# **Crayon**

## **Scarf**

## MATERIALS


Main color: 2 skeins of Amigo XL, Dark Blue Melange (A15)

1 skein of Amigo XL in the following colors:

Titanium (07)  
Cornflower (A17)  
Sunflower (A36)  
Emerald Green (A31)  
Bright Orange (A45)  
Christmas Red (A42)  
Petunia Pink (A56)  
Lavender (A59)

Crochet hook 6 mm

## YARN QUALITY

 **Amigo XL**, Hobbii  
100% HB acrylic  
50 g (1.8 oz)  
100 m (109 yds)

## GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 12 sts x 16 rows

## ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain  
sc = single crochet  
hdc = half double crochet  
dc = double crochet  
ss = slip stitch

## SIZE

One size

## MEASUREMENTS

Width: 22 cm / 9"  
Length: 194 cm / 76"

## PATTERN INFORMATION

A simple and fun crochet granny square scarf. You will be composing the colors in each square to your own liking.

Measurements are for a scarf made from 9 squares, but you can make up to 16 squares.

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

Making granny squares is a crochet classic. This scarf is made of 9 squares, but you can make it wider and as long as you like!

## BASIC GRANNY SQUARE

Each granny is made of 6 rounds using 6 colors. Mix the colors as you prefer, but make sure to always make round 6 in the main color.

Make the First Square as follows:

Ch4, join it into a circle with Ss.

Round 1: ch3 (counts as 1dc), 2dc, 2ch, 3dc, 2ch, 3dc, 2ch, 3dc, 2ch, Ss into the 3<sup>rd</sup> chain to close the round, fasten off.

Round 2: ch3 (counts as 1dc), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the 2ch spaces from Round 2, this completes the first corner, \*3dc, ch2, 3dc\* into the other 3 corners, Ss. Fasten off.

Round 3: ch3 (counts as 1dc), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the corner spaces. \*3dc into the next gap between trebles, (3dc, 2ch, 3dc) into the next corner space\* 3 more times, last 3dc, Ss. Fasten off.

Round 4: ch3 (counts as 1dc), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the corner spaces. \*3dc into the next 2 gaps between trebles, (3dc, 2ch, 3dc) into the next corner space\* 3 more times, 3dcx2 to complete the round, Ss. Fasten off.

Round 5: ch3 (counts as 1dc), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the corner spaces. \*3dc into the next 3 gaps between trebles, (3dc, 2ch, 3dc) into the next corner space\* 3 more times, 3dcx3 to complete the round, Ss. Fasten off.

Round 6: *With main color.* ch3 (counts as 1dc), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the corner spaces. \*3dc into the next 4 gaps between trebles, (3dc, 2ch, 3dc) into the next corner space\* 3 more times, 3dcx4 to complete the round, Ss. Fasten off.

This completes the basic granny square, sew in all the ends.

For all following squares:

Make Rows 1-5 as above and then join each square “as you go” to the previous one during Row 6. The first square you made will now be called “Square 1” and the square you are currently crocheting will be called “Square 2”.

Round 6: change colour to the main finishing colour. ch3 (counts as 1tr), (2dc, 2ch, 3dc) into one of the corner spaces. 3dc into the next 4 gaps between trebles, (3dc, 2ch, 3dc) into the next corner space, 3dc into the next 4 gaps between trebles, 3dc into the next corner space.

### **JOINING THE GRANNY SQUARES “AS YOU GO”**

Lay both granny squares next to each other right side up with their corners lined up.

- Crochet 1sc into the 2ch space into one of the corners of Square 1.
- Crochet 3dc back into the corner you were working on, on Square 2 to finish the corner.
- \*Go back to Square 1 and crochet 1sc into the next gap along between 3dc’s.
- Crochet 3dc into the next gap on Square 2.\* Repeat \*-\* 4 more times
- 1sc into the corner 2ch on Square 1, 3dc into the corner of Square 2 then 3trx4 to complete the round, Ss.
- Fasten off.

### **FINISHING**

Sew in all the ends.

Once you have made the scarf to the length you like, take the main colour and hdc into each stitch all the way around on the wrong side. Fasten off, sew in ends.

Optional finishing: Spray your scarf with a light mist of water and then gently iron the scarf protected between 2 tea towels on the least hot setting.
