MATERIALS

4 (5) 5 (6) skeins of Divina, color 27 3 (4) 4 (5) skeins of Alpaca Blaze, color 24 3 (4) 4 (5) skeins of Alpaca Blaze, color 25

Circular needle 6.5 mm (US 10.5), 100 cm (39.3") Circular needle 8 mm (US 11), 100 cm (39.3")

Stitch marker Needle

YARN QUALITY

Divina, Hobbii
65% Baby Alpaca, 25% Polyamide 10%
Merino Wool
50 g (1.75 oz) = 150 m (164 yds)

Alpaca Blaze, Hobbii

40% Acrylic, 30% Alpaca, 30% Polyamide 25 g (0.9 oz) = 225 m (246 yds)

GAUGE 10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 10 sts x 16 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

K = knit P = Purl Sl1 K1 PSSO = Slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass over slipped st K2tog = knit 2 together P2tog = purl 2 together BO = Bind off Sts = sts SM = stitch marker(s) k1 f&b = (1 increase) Knit a stitch, leaving stitch on left needle; knit into the back loop of this stitch.

XS (S) M (L)

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 50 (52) 54 (56) cm / 19.6 (20.4) 21.3 (22) inches Length: 55 (60) 64 (68) cm / 21.6 (23.6) 25.2 (26.7) inches

PATTERN INFORMATION

This super soft sweater is knitted in the round and divided by the sleeves. It is an easy go-to project perfect for those who prefer a quick and classic project. Knitted with 3 strands of yarn held together.

INFO AND TIPS

Do a gauge swatch before knitting your sweater. Change your needle size if the gauge does not match.

The pattern will start with the bodice worked in the round from bottom to top method. From the underarm you will work first on the back panel, then the front panels. Sleeves will be done by picking up sts and knitting top-down in the round. Mark your sides and center and keep count of your rounds/rows as you knit.

BODY

Rib edge

With needle 6.5 mm (US 10.5) cast on 100 (104) 108 (112) sts with 3 strands of yarn held together (one of each).

Place 2 markers to divide the front and back panel: 50 (52) 54 (56) sts for the back and 50 (52) 54 (56) sts for the front.

Knit 10 rounds of rib (1k, 1p)

Switch to needle 8 mm (US 10.5)

Do one round of increases: *K 4, k1 f&b, K until last 4 sts before the marker, k1 f&b, K 4*. Repeat *-* throughout the round. = 104 (108) 112 (116) sts on the needle

Work approx. 38 (42) 44 (48) rounds of stockinette st until the work measures from the rib edge: 32 (35) 37 (40) cm / 12.6" (13.8") 14.6" (15.7") *or desired length*



Dividing for back and front

K until 2 sts left before the first SM, BO 2 sts, remove the SM, BO 2 sts, K until 2 sts left before the second SM, BO 2 sts, remove the SM, BO 2 sts = 48 (50) 52 (54) sts on each side. Transfer the front panel to another needle while you work on the back panel.

BACK PANEL

From the wrong side

Row 1: P all Row 2: K 2, Sl1 K1 PSSO, K until last 4 sts, K2tog, K2 Row 3: P all Row 4: K 2, Sl1 K1 PSSO, K until last 4 sts, K2tog, K2 Row 5: P all

= 44 (46) 48 (50) sts

Work approx. 28 (30) 32 (34) rows of stockinette sts until the work measures from the armhole: 23 (25) 27 (28) cm / 9" (9.8") 10.6" (11")

Shoulder shaping

Both sides simultaneously

Row 1: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 2: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 3:BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 4: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 5: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 6: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 7: BO 4 (5) 5 (5) sts, K until end of row Row 8: BO 4 (5) 5 (5) sts purlwise, P until end of row

Transfer the remaining 12 (12) 14 (16) sts to another needle while working on the front panel.

FRONT PANEL

Transfer your 48 (50) 52 (54) sts to your working needle.

Start on the wrong side. Purl the row

Armhole Shaping, right and left side

Row 1: K 2, Sl 1 K1 PSSO, K until last 4 sts, K2tog, K 2 Row 2: P all Row 3: K 2, Sl 1 K1 PSSO, K until last 4 sts, K2tog, K 2 Row 4: P all Row 5: K all



= 44 (46) 48 (50) sts left on the needle

V-Neckline, Right Panel

P 22 (23) 24 (25) sts and transfer the rest of the stitches to another needle while you work on the right panel.

From the right side Row 1: K 2 , Sl 1 K1 PSSO, K until end of row Row 2: P

Repeat Row 1+2 another 5 (5) 6 (7) times = 16 (17) 17 (17) sts left on the needle. K 16 rows of stockinette sts



Shoulders shaping, Right Panel

From the wrong side Row 1: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 2: K all Row 3: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 4: K all Row 5: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts purlwise, P until end of row Row 6: K all Row 7: BO 4 (5) 5 (5) sts purlwise

= 0 sts left on the needle

V-Neckline, Left Panel

Transfer the 22 (23) 24 (25) sts from the left panel to your working needle.

Start on the wrong side. Purl the row.

From the right side Row 1: K until last 4 sts, K2tog, K 2 Row 2: P Repeat Row 1+2 another 5 (5) 6 (7) times = 16 (17) 17 (17) sts left on the needle. K 16 rows of stockinette st.



Shoulders shaping, Left Panel

From the right side Row 1: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 2: P all Row 3: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 4: P all Row 5: BO 4 (4) 4 (4) sts, K until end of row Row 6: P all Row 7: BO 4 (5) 5 (5) sts

= 0 sts left on the needle

Sew the shoulders together.

COLLAR

Put the 12 (12) 14 (16) back on the needle and pick up 46 (48) 50 (52) sts only around the v neck area with a 6,5 mm needle. Place a SM in the middle of the neck (your round begins here) and another SM to mark the center of the front. Work rib (1K, 1P) in the round.

Round 1: Rib Round 2: Rib Round 3: Rib until 3 sts before the center front marker, P2tog, K2tog (this will now be your center), P2tog, rib till end of round Round 4: Rib Round 5: Rib until 2 sts before the center front marker, P2tog, K, P2tog, rib till end of round Round 6: Rib

BO loosely or use an elastic cast off method



Working the v-neck rib

SLEEVES

Pick up 52 (56) 60 (64) sts around the armhole with the 8mm circular needle.



Knit in stockinette sts in the round until the sleeve reaches your desired length

Rib edge

With needle 6.5 mm *K2tog, P2tog* repeat until end of round = 26 (28) 30 (32) sts on the needle

K 10 rounds of rib sts BO loosely or use an elastic cast off method

FINISHING

To finish your garment, weave in all loose ends. Gently hand wash and leave flat to dry or block.
