



CROCHET PATTERN

Firefly

Sweater

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MATERIALS

10 (10, 12, 12) skeins of Diablo Print, col. Watermelon/Salmon/Yellow/Peach (02)

Crochet hook 4.0 mm (US G-6)
Scissors
Darning needle
Tape measure

YARN QUALITY

 **Diablo Print**, Hobbii
40% acrylic, 30% mohair, 30% polyamide
25 g = 225 m

GAUGE

Blocked gauge 10 x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 12 sts x 8 rows.

ABBREVIATIONS

st(s) = stitch(es)
ch = chain
sk = skip
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
3dctog = three double crochet together

SIZE

S (M, L, XL)

MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 90 (100, 110, 120) cm / 35.4 (39.4, 43.3, 47.2) inches
Length: 48 (50, 52, 54) cm / 18.9 (19.7, 20.5, 21.3) inches

PATTERN INFORMATION

Firefly is a cool, oversized sweater crocheted with two strands of Diablo Print. The sweater is worked in 2 separate panels that are sewn together. Skill-level: intermediate

INFO AND TIPS

With a 4mm hook, and yarn double stranded work up gauge as follows:

- Ch 24, ch 3 more and turn
- Dc in fourth ch from hook and dc in each ch till end of row (24 dc)
- Ch3 & turn, dc in every st till end of row (24 dc)
- Repeat previous row for another 14 rows and fasten off.
- Block gauge.
- Check measurements in the center of gauge: you should get 12 sts x 8 rows for a 10cm x 10cm square

If you don't match gauge, change your hook size to the one that enables you to correctly meet gauge.

Final sweater dimensions:

Body width	45 cm / 17.7"	50 cm / 19.7"	55 cm / 21.6"	60 cm / 23.6"
Body length (shoulder to waist)	48 cm / 18.9"	50 cm / 19.7"	52 cm / 20.5"	54 cm / 21.3"
Sleeves length	47,5 cm / 18.7"	50 cm / 19.7"	52 cm / 20.5"	54 cm / 21.3"

FRONT PANEL

FP1 Ch 57 (60, 62, 65).

FP2 Ch3 & turn, dc in fourth ch from hook, dc in every ch till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65)

FP3 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65)

Repeat FP3 for another 12 (13, 14, 15) times.

- FP4 Ch3 & turn, dc 41 (44, 46, 49), 3dctog. Leave remaining sts unworked.
42 (45, 47, 50)
- FP5 Ch3 & turn, sk first st, 3dc tog, dc in every st till end of row. 39 (42, 44, 47)
- FP6 Ch3 & turn, dc 35 (38, 40, 43), 3dctog. 36 (39, 41, 44)
- FP7 Ch3 & turn, sk first st, 3dc tog, dc in every st till end of row. 33 (36, 38, 41)
- FP8 - M/L/XL size only: Ch3 & turn, dc -(32, 35, 38), 3dctog. -(33, 36, 39)
- FP9 - L & XL size only: Ch3 & turn, 3dctog, dc -(-,33, 36). -(-,34, 37)
- FP10 - XL size only: Ch3 & turn, dc -(-, 34), 3dctog. -(-, 35)
- FP11 - XL size only: Ch3 & turn, 3 dc in first st, dc in every st till end of row. -(-, 37)
- FP12 - L & XL size only: Ch3 & turn, dc in every st, 3 dc in the last st. -(-, 36, 39)
- FP13 - M size only: Ch3 & turn, 4 dc in first st, dc in every st till end of row. - (36, -,-)
- FP13 - L & XL size only: Ch3 & turn, 3 dc in first st, dc in every st till end of row. - (-, 38, 41)
- FP 14 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st, 4 dc in last st. 36 (39, 41, 44)
- FP 15 Ch3 & turn, 4 dc in first st, dc in every st till end of row. 39 (42, 44, 47)
- FP 16 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st, 4 dc in last st, ch 15 for all sizes. 57 (60, 62, 65).
- FP 17 Ch3 & turn, dc in fourth ch from hook, dc in every ch and st till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65).
- FP 18 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65).

Repeat FP 18 for another 12 (13, 14, 15) times.

You should now have a total of 36 (40, 44, 48) rows, this is your finished front panel.

Fasten off.

BACK PANEL

- BP1 Ch 57 (60, 62, 65).
- BP2 Ch3 & turn, dc in fourth ch from hook, dc in every ch till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65)
- BP3 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65)
- Repeat BP3 for another 12 (13, 14, 15) times.
- BP4 Ch3 & turn, dc 54 (57, 59, 62), 3dctog. 55 (58, 60, 63)

BP5 Ch3 & turn, sk first st, 3dc tog, dc in every st till end of row. 52 (55, 57, 60)

BP6 Ch3 & turn, dc 52 (55, 57, 60).

Repeat BP6 for another 3 (5, 7, 9) times.

BP7 Ch3 & turn, dc 51 (54, 56, 59), 4 dc in last st. 55 (58, 60, 63)

BP8 Ch3 & turn, 3 dc in first st, dc 54 (57, 59, 62). 57 (60, 62, 65)

BP9 Ch3 & turn, dc 57 (60, 62, 65).

Repeat BP9 for another 13 (14, 15, 16) times.

You should now have a total of 36 (40, 44, 48) rows, this is your finished back panel.

Fasten off.

BODY ASSEMBLY

Place your front and back panel with the wrong side up.

We will join the two panels starting from the sides, from the bottom edge to the armpit: attach double stranded yarn on the bottom edge of one of the sides: join the two panels with 28 (30, 32, 33) sc.

Leave the remaining sts unworked. Fasten off.

Repeat on the other side.

Attach double stranded yarn on the top right corner of the right shoulder, place 2 sc for every row, joining the front and back panel, until you reach the collar edge. 28 (30, 32, 34). Fasten off.

Attach double stranded yarn on the opposite collar edge and work towards the top left corner of the left shoulder by placing 2 sc for every row, joining front and back panel. 28 (30, 32, 34). Fasten off.

SLEEVES

S1 Ch 57 (60, 62, 65).

S2 Ch 3 & turn, dc in fourth ch from hook and in every ch till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65).

S3 Ch3 & turn, dc in every st till end of row. 57 (60, 62, 65).

Repeat S3 for another 26 (28, 30, 31) times.

Fold your sleeve keeping rows horizontal and with the wrong side facing up. Join the first and last row with 57 (60, 62, 65) sc.



Do not fasten off and place 2 sc in every row of the joint sleeve.

Do not fasten off and lay your sleeve (wrong side) next to the armhole created on the body part: starting from the armpit, join the sleeve to the body by placing sc all around the sleeve/armhole circle.

Repeat once more for the second sleeve.

FINISHING (optional)

In order to make the edges look smoother, you can place 2 sc in every row on the bottom edge of your sweater and on the sleeve ends. Add as many sc rows as desired.

Weave in the ends and block your sweater to make it fit right.

Enjoy your new sweater!
