MATERIALS

Rainbow Cotton 8/8

- 1 Nude (col. 03) x 4 skeins
- 2 Green (col. 022) x 1 skein
- 3 Yellow (col. 090) x 1 skein
- 4 Purple (col. 039) x 1 skein
- 5 Red (col. 059) x 1 skein
- 6 Orange (col. 066) x 1 skein

Crochet hook 3.5 mm (US E-4)

Tapestry needle

Scissors

Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Rainbow Cotton 8/8**, Hobbii

100 % Cotton

50 g = 75 m (82 yds)

GAUGE

DC = 16 sts x 8 rows = 4" x 4" (10cm x 10cm)

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain

sc = single crochet

dc = double crochet

5cl = cluster stitch made up of 5 double
crochet stitches in same st

sp sc = spike single crochet

sk = skip

rep = repeat

ch sp = chain space

SIZE

One size (Customizable)

MEASUREMENTS

Panels:

12.5" Length x 10.5" Height (32cm x 27cm)

Straps:

15" Length x 1.75" Width (38cm x 4.5cm)

This adorable tote is made using the popular tulip stitch. It works up quickly and can easily be customised to fit your needs.

INFO AND TIPS

- CH-3 at the beginning counts as the first ST. CH-1 at beginning never counts as a ST. CH-1 in-between V stitch counts as a ST. CH-2 after CL counts as a ST.
- Change colours on the last ST of the row by pulling through your next colour on the last YO.
- **Customize:** To make larger or smaller, adjust in multiples of 4 stitches minus 1 at the end. (I.E. 43, 39, 35, etc). Plus CH-3 for your turning chain. (46, 42, 38, etc).
- You can either fasten off each colour or carry up only colour A. We'll be crocheting around the post when you seam it together so the ends will be mostly hidden when you join the two panels together.

BODY

Start with Colour 1.

Row 1: CH-43 + 3 for turning chain. Work in fourth CH from hook. 43 DC across. TURN. (44)

Row 2: CH-1. 44 DC across. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 2.

Row 3: CH-1. 1 DC. *(In the next ST, 1 DC, CH-1, 1 DC. SK-2). Rep from *() until the last ST. 1 DC. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 3.

Row 4: CH-1. 2 DC across. 5CL in CH-1 SP, CH-2. *(In next CH-1 SP, 5CL, CH-2). REP from *() across ending with a 5CL in the last CH-1 SP. Do not CH-2, DC in the last 2 STS. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 1.

Rows 5 - 6: CH-1. 44 DC across. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 2.

Row 7: CH-1. 1 DC. *(In the next ST, 1 DC, CH-1, 1 DC. SK-2). Rep from *() until the last ST. 1 DC. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 4.

Row 8: CH-1. 2 DC across. 5CL in CH-1 SP, CH-2. *(In next CH-1 SP, 5CL, CH-2). REP from *() across ending with a 5CL in the last CH-1 SP. Do not CH-2. SK-1, DC in the last 2 STS. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 1.

Rows 9 - 10: CH-1. 44 DC across. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 2.

Row 11: CH-1. 1 DC. *(In the next ST, 1 DC, CH-1, 1 DC. SK-2). Rep from *() until the last ST. 1 DC. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 5.

Row 12: CH-1. 2 DC across. 5CL in CH-1 SP, CH-2. *(In next CH-1 SP, 5CL, CH-2). REP from *() across ending with a 5CL in the last CH-1 SP. DC in the last 2 STS. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 1.

Rows 13 - 14: CH-1. 44 DC across. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 2.

Row 15: CH-1. 1 DC. *(In the next ST, 1 DC, CH-1, 1 DC. SK-2). Rep from *() until the last ST. 1 DC. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 6.

Row 16: CH-1. 2 DC across. 5CL in CH-1 SP, CH-2. *(In next CH-1 SP, 5CL, CH-2). REP from *() across ending with a 5CL in the last CH-1 SP. DC in the last 2 STS. TURN. (44)

Change to Colour 1.

Rows 17 - 18: CH-1. 44 DC across. TURN. (44)

REP Rows 3 - 10 until you have 26 rows total or until your desired height if customising,

Fasten off and sew in loose ends.

TIP: I double knot my tulips and stem tails as I plan to hide them with an SC when I join the two panels!

Repeat this process one more time for two panels total.



JOIN

Join your two panels together with their wrong sides facing each other. The wrong side is the wrong side of your cluster stitches. The right side is shown in the photo above.

Starting in the top left corner of your panel you'll work down the side.

With Colour 1, insert your hook through both layers in the last DC. CH-1, 2 SC in first row. 2 SC in each DC row across until the corner bottom corner.

3 SC in the corner, TURN your work 90 degrees. Work 1 SC in each ST across the bottom until the next corner. 3 SC in the next corner.

TURN your work 90 degrees again. 2 SC in each DC row across until the end.

Do not fasten off.

STRAPS

You don't have to Spike SC and can just SC across, but using a spike SC will help prevent some stretch that occurs with use. Always make your straps slightly smaller if using stitches that will stretch or reinforce your straps with elastic or sew on a stiffer fabric lining.

You can adjust the placement of the straps to be farther from the edge if you prefer your bag to open more freely. You can also adjust the total width of the strap by removing stitches.

Strap 1

Continue where you didn't fasten off, continue with Colour 1.

Row 1 (RS): CH-1. SC in the top of the first DC. Tightly SC 5 more across. TURN.

Row 2 (WS): CH-1. Tightly SC 6 across. TURN.

Row 3 (RS): CH-1. Tightly SP SC 6 across to the SC row below. TURN.

REP Rows 2-3 until you reach 90 Rows or 15" (31cm x 31cm) ending with Row 2.

Without twisting your strap, SL ST to the other side of the same panel. Fasten off and use the tail to reinforce the SL ST to help prevent stretching.



Strap 2

This strap is optional. If you prefer your bag to open more freely, stick with one strap. If you want a sturdier bag, opt for two straps.

Repeat the above with a slip knot on your hook and work in the top right of your second panel
