# **Rainbow Contrast**

## **Cardigan**

## MATERIALS

### Kind Feather

MC: 6 (6) 7 (7) 8 (9) 10 (10) 11 skeins of color 30

CC1: 1 skein of color 11

CC2: 1 skein of color 13

CC3: 1 skein of color 15

CC4: 1 skein of color 22

CC5: 1 skein of color 05

CC6: 1 skein of color 06

CC7: 1 skein of color 07

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)

Stitch markers

6 wooden buttons "Rainbow" D15mm

## YARN QUALITY

 **Kind Feather**, Hobbii

100 % Acrylic

100 g (3.5 oz) = 235 m (257 yds)

## GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 16 DC x 8 rows

## ABBREVIATIONS

CH = chain

DC = double crochet

DC2TOG = double crochet 2 STS together

FO = fasten off

MC = main color

CC = contrast colour

RS = right side

SC = single crochet

SS = slip stitch

ST = stitch/es

SK = skip

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

Your body is worked in long rows and turned at the end of each row. You then split the body into front and back panels.

**Your turning CH counts as a ST throughout.**

## MAIN BODY

With smaller hook CH 146 (162) 178 (194) 210 (226) 242 (258) 274.

Row 1: DC in fourth CH from hook and each CH along. Turn.

Row 2: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row, turn. A total of 144 (160) 176 (192) 208 (224) 240 (256) 272 STS.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 22 (22) 20 (18) 18 (20) 20 (20) 18 rows including row 1. At the end of your final row turn and move on to front panel one.

## FRONT PANEL ONE

Row 1: CH3, DC in next 31 (35) 39 (43) 47 (51) 55 (59) 63 STS, turn.

Row 2: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row, turn. A total of 32 (36) 40 (44) 48 (52) 56 (60) 64 STS.

Row 3: CH3, DC2TOG, DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. Turn.

Row 4: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row until 3 STS remain. DC2TOG, DC in the final ST. Turn.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until you have a total of 14 (14) 16 (18) 18 (20) 20 (20) 22 front panel rows and a total of 20 (24) 26 (28) 32 (34) 38 (42) 44 STS. FO leaving a long tail for seaming.

## BACK PANEL

Join your yarn in your first unworked ST next to front panel one.

Row 1: CH3, DC in the next 79 (87) 95 (103) 111 (119) 127 (135) 143 STS. Turn.

Row 2: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row, turn. A total of 80 (88) 96 (104) 112 (120) 128 (136) 144 STS.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 14 (14) 16 (18) 18 (20) 20 (20) 22 rows. FO and weave in your ends.

## FRONT PANEL TWO

Join your yarn in your first unworked ST next to the back panel.

Row 1: CH3, DC in each remaining ST. Turn.

Row 2: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row. Turn. A total of 32 (36) 40 (44) 48 (52) 56 (60) 64 STS.

Row 3: CH3, DC in each ST from the previous row until 3 STS remain. DC2TOG, DC in final ST. Turn.

Row 4: CH3, DC2TOG, DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. Turn.

Repeat rows 3 and 4 until you have a total of 14 (14) 16 (18) 18 (20) 20 (20) 22 front panel rows and a total of 20 (24) 26 (28) 32 (34) 38 (42) 44 STS. FO leaving a long tail for seaming.

## Seaming

Seam your shoulders using your long yarn tails.

## SLEEVES

Join your yarn in either underarm row end.

Row 1: CH3, DC in row end at base of CH. 2DC in each row end around the sleeve edge. SS to CH3 to join, turn. A total of 56 (56) 64 (72) 72 (80) 80 (80) 88 STS.

Row 2: CH3, DC2TOG. DC in each remaining ST from the previous row. SS to CH3 to join, turn.

Repeat row 2 until you have a total of 30 rows or until 5cm / 2 inches short of desired length. If you think your sleeve is getting too tight, continue working without the decrease at the beginning of each row.

At the end of your final row, SS to CH3 to join and FO.

Change to larger hook.

Cuff row 1: Join CC1 in any ST and CH1. SC in each ST from the previous row, SS to CH1 to join, FO.

Repeat cuff row 1 using CC2 to CC7.

**Repeat sleeve for the second side.**

## EDGING

With larger hook and RS of the back panel facing, join CC1 in any ST at the bottom hem.

Round 1: CH1, SC in each ST along the bottom of your piece. Work 3SC in the final ST before you reach your front edge and place a marker in the second of these SC. Continue to work along the front of your cardi by placing 2SC in each row end along the front edge. SC in each ST at the back of the neckline, then 2SC along the other front edge. Work 3SC in the first ST at the bottom edge and place a marker in the second of these SC. SC along the hem until you reach your first ST. SS to CH1 to join and FO.

Round 2: Join CC2 and CH1. SC in each ST from the previous round until you reach your marked ST. Work 3SC in the marked ST and move marker to the second of these SC.

Continue around and then repeat for second marked ST. SS to CH1 to join. FO.

Round 3: Repeat round 2 with CC3.

Round 4: Join CC4 and CH1. SC in each ST from the previous round until you reach your first marked ST. Work 3SC in the marked ST and move marker to the second of these SC. SC in the next 2 ST, then \*CH1, SK 1 ST, SC in the next 6 ST\* 6 times to create buttonholes.

Continue to SC in each ST until you reach your second marked ST. Work 3SC in the marked ST and move your marker to the second of these SC. SC around until you reach your CH1. SS to CH1 to join. FO.

Rounds 5-7: Repeat round 2 with CC5, CC6 and CC7 respectively.

Sew your buttons on, making sure they're level with the holes you created.

Weave in all your ends and you're done!
