Heart Clouds

Scarf

MATERIALS

6 skeins of Tweed Delight col. Neon Ivory (02)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)

YARN QUALITY

 **Tweed Delight**, Hobbii
85% wool, 10% acrylic, 5% viscose
50 g (1.75 oz) = 100 m (109 yds)

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 14 sts x 9 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

yo = yarn over
sl st = slip stitch
ch = chain
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
tc = triple crochet
dtr = double triple crochet
2 dc-cl = 2 double crochet cluster (Yo. Insert your hook into the next stitch, yo, pull up a loop, yo. Pull through 2 loops, yo. Insert your hook into the same stitch, yo, pull up a loop, yo. Pull through 2 loops, yo. Pull thru remaining three loops to complete the stitch)

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 24 cm / 9.5"
Length: 200 cm / 78.5"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This beautiful scarf is made with a rhombus pattern and is finished with cute hearts across the long sides of the scarf. Suitable for the intermediate crocheter. The pattern contains a photo-guide.

INFO AND TIPS

Rhombus pattern: The number of sts is a multiple of 7+2

Heart Pattern: The number of sts is multiple of 9+1 (280 dc)

RHOMBUS PATTERN

Row 1: ch-23, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, * ch-6, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, hdc in the 3rd ch, dc in the 4th ch, tc in the 5th ch, dtr in the 6th ch, skip next 6 chs of the foundation chain, sc in next ch **, rep from * to ** to the end of the row (photos #1-4)

Row 2: ch-5, turn, * sl st in the top of the next triangle, sc in the bottom of the next sc, hdc in the bottom of the next hdc, dc in the bottom of the next dc, tc in the bottom of the next tc, dtr in the bottom of the next dtr **, repeat from * to ** to the end of the row, dtr in the last sc (photos #5-8)

Row 3: ch-1, turn, sc in the 1st dtr, * ch-6, sc in the 2nd ch from the hook, hdc in the 3rd ch, dc in the 4th ch, tc in the 5th ch, dtr in the 6th ch, sc in the space between two rhombuses **, repeat from * to ** to the end of the row, sc in the top of ch-5 of the previous row (photos #9-10)

Repeat Row 2-3 until you reach the desired length (photos #11-12). I crocheted 46 rhombuses. Finish with the 2nd row, don't cut the yarn and make a row of ch-6 spaces this way: ch-1, turn, sc in the first st, (ch-6, sc in the space between two rhombus) rep once, ch-6, sc in the top of ch-5 of the previous row (photos #11-12).

Don't cut the yarn, start crocheting hearts across the long side of the scarf (photo #15).

HEARTS PATTERN

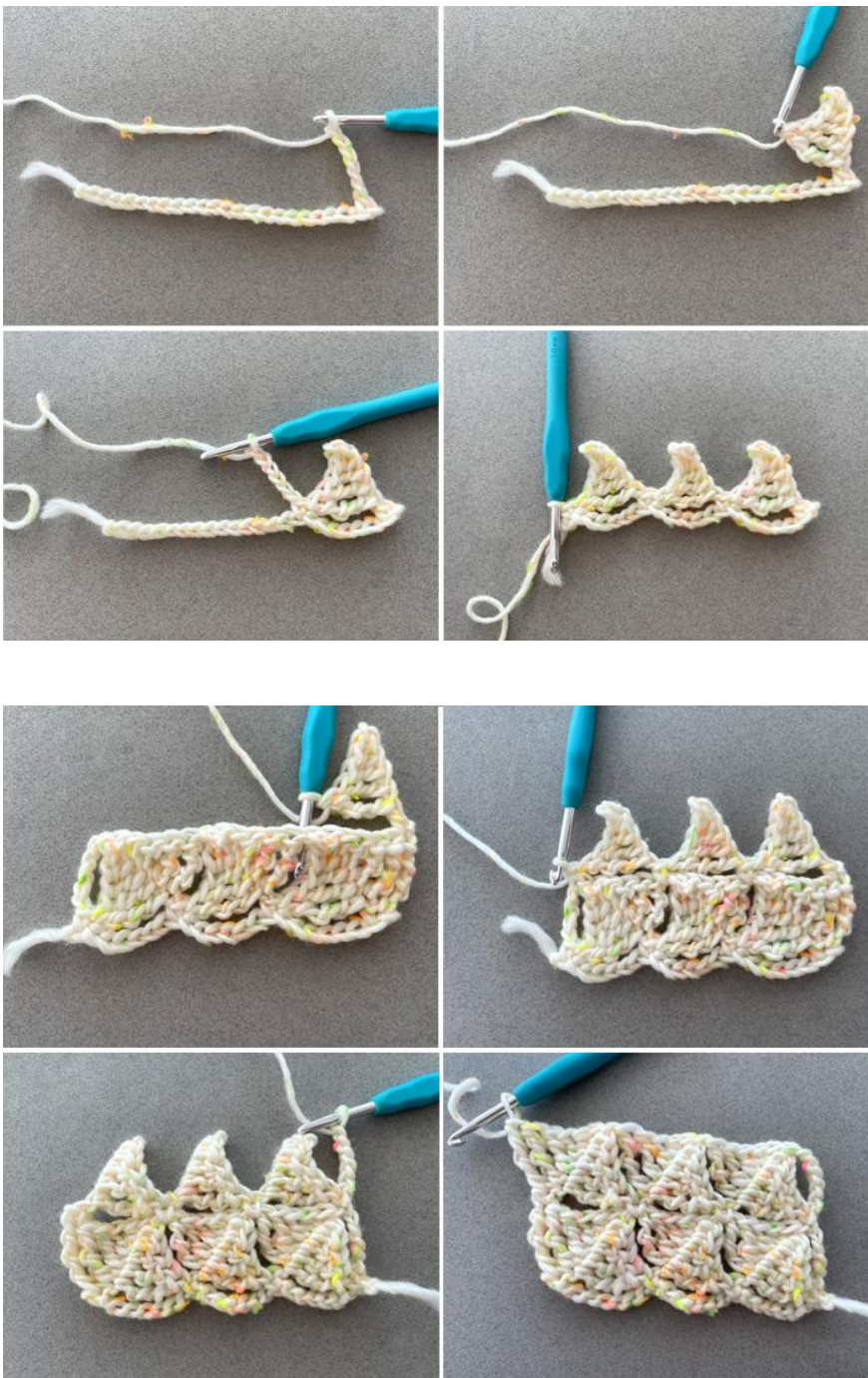
Row 1: ch-3 (count as the 1st dc), dc in the same place, 5 dc in next ch-5 space, * dc in the space between 2 rhombus, 5 dc in next ch-5 space **, rep from * to ** to the last ch-5 space, 6 dc in the last ch-5 space, 2 dc in the last st. The number of sts is multiple of 9 +1 (280 dc). Photo 15

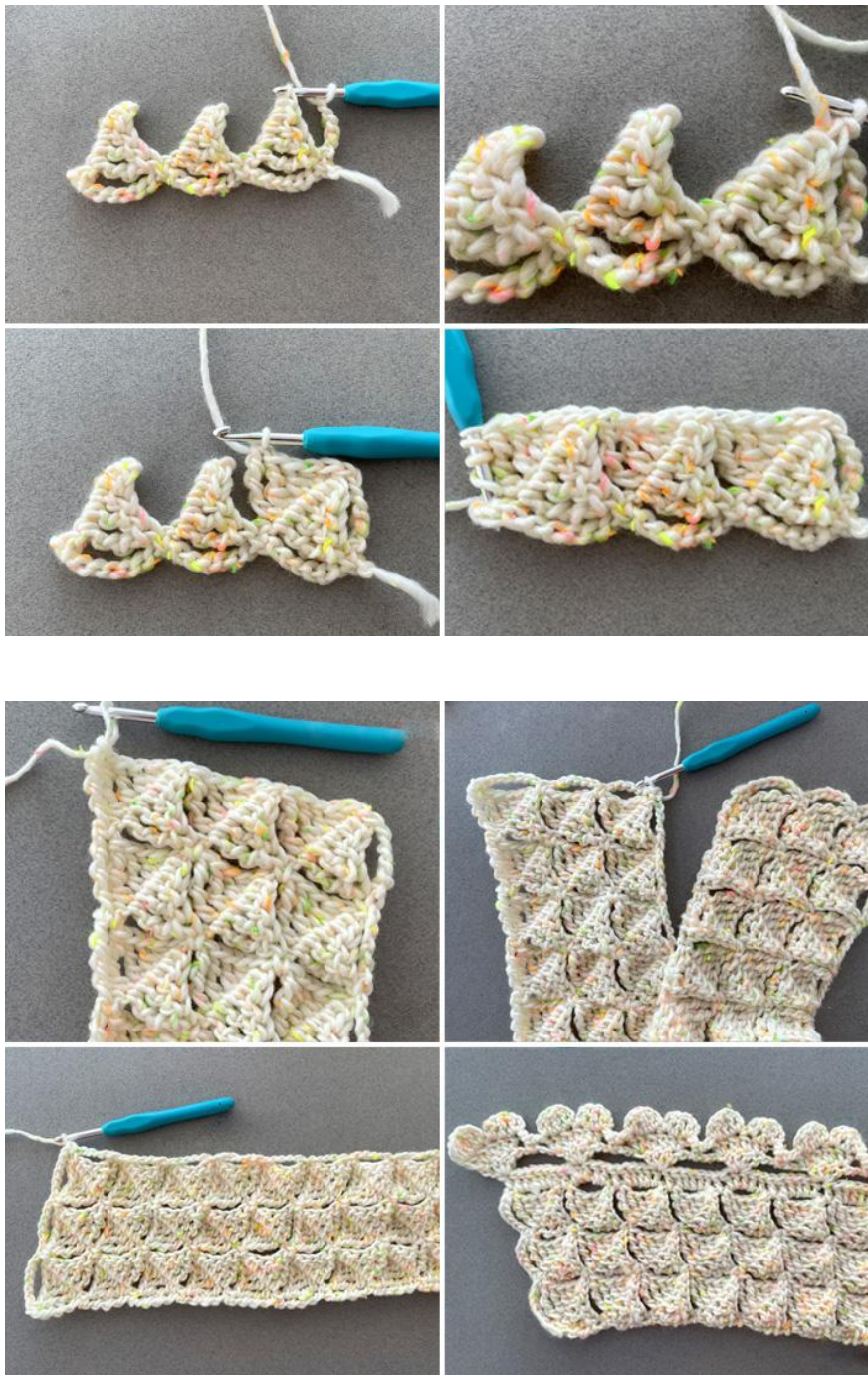
Row 2: ch-3, turn, 3 dc in the 1st dc, ch-5, skip next 8 dc, 4 dc in next dc, * ch-5, skip next 8 dc, 4 dc in next dc, **, repeat from * to ** to the end of the row

Row 3: ch-3, turn, dc in same place, 2 dc-cl in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc, * ch-2, sc in next ch-5 space, ch-2, 2 dc in next dc, 2 dc-cl in next 2 dc, 2 dc in next dc **, repeat from * to ** to the end of the row

Row 4: ch-2, turn, dc in the 1st dc, tc in next dc, dc in next st, ch-2, sl st in same st, sl st in next st, ch-2, dc in same st, tc in next dc, dc in next dc, ch-2, sl st in same dc, * sl st in next ch-2 space, ch-1, sl st in next ch-2 space, sl st in next dc, ch-2, dc in same place, tc in next dc, dc in next st, ch-2, sl st in same st, sl st in next st, ch-2, dc in same st, tc in next dc, dc in next dc, ch-2, sl st in same dc ** repeat from * to ** to the end of the row (photo #16)

Repeat for the other side.
