The White Jersey

Children's T-shirt - Tour de France

MATERIALS

6 (6) 7 (8) 9 (10) skeins of Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col White (001)

1 skein of Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col Black (009)

Circular needles 3 mm, 40 cm Circular needles 3 mm, 60 cm Circular needles 4 mm, 40 cm Circular needles 4 mm, 60 cm

Double pointed needles 3 mm Double pointed needles 4 mm OR use magic loop technique

Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

Rainbow Cotton 8/8, Hobbii 100% cotton 50 g (1.8 oz) = 75 m (82 yds)

GAUGE

 $10 \times 10 \text{ cm} (4'' \times 4'') = 21 \text{ sts } \times 28 \text{ rows with } 4 \text{ mm needles}$

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit

P = purl

C1 = White (001)

C2 = Black (009)

St st = stockinette stitch

Inc = increase

CO = cast on

BO = bind off

SIZE

2 years (3-4 years) 5-6 years (7-8 years) 9-10 years (11-12 years)

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 38 (42) 46 (49) 51 (51) cm/15 (16.5)

18.1 (19.3) 20.1 (20.1) inches

Chest circumference: 57 (62) 70 (75) 81 (81) cm/ 22.4 (24.4) 27.6 (29.5) 31.9 (31.9) inches

T-shirt featuring an embroidered bike on the front. Worked top-down in the round in stockinette stitch.

TIPS AND INFO

The t-shirt itself is worked top-down with circular needles in stockinette stitch using C1. The bike is embroidered onto the t-shirt using C2. There is a chart showing how to embroider the bike.

BODY

Neckline

CO 72 (72) 76 (80) 80 (84) sts with circular needles 3 mm, 40 cm using C1. Place a stitch marker – this now marks the beginning of the round. Work 3 (3) 3 (4) 4 (4) cm/ 1.2 (1.2) 1.2 (1.6) 1.6 (1.6) inches of ribbing (k1, p1).

Now start knitting stockinette stitch in the round.

On the next round change to circular needles 4 mm and evenly increase 0 (0) 8 (4) 16 (12) sts. You will now have 72 (72) 84 (84) 96 (96) sts on your needles.

Work 4 (4) 4 (4) 4 (4) rounds of stockinette st while increasing as follows:

- **1. round**: *knit 3, inc* repeat from *to* until end of round = 96 (96) 112 (112) 128 (128) sts. Work 6 rounds of st st.
- **2. round**: *Knit 4, inc* repeat from *to* until end of round = 120 (120) 140 (140) 160 (160) sts.

Work 6 rounds of st st.

3. round: *knit 5, inc* repeat from *to* until end of round = 144 (144) 168 (168) 192 (192) sts.

Work 6 rounds of st st.

4. round: *knit 6, inc* * repeat from *to* until end of round = 168 (168) 196 (196) 224 (224) sts

Work 16 rounds of st st.



5. round ONLY SIZE 5-6 years (7-8 years) 9-10 (11-12) years: *Knit - (-) 7 (7) 7 (7), inc * repeat from *to* until end of round= 168 (168) 224 (224) 256 (256) sts.

Now work 5 (5) 6 (8) 9 (9) rounds of st st.

Work 1 round while evenly increasing 20 (36) 0 (14) 0 (0) sts. You will now have 188 (204) 224 (238) 256 (256) sts on your needles.

Divide body and sleeves

Now it is time to divide the sleeves from the body, let the sts for the sleeves rest on an extra circular needle or a piece of scrap yarn.

Knit 27 (30) 33 (35) 40 (40) sts, place the next 40 (42) 46 (48) 48 (48) sleeve sts on a piece of scrap yarn. CO 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) new sts, knit 54 (60) 66 (71) 80 (80) sts, place the next 40 (42) 46 (48) 48 (48) sleeve sts on a piece of scrap yarn CO 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) new sts. Knit the remaining 27 (30) 33 (36) 40 (40) sts.

Back and front panel

You will now have 120 (132) 148 (158) 176 (176) sts on your needles and the sts for the sleeves will be resting on a piece of scrap yarn. Place a st marker in the middle of the 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) CO sts under the left sleeve. This will be the beginning of your rounds and you will measure your work from here.

Continue until work measures 14 (16) 21 (22) 23 (23)cm/ 5.5 (6.3) 8.3 (8.7) 9.1 (9.1)inches or desired length before the ribbing.

On the last round evenly decrease 10 (12) 14 (16) 18 (20) sts

Change to circular needles 3 mm, 60 cm and work 4 (4) 4 (5) 5 (5) cm/ 1.6 (1.6) 1.6 (2) 2 (2) inches of ribbing (k1, p1) BO loosely in pattern.

SLEEVES (X2)

Move the 40 (42) 46 (48) 48 (48) sleeve sts onto a circular needle or double pointed needles size 4 mm. Pick up and knit one st in each of the 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) CO sts under the sleeve. You will now have 46 (48) 54 (56) 56 (56) sts on your needles.

Place a st marker in the middle of the 6 (6) 8 (8) 8 (8) CO sts under the sleeve to mark the beginning of your round.

Continue working in the round until the sleeve measures 6 (6) 7 (7) 8 (9) cm/ 2.4 (2.4) 2.8 (2.8) 3.1 (3.5) inches or desired length before the ribbing.

Work one round while evenly decreasing 4 (4) 4 (6) 6 (6) sts. You will now have 42 (44) 50 (50) 50 (50) sts on your needles.



Change to 3 mm needles and work 3 (3) 4 (4) 4 (4) cm/ 1.2 (1.2) 1.2 (1.6) 1.6 (1.6) inches of ribbing (k1, p1) in C1

The total length of the sleeve will now be approx. 9 (9) 11 (11) 13 (14) cm/ 3.5 (3.5) 4.3 (4.3) 5.1 (5.5) inches.

BO in pattern.


Finishing

Weave in the ends, wash and let dry flat.

EMBROIDERING THE BIKE

You will embroider the bike using duplicate stitching with C2. If you are not familiar with the technique of duplicate stitching, it is recommended to practice on a sample before moving on the garment itself. Using an embroidery ring can ease the work. The bike is embroidered onto the left chest of the t-shirt across your 16 rounds of st st (or wherever you feel like placing the bike).
