.
```

After the last round, work another 2 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd. Break off the yarn.

## Medium

Rnd 10: *inc, 8 sc*, rep from * to * around $=80$ sc.
Rnd 11: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=80 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 12: 9 sc, * inc, 19 sc*, rep from * to * 3 times, inc and 10 sc = 84 sc .
3 rnds of 1 sc in each sc, and end 3rd rnd with 1 sl st.

Continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the sl st on the previous rnd. Be careful not to make the sl st too tight. Continue working sc in the loops that are behind the rnd of slsts. Work 13 rnds of 1 sc in each sc. After the last round, work another 3 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd.

Continue to the brim. Work the first rnd in the loops that are behind the rnd of sl sts. Be aware that the first inc on this rnd is worked in the last sl st of the previous rnd and that it may be a bit difficult to insert the hook into this sl st.

Rnd 1: *inc, 13 sc *, rep from * to * around $=90 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 2: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=90 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 3: 4 sc , *inc, 8 sc *, rep from * to * 9 times, inc and $4 \mathrm{sc}=100 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 4: 1 sc in each sc $=100 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 5: *inc, 9 sc*, rep from * to * around $=110$ sc.
Rnd 6: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=110 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 7: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc .
Rnd 8 : 5 sc, *inc, 9 sc*, rep from * to * 10 times, inc and $4 \mathrm{sc}=121 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 9: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=121 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 10: 1 sc in each $\mathrm{sc}=121 \mathrm{sc}$.

After the last round, work another 3 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd. Break off the yarn.

## Large

Rnd 10: *inc, 8 sc*, rep from * to * around $=80 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 11: 1 sc in each sc $=80 \mathrm{sc}$
Rnd 12: 4 sc , *inc, 9 sc *, rep from * to * 7 times, inc and $5 \mathrm{sc}=88 \mathrm{sc}$.

3 rnds of 1 sc in each sc, and end 3rd rnd with 1 sl st.

Continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the sl st on the previous rnd. Be careful not to make the sl st too tight. Continue working sc in the loops that are behind the rnd of sl sts. Work 13 rnds of 1 sc in each sc. After the last rnd, work another 3 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd.

Continue to the brim. Work the first rnd in the loops that are behind the rnd of slsts. Be aware that the last inc on this rnd is worked in the last sl st of the previous rnd and that it may be a bit difficult to insert the hook into this sl st.

Rnd 1: *7 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around = 99 sc.
Rnd 2: 1 sc in each sc = 99 sc.
Rnd 3: 1 sc in each sc = 99 sc.
Rnd 4: 4 sc, * inc, 8 sc*, rep from * to * }10\mathrm{ times, inc and 4 sc = 110 sc.
Rnd 5: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc.
Rnd 6: 1 sc in each sc = 110 sc.
Rnd 7: *inc, }9\mathrm{ sc*, rep from * to * around = 121 sc.
Rnd 8: 1 sc in each sc = 121 sc.
Rnd 9: }1\mathrm{ sc in each sc = 121 sc.
Rnd 10: 1 sc in each sc = 121 sc.
```

After the last rnd, work another 3 sc and 1 sl st after the stitch marker to end in a straight vertical line under the rnd of sl sts further above.

From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the last sl st on the previous rnd. Break off the yarn.

## POLKA DOTS (only for the "climber's" hat)

With red yarn ch 3 and join these into a ring with 1 sl st.

Rnd 1: 8 sc around the ring and the starting tail. Mark the 1st st of the rnd.
Rnd 2: Inc in each sc around $=16 \mathrm{sc}$.
Rnd 3: *1 sc, inc*, rep from * to * around
$=24 \mathrm{sc}$.


From here continue working a rnd of sl sts around the last rnd. 1 sl st in each sc around and end with 1 sl st in the 1 st sl st on the rnd. Break off the yarn with a $25 \mathrm{~cm}\left(10^{\prime \prime}\right)$ long tail for sewing the dots onto the bucket hat. Thread the needle and pass it through the 2 nd sl st on the rnd so that the thread is on the back side of the dot but is still at the edge of the dot. Now you must split the thread into 2 thinner threads, each consisting of 4 threads. Weave in the starting tail in the middle of the dot.

Make 12 polka dots in total.

Place the dots as you like. On the model shown here, we have attached 3 dots on the top of the hat and the remaining 9 dots staggered from each other along the crown of the hat and further down over the brim.

Place the dots flat and sew them on with whip stitches around the back loop of the dot and on the hat in one of the loops that is closest to the next stitch.

## ASSEMBLING

Weave in all ends and gently steam the piece. Tip! Turn the bucket hat inside out and place it over a round bowl, turning bottom up, and steam the top of the hat until it is even.
