



CROCHET PATTERN

Filet-O-Yarn

Scarf

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MATERIALS

Rainbow Bamboo

- 2 skeins of color 37/ Deep Teal as **yarn A**
- 1 skein of color 03/Almond as **yarn B**
- 1 skein of color 20/Curry as **yarn C**
- 1 skein of color 27/Baby Pink as **yarn D**
- 1 skein of color 12/Arctic Blue as **yarn E**

Crochet hook 3,5 mm (US E-4)
Stitch markers
Yarn needle
Tape measure
Scissors

YARN QUALITY

 **Rainbow Bamboo**, Hobbii
60% Bamboo viscose, 40% Cotton
100 g = 250 m

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 22 sts x 19 rows,
being aware that 10 rows are worked in sc
sts and 9 rows are worked in DC sts

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
st (s) = stitch (es)
sl st (s) = slip stitch (es)
sc = single crochet
DC = double crochet
yo = yarn over
F.O. = fasten off
RS = right side
WS = wrong side
prev = previous
rep = repeat/repetition

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 23 cm / 9.1"
Length: 180 cm / 71" [without fringes]

PATTERN INFORMATION

This scarf is a simple make, which alternates strips of single crochet stitches with strips of filet. It's an eye-catching accessory with a lovely drape and nice to wear on various occasions!

INFO AND TIPS

The beauty of this pattern is that you can change both length and width to your liking and requirements.

The stitches used are basic ones as single crochet and double crochet but interspersed to give an interesting texture and design. Even the color choices are relevant in order to highlight the simple filet crochet strips. I suggest you try even the following palette: Deep Teal as main color and Almond, Arctic Blue, Baby Pink and Curry.

This long version of the scarf is suitable to wear wrapped twice around your neck or as a wrap around your shoulders.

I'm aware that the long foundation chain can be discouraging, but you can substitute it by working a chainless foundation single crochet row, instead. You can find good video tutorials on the internet if interested.

As the scarf is completed with no kind of edging, if possible, while working into the chains of the foundation row, try to insert the hook not only in the center of the chain but even under the bump, too, so as to have a neat edge.

The turning chains at the beginning of each row are never considered as stitches.

PATTERN

Using a 3,5mm hook and **yarn A**, work 404 chains [foundation chain].
I put stitch markers every 10-20 chains to keep track of the number of sts!

Row 1 (RS): insert hook in 2nd chain from hook, yo and crochet your first sc, sc in each chain, turn. [403 sc]

Row 2 (WS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, sc to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 3-4: as Row 2

Row 5 (RS): as Row 2, fasten off. [403 sc]



Join **yarn B** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 5, RS facing you.

Filet pattern follows:

Row 6 (RS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, 1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [101 ch-1 spaces, 102DC]

Row 7 (WS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 8-9: as Row 7

Row 10 (RS): as Row 7, fasten off.

In the picture below, you can see the first three rows of the filet pattern (RS facing):



Join **yarn A** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 10, RS facing you.

Row 11 (RS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, *1sc in next ch-1 space, 1sc in next DC top; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [403 sc]

Row 12 (WS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, sc to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 13-14: as Row 12

Row 15 (RS): as Row 12, fasten off.

Join **yarn C** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 15, RS facing you.

Filet pattern follows:

Row 16 (RS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, 1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [101 ch-1 spaces, 102DC]

Row 17 (WS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 18-19: as Row 17

Row 20 (RS): as Row 17, fasten off.



Join **yarn A** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 20, RS facing you.

Row 21 (RS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, *1sc in next ch-1 space, 1sc in next DC top; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [403 sc]

Row 22 (WS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, sc to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 23-24: as Row 22

Row 25 (RS): as Row 22, fasten off.

Join **yarn D** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 25, RS facing you.

Filet pattern follows:

Row 26 (RS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, 1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [101 ch-1 spaces, 102DC]
Row 27 (WS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn.
Rows 28-29: as Row 27
Row 30 (RS): as Row 27, fasten off.



Join **yarn A** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 30, RS facing you.
Row 31 (RS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, *1sc in next ch-1 space, 1sc in next DC top; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [403 sc]
Row 32 (WS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, sc to the end of the row, turn.
Rows 33-34: as Row 32
Row 35 (RS): as Row 32, fasten off.

Join **yarn E** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 35, RS facing you.
 Filet pattern follows:
Row 36 (RS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, 1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [101 ch-1 spaces, 102DC]

Row 37 (WS): 1ch and 1DC in same space, *1ch, skip st, 1DC in next st; rep from * to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 38-39: as Row 37

Row 40 (RS): as Row 37, fasten off.



Join **yarn A** with a sl st on top of the first st of Row 40, RS facing you.

Row 41 (RS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, *1sc in next ch-1 space, 1sc in next DC top; rep from * to the end of the row, turn. [403 sc]

Row 42 (WS): 1ch and 1sc in same space, sc to the end of the row, turn.

Rows 43-44: as Row 42

Row 45 (RS): as Row 42, **DO NOT FASTEN OFF !!!**

Continue crocheting:

Rotate the scarf so to have the short side facing you:

1ch, work 1 sl st along each sc row (5 sl sts per strip) and 2 sl sts along each DC row (10 sl sts per filet strip). Fasten off.

Repeat the same along the other short side, still RS facing you. Weave in all ends.



FRINGING

Cut lengths of yarn (60 cm each one) from every skein:
50 from **yarn A**
20 from **yarn B, yarn C, yarn D** and **yarn E**.

Knot each thread to the corresponding color space .



How to:

Put one scarf end in front of you, RS facing (see prev picture).

Fold in half one thread, insert hook from back to front in one scarf row (you can start from the far right or from the far left) and pull the loop to the back, push the two dangling legs into that loop and pull tight: fringe done.

Repeat the process for all the fringes and note that:

- for each sc strip you have 5 fringes (= 1 fringe per row)
- for each filet strip you have 10 fringes (= 2 fringes per mesh space)
- the fringes hide the sl sts row

Repeat the same on the other end of the scarf.

Once all the fringes are on, divide them into groups of five. Knot these five fringes together to form tassels. Trim the tassels to the desired length.

Steam the scarf and the tassels to have a neat finish.
