



KNITTING PATTERN

Sensommer

Blouse

Design: Knit by Trine P. | Hobbii Design



MATERIALS

4 (4) 4 (5) 5 skeins Evergreen, Natural / Undyed (02)

Needle no.4 (3,5 mm) and 6 (4 mm) (24"/32" or 60/80 cm wire) Double pointed needles no. 4 (3,5 mm) and 6 (4 mm). Or the needle you need to make the right gauge.

YARN QUALITY

Evergreen Organic Wool, Hobbii 100% Wool/ 50 g (1.75 oz) = 230 meter (252 yds) **ABOUT THE PATTERN**

GAUGE

22 sts and 30 rows in stockinette stitch on needle no. 6 (4 mm) = 4"x4" (10x10 cm) Knit with 2 strands of yarn held together.

ABBREVIATIONS

st = Stitch

m = Marker (placed between 2 sts)

edge st = Edge stitch(es)

k = knit

 $\mathbf{p} = \text{purl}$

k2tog = knit 2 together

SKPO = Slip a stitch knitwise, knit the next stitch, ergreen pass the slipped stitch over the knit stitch.

sl1 pw = Slip 1 st purlwise with the yarn behind the work.

sl1 pw yf = Slip 1 st purlwise with the yarn in front of the work.

tbl = through back loop

RS = Right side

WS = Wrong side

SIZES

3 (6) 12 (18) 24 months

MEASUREMENTS

Chest measurement: 20½" (21½") 24" (25")

26½" or 52,5 (55) 61,5 (63) 67 cm

Full length: 10" (11") 13" (15") 16" or 26 (28) 33

(38) 40 cm

Sleeve length: 7" (8") 81/2" (9") 10" or 18 (20) 22

(23) 26 cm

The blouse is knit top-down with raglan increases. The body is knit in stockinette stitch but is finished in a grafted pattern. There are short rows in the neck to create a deeper neckline.

Pattern







YOKE

Cast on 66 (70) 74 (78) 78 sts on needle no. 4 (3,5 mm). Knit ribbing on the next 6 rounds (k1, p1).

When you've made all 6 rounds of ribbing, switch to needle no. 6 (4 mm) and place m as below:

k 13 (13) 14 (15) 15 (right back), place m, k1 (raglan), place m, k5 (7) 7 (7) 7 (right sleeve), place m, k1 (raglan), place m, k26 (26) 28 (30) 30 (front), place m, k1 (raglan), place m, k5 (7) 7 (7) 7 (left sleeve), place m, k1 (raglan), place m, k13 (13) 14 (15) 15 (left back).

Make short rows on next round while starting the raglan increases.

The short rows are knit using the German Short Rows method:

Knit to where you need to turn your work, turn and *sl1 pw yf. Bring the yarn behind the work and pull so a double stitch occurs – one st becomes two sts*.

* *= GSR

When you are going to knit over the sts again, knit the double sts together either kw or pw depending on what the sts show you.

It might be a good idea to mark the short rows. It makes it easier to count and you won't miss a st when knitting on.

Increases:

Raglan inc r: Increase leaning right:

RS: (before m) pick up between 2 sts from behind using left needle and knit.

Raglan inc r p: Increase leaning right:

WS: (before m) pick up between 2 sts from the front using left needle and p tbl.

Raglan inc I: Increase leaning left:

RS: (after m) Pick up between 2 sts from the front using left needle and k tbl.

Raglan inc | p: Increase leaning left:

WS: (after m) Pick up between sts from behind using left needle and p.



Short rows and raglan increases:

- **1.** Row (RS): k13 (13) 14 (15) 15, inc r, k1 (raglan-st), inc l, k5 (7) 7 (7) 7, inc r, k1 (raglan-st), inc l, k2, turn, GSR.
- 2. Row (WS): P to start of the round, p13 (13) 14 (15) 15, inc r p, p1 (raglan-st), inc l p, p5 (7) 7 (7) 7, inc r p, p1 (raglan-st), inc l p, p2, turn, GSR.
- **3.** Row (RS):k to start of the round, k with inc as row 1 to 2 sts after the turn on row 1, turn, GSR
- **4.** Row (WS): P to start of the round, p with inc as row 2 to 2 sts after the turn on row 2, turn, GSR.
- **5.** Row (RS): K to start of the round, k with inc as row 1 to 2 sts after the turn on row 3, turn, GSR.
- **6.** Row (WS): P to start of the round, p with inc as row 2 to 2 sts after the turn on row 4, turn, GSR.
- **7.** Row (RS): K to start of the round, k with inc as row 1 to 2 sts after the turn on row 5, turn, GSR.
- **8.** Row (WS): P to start of the round, p with inc as row 2 to 2 sts after the turn on row 6, turn, GSR.
- **9.** Row (RS): K to start of the round, k with inc as row 1 to 2 sts after the turn on row 7, turn, GSR.
- **10.** Row (WS): P to start of the round, p with inc as row 2 to 2 sts after the turn on row 8, turn, GSR.
- 11. Row (RS): K to start of the round.

You've now turned 5 times on each side and knit 5 rows of raglan increases. Continue in the round in stockinette st and knit another 8 (6) 10 (11) 12 rounds of raglan increases = 13 (14) 15 (16) 17 rounds of raglan increases all in all.

The increases are made on every other round, finish on a round without increases = 170 (182) 194 (206) 214 sts on the round.

Now separate for sleeves like this:

Separate for sleeves

Knit to 1st sleeve-st and set aside the 31 (35) 37 (39) 41 sleeve-sts on a strand of leftover yarn. Cast on 5 new sts under the sleeve. Knit to next sleeve and do the same here = 118 (122) 130 (138) 142 sts on the needle.

Knit ½" (1 cm) of stockinette st and then switch to pattern.

Pattern:

- 1. Round: *k1, sl1p* repeat *_* to end of round.
- 2. Round: *p1, sl1p* repeat *_* to end of round.
- **3.** Round: k around.
- 4. Round: k around.

Knit until the pattern measures approx. 10" (11") 13" (15") 15½" or 26 (28) 33 (38) 40 cm, from the top of the shoulder and down and you are about to knit round 3 of the pattern. Cast off in ribbing, start with 1 p.

Sleeves

Place the 31 (35) 37 (39) 41 sleeve-sts on a needle no. 6 (4 mm) and cast on 5 new sts under the sleeve = 36 (40) 42 (44) 46 sts on the round.

Place a m on each side of the middle st, this now marks the start of the round.

Knit around in stockinette st until the work measures 1" (2 cm).

Now decrease for the first time like this:

k2tog, knit to last 3 sts, SKPO, k1 (the marked st).



Continue decreasing like this for all in all 2 (3) 3 (4) 4 times with $2\frac{1}{2}$ " (1.8") 2.2" (1.8") 2" or 6 (4,5) 5,5 (4,5) 5 cm space = 32 (34) 36 (36) 38 sts on round.

Knit until the sleeve measures 6½" (7") 8" (8½") 9½" or 16 (18) 20 (21) 24 cm.

Switch to needle 4 (3,5 mm) and knit ribbing (k1, p1) for 1" (2 cm). Now cast off in ribbing.

Knit the second sleeve just the same.

Seaming:

Weave in all ends and sew under the sleeves. Wash according to washing instructions on the yarn and lay flat to dry while stretching the grafted part a little so it opens up.
