MATERIALS

Amigo Chunky Yarn A: 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (2) 2 skein(s) of Peacock A23 Yarn B: 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (2) 2 skein(s) of Lavender A59 Yarn C: 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (2) 2 skein(s) of Vintage Pink A56 Yarn D: 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (2) 2 skein(s) of Mint A29 Yarn E: 1 skein of Egg Yolk A37 Yarn F: 2 (2) 2 (2) 3 (3) 3 skeins of Cornflower A17

Crochet hook 8 mm (US L) Scissors Needle Tape Measure

YARN QUALITY

Amigo Chunky, Hobbii
 100% HB Acrylic
 100 g (3.5 oz) = 100 m (109 yds)

GAUGE 10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 8 DC sts x 5 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain sc = single crochet st = stitch dc = double crochet fpdc = front post double crochet bpdc = back post double crochet Dc2tog = double crochet 2 sts together fo = fasten off sl st = slip stitch rs = right side ws = wrong side

SIZE

0-6 months (6-12 months) 1-2 years (3-4 years) 5-6 years (7-8 years) 9-10 years

MEASUREMENTS

PATTERN INFORMATION

This pattern is for a brightly colored chunky children's patchwork sweater in different colored patches. It works up very quickly and is a nice snuggly addition to your little one's winter wardrobe. The sleeves are slightly oversized for a puffy look, but with a tight cuff at the end.

INFO AND TIPS

Your first patch will count as your tension square, so make sure this is measuring as expected. You may wish to adjust your hook size or tension if not. 2 patches side by side will make up the width, and 2 patches on top of eachother plus the bottom ribbing will make the length. Then one large patch (equivalent to 4 body patches) will be turned into the sleeve.

PATCHES

You will need to make 8 patches for the body of the sweater. I've chosen to make mine using Yarn A X 2, B X 2, C X 2, D X 2, then use a 5th color for the sleeves and a 6th color for the cuffs, neckband and ribbing. You can use any color combo you want - the brighter the better!

Row 1: Using color A, chain 12/13/14/15/16/17/18 and then DC in the second CH from the hook, and DC in each st to the end, then turn. St count 11/12/13/14/15/16/17 Row 2: Ch2 (this will count as your first st) and DC in each st until the end, turn. St count 11/12/13/14/15/16/17

Row 3: Repeat row 2 until your square is 14/15/16/17/19/20/22 cm / 5.5/6/6.3/6.7/7.5/7.9/8.7 inches. Leave a long tail for sewing.

Repeat this again in color A, and twice for colors B, C and D so you have 8 patches.





SEW TOGETHER

Once you have completed all 8 patches, lay them out to select your color order, then take 2 at a time and sew them together by holding them with both right sides facing each other (so you can see the wrong side) and use the tail from one of the patches to sew them together through the back loops only, so when they are turned right side out you can't see the join. Now take your third patch, check which one you want to sew it to, line up those 2 sides with right sides facing each other, and repeat the process. Finally sew your 4th patch on along both sides to close the gap.

Repeat this entire process again for the second panel.

Once you have 2 panels, put them right sides facing together and sew the shoulders across a few centimeters on each side, leaving an approximate head hole of 17/18/20/21/23/24/25 cm / 6.7/7.1/20/7.9/9/9.5/9.8 inches in the middle.

SLEEVES

Row 1: Take color E and chain 19/21/23/25/27/29/31 and then DC in the second CH from the hook, and DC in each st to the end, then turn. St count 18/20/22/24/26/28/30 Row 2: Ch2 (this will count as your first st) and DC in each st until the end, turn. St count 18/20/22/24/26/28/30 Row 3: Continue with Row 2 until your patch measures 17/19/21/23/27/31/33 cm / 6.7/7.5/8.3/9/10.6/12.2/13 inches in height. Do not fasten off. Cuff 1: Ch2, DC2tog, DC in each st until the last 2, DC2tog, turn Cuff 2: Repeat Cuff 1 Cuff 3: Repeat Cuff 1 then fasten off leaving a nice long tail. Trim: Using color F attach your yarn where you just fastened off, and ch2. DC in each st until the end, and turn. Trim 2: Ch1, sc in each st until the end and fasten off leaving a small tail.

Repeat to make another identical sleeve.

Fold your sleeve in half with the wrong side facing out. Use the tails you left to sew up the cuff then sleeve, and once you reach the arm hole use the remainder of the tail to sew the sleeve to the main body. It should line up with the top patch. Once it's sewn on, sew down the remainder of the body panel.

Repeat this for the other sleeve.

WAISTBAND

Row 1: Attach yarn F in any stitch at the bottom, RS facing out, ch2. Dc in each st around and sl st to ch2 to join. Do not turn.

Row 2: Ch1, sc in each st and sl st into ch1 to join. Fasten off.

NECKBAND

Row 1: With RS facing out, attach yarn F in any stitch on the back of the neckline, and ch2. Dc in each st around and sl st to ch2 to join. Do not turn. Row 2: Ch2, FPDC in the first st, BPDC in the second, alternate these in each st to end. FO.
