# **Easy Going**

**Blanket** 

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### **MATERIALS**

### Amigo XL (For the rows with bobbles)

Colors are listed in order according to appearance in the pattern:

- 2 skeins of color 40, rust
- 2 skeins of color 38, curry
- 2 skeins of color 35, primrose
- 2 skeins of color 46, light peach
- 2 skeins of color 45, bright orange
- 2 skeins of color 37, egg yolk
- 2 skeins of color 43, bright red
- 2 skeins of color 42, christmas red
- 2 skeins of color 47, delicate rose
- 2 skeins of color 57, light pink
- 2 skeins of color 49, vintage pink
- 2 skeins of color 54, pink
- 2 skeins of color 48, light lilac
- 2 skeins of color 52, dark magenta

## Amigo XL (For the rows in between bobbles):

Colors are listed in order according to appearance in the pattern:

- 1 skein of color 21, light turquoise
- 1 skein of color 33, neon green
- 1 skein of color 55, neon pink
- 1 skein of color 34, neon yellow
- 1 skein of color 44, neon coral

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8) Yarn needle Scissors

Tape measure

### YARN QUALITY

Amigo XL, Hobbii

100% Acrylic

50g(1.75oz) = 100m(109yds)

#### SIZE

One size

### **MEASUREMENTS**

Width: 115 cm / 45.3" Length: 108 cm / 42.5"

### **PATTERN INFORMATION**

This pattern has a lot of qualities - it's easy to crochet, it's a good stash buster, it's size is adaptable, no border is needed and you can choose to use as many colors as you wish or just one or two!

### **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm  $(4" \times 4")$  = 6 bobbles x 11 rows [6 bobble rows+5 ch-2 spaces rows]

### **ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = chain

st (s) = stitch (es)

sl st (s) = slip stitch (es)

sc = single crochet

DC = double crochet

bo = bobble stitch = find explanation with pictures at the end of the pattern.

yo = yarn over

F.O. = fasten off

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

### **INFO AND TIPS**

The foundation chain is made of a multiple of four chains plus five.

You alternate rows of bobbles with rows made of single crochet sts and ch-2 spaces.

You change color at the beginning of each row, so you work each row from the RS.

### **Fringes**

Remember to leave long tails, both at the beginning and at the end of each row as they will be crucial to make the fringes.

### **Color sequence**

You may follow the color sequence suggested in the yarn list. Please note that all the colors are listed from the first one to the last one used. You use fourteen colors for the bobble rows and five for the rows in between.

The bobble rows color sequence is repeated four times in total, so to have 56 rows of bobbles.

If you choose to select just a couple of colors for your blanket you still need five skeins of yarn for the in-between rows, while for the bobble rows you will need a total of 20 skeins in the same shade.



### GUIDE: HOW TO MAKE THE BOBBLE STITCH [bo]

Wrap the yarn around the hook, insert hook under the ch-2 space, wrap yarn again, pull to the front, wrap yarn, draw through two loops. Repeat four more times, so to have six loops on your hook, wrap yarn again, pull through all six loops and you have a bobble.

After completing a bobble, always chain one.

(Look at the pictures, from right to left)

### **BLANKET**

Using a 5mm hook with light turquoise work a foundation chain of 205 chains.

When working the ch-2 spaces rows, use the same ball of yarn until you have enough to complete the last row possible in that color. After that, start to use a new shade.

**Row 1 (RS):** insert hook in 6th chain from hook, where you work your first sc, then repeat (2ch, skip two chains, 1sc in next chain) to the end and F.O. [67 ch-2 spaces]

**Row 2:** join new color (rust) with a sl st in first ch-2 space, 2ch, 1bo in same space, 1ch, repeat (1bo in next ch-2 space, 1ch) to the end, 1DC on top of last sc of previous row, F.O. [67 bobbles]

**Row 3:** make a slip knot on your hook with light turquoise, insert hook in space between initial 2ch and first bobble of previous row and work your first sc, repeat (2ch, skip bobble, 1sc in ch-1 space between bobbles) to the end, working the last sc on the top of last DC of previous row, F.O. [67 ch-2 spaces]

**Row 4:** join new color (curry) with a sl st in first ch-2 space, 2ch, 1bo in same space, 1ch, repeat (1bo in next ch-2 space, 1ch) to the end, 1DC on top of last sc of previous row, F.O. [67 bobbles]



### Repeat Rows 3-4 to the desired length

My blanket is made of 56 rows of bobbles plus 57 ch-2 spaces rows.

The last row of the blanket (= Row 113, blanket top) is a ch-2 space row.







### **FRINGES**

You simply need to knot the tails together, two by two, first on one side, then on the other. You will notice that on the right side of the blanket, both the first and the last tails of this side will not form a couple to knot with - just trim them to the same length as the other fringes and your job is done!

After the knotting is completed, trim the fringes to have 5cm length (measured starting from the knot end).





The blanket is done.

If needed, steam the whole blanket to give it a neat finish.
