# Mixtape

**Children's Sweater**

### **MATERIALS**

5 (6) 6 (7) 8 skeins of Amigo XL Melange color 03

Crochet hook 4 mm (G/6) Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)

### YARN QUALITY

Amigo XL Melange, Hobbii 100% HB acrylic 50 g (1.8 oz) = 100 m (109 yds)

### **GAUGE**

10 cm x 10 cm (4'' x 4'') = 14 hdc x 10 rows

### **ABBREVIATIONS**

ch = chain
sc = single crochet
ss = slip stitch
st(s) = stitch(es)
hdc = half double crochet
hdc2tog = hdc the next 2 stitches together
dc = double crochet
bpdc = back post double crochet
fpdc = front post double crochet
fo = fasten off
rs = right side

### SIZE

1-2 years (3-4 years) 5-6 years (7-8 years) 9-10 years

### **MEASUREMENTS**

Width: 33 (35) 38 (40) 43 cm / 13" (14") 15" (16") 17" Length: 36 (40) 42 (44) 46 cm / 14" (16") 16.5" (18") 18.5"

# **Pattern**







### **INFO AND TIPS**

The body is worked in rounds and turned at the end of each round. You then split your front and back panels and work in rows.

I do not join my starting chain as I find it too fiddly. I join after my first round and use my yarn tail to close the gap.

If you struggle to find your HDC stitches in the round, you can work in un-joined rows instead and seam your side and sleeves.

Your turning CH counts as a ST throughout.

## **MAIN BODY**

With smaller hook, CH 94 (100) 108 (114) 122.

Round 1: DC in fourth CH from hook and each CH along. SS to starting CH to join. Do not turn.

Round 2: CH2, \*FPDC, BPDC\* around. SS to CH2 to join. Do not turn.

Round 3: Repeat row 2.

Change to larger hook.

Round 4: CH2. HDC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH2 to join, turn. A total of 92 (98) 106 (112) 120 STS.

Repeat round 4 until you have a total of 20 (22) 24 (24) 26 rounds of HDC then move on to back panel instructions.

### **BACK PANEL**

Row 1: CH2, HDC in the next 45 (48) 52 (55) 59 STS. Turn.

Row 2: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row. Turn. A total of 46 (49) 53 (56) 60 STS.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 12 (14) 14 (16) 16 rows in this section. FO and weave in your ends.

### **FRONT PANEL**

Join yarn in your first unworked ST next to the back panel.

Row 1: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row. Turn. A total of 46 (49) 53 (56) 60 STS. Turn.



Row 2: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row. Turn.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 9 (11) 11 (13) 13 rows in this section then move on to neckline one.

### **Neckline one**

Row 1: CH2, HDC in the next 15 (16) 17 (18) 19 STS. Turn. A total of 16 (17) 18 (19) 20 STS.

Row 2: CH2, HDC2TOG, HDC in each remaining ST from the previous row. Turn.

Row 3: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row until 3 STS remain. HDC2TOG, HDC in the final ST. Turn.

Row 4: Turn your work inside out, CH1, and seam your shoulders by placing a SC through the next 14 (15) 16 (17) 18 STS on both your front and back panels. FO and weave in your ends.

### **Neckline two**

Count 14 (15) 17 (18) 20 STS from neckline one and join your yarn in the next ST.

Row 1: CH2, HDC in each remaining ST from the previous row. Turn. A total of 16 (17) 18 (19) 20 STS.

Row 2: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row until 3 STS remain. HDC2TOG, HDC in the final ST. Turn.

Row 3: CH2, HDC2TOG, HDC in each remaining ST from the previous row.

Row 4: Turn your work inside out, CH1, and seam your shoulders by placing a SC through the next 14 (15) 16 (17) 18 STS on both your front and back panels. FO and weave in your ends.

### **SLEEVES**

With RS facing, join your yarn in either row end at the bottom of your armhole.

Round 1: CH2, \*HDC in next row end, 2HDC in next row end\* around the entire armhole. SS to CH2 to join. Turn. A total of 36 (42) 42 (48) 48 STS.

Round 2: CH2, HDC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH2 to join, turn.

Round 3: CH2, HDC2TOG, HDC in each remaining ST from the previous row. SS to CH2 to join, turn.

Repeat round 3 until you have a total of 21 (23) 25 (28) 30 rounds, or until your sleeve is 4cm short of the desired length. Stop decreasing when your sleeve reaches your desired width. I made size 3-4 years and stopped decreasing after 21 rows.

Cuff round 1: With smaller hook, CH2. DC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH2 to join, do not turn.

Cuff round 2: CH2, \*FPDC, BPDC\* around. SS to CH2 to join, do not turn.

Cuff round 3: Repeat cuff round 2.

Cuff round 4: CH1, loosely SC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH1 to join, FO and weave in your ends.

Repeat for second sleeve.

### **Neckline edging**

With smaller hook and RS facing, join your yarn in any ST at the back of the neckline. Round 1: CH2, DC in each ST along the back of the neckline. \*DC in next row end, 2DC in next row end\* along the edge of the neckline rows. DC in each ST along the front of the



neckline, then repeat as before for the second group of neckline rows. DC in each ST until you reach your CH2. SS to CH2 to join, do not turn.

Round 2: CH2, \*FPDC, BPDC\* around the neckline. SS to CH2 to join. Do not turn.

Round 3: CH1, loosely SC in each ST from the previous row. SS to CH1 to join, FO and weave in your ends.
