## MATERIALS

1 skein Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col. 02  
1 skein Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col. 84  
1 skein Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col. 45  
1 skein Rainbow Cotton 8/8, col. 54

Crochet hook 4.0 mm (US G/6)  
Stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

 **Rainbow Cotton 8/8**, Hobbii  
100% Cotton/ 50 g (1.75 oz) = 75 meters (82 yds)

## ABBREVIATIONS

Double crochet = dc  
Slip stitch = sl st  
Chain = ch

## MEASUREMENTS

11 x 11 cm (4.3" x 4.3")

## PATTERN INFORMATION

From the Great Depression, to the hippie movement and recently on fashion runways, granny squares have always been around!

Because of their versatility and customization they can be turned into absolutely anything, from the traditional blanket, to summer tops, skirts, bags, cardigans, vests... Anything! You name it!

They are an excellent way to make use of your scrap yarn and experiment with color combinations but they are also easy to carry around with you! So what does a you-granny-square look like?

# Pattern



## SQUARE

Begin with a magic ring

All rounds begin with 1 sl st in the chain space, ch 4 = 1 dc + ch 1

All rounds end with 1 sl st in 3rd ch

**Round 1:** Ch 4, \* 3 dc in the ring, ch 2 \*, repeat \*-\* 3 times in total, 2 dc, join with 1 sl st in the 3rd ch, tighten the thread (= 4 groups of 3 dc)

**Round 2:** Ch 4, 2 dc in the chain space, 1 dc in each stitch across to the next chain space (corner space), \* (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in the corner space, 1 dc in each stitch across to the next chain space (corner space)\*, repeat \*-\* 3 times in total (= 3 corners), 1 dc in the last corner space, join with a sl st in the 3rd ch (= 4 corners)

**Round 3:** like round 2

**Round 4:** like round 2

**Round 5:** like round 2

## TRIANGLE

Begin with a magic ring

**Row 1:** Ch 4 (counts as dc + ch 1), 3 dc in the ring, ch 2, place a stitch marker in ch 2, 3 dc in the ring, ch 1, 1 dc in the ring, tighten the thread. Break the yarn.

Attach new yarn after each row and begin on the same side as on row 1.



**Row 2:** Ch 4, 2 dc, 1 dc in each st across to the stitch marker, (2 dc, ch 2, 2 dc) in same chain space, 1 dc in each st across to the chain space, (2 dc, ch 1, 1 dc) in the last chain space. Break the yarn.

**Row 3:** Repeat row 2.

**Row 4:** Repeat row 2.

**Row 5:** Repeat row 2.
