## Socks

Design: MZ Design | Hobbii Design

## MATERIALS

$1(1,1)$ skein of Silly Socks Flower Pop, color 10

Double pointed needles Addi, CraSy Trio
2.5 mm or regular double pointed needles 2.5 mm

Stitch markers

## YARN QUALITY

(10) Silly Socks Flower Pop, Hobbii

75\% Wool, 25\% Polyamide $100 \mathrm{~g}=400 \mathrm{~m}$

## GAUGE

$10 \times 10 \mathrm{~cm}\left(4^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}\right)=28$ sts $\times 40$ rows

## ABBREVIATIONS

St(s) = stitch(es)
$\mathrm{K}=\mathrm{knit}$
P = purl
K2tog $=$ knit 2 stitches together
P2tog = purl 2 stitches together
K2tog Tbl = knit 2 sts together through the back loops
beg = beginning
Edge-st = for the heel: Knit the first st on the row, slip the last stitch purlwise (with yarn in front)

## SIZE

Shoe size EU: 36/37 (38/39, 40/41)

## MEASUREMENTS

Foot length: approx. $24(26,28) \mathrm{cm} / 9,4(10.2$, 11) inches

## PATTERN INFORMATION

These neat socks with lace pattern can be worked using addi CraSy Trio (i.e., using three needles) or using regular double pointed needles. The pattern comes with a guide with pictures.
Skill level: intermediate

## TIPS AND INFO

k2tog tbl can also be worked like this: slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over (sl1, k1, psso). I prefer this method when working the lace pattern because it makes the pattern stand out more clearly.

This pattern was made for 3 needles. It makes it much easier to do the lace pattern. You can also use 5 needles if you prefer. In that case, my first needle will be your needle 1 and 4, and my second needle will be your needle 2 and 3 .

## LACE STITCH PATTERN

## Size 36/37 and 38/39

Row 1: k 4, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over
Row 2 and all even rows: knit all sts and yarn-overs
Row 3: k 3, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 1
Row 5: k 2, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 2
Row 7: k 1, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 3
Row 9: *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 4
Row 11: *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4
Row 13: k 1, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 3
Row 15: k 2, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 2
Row 17: k 3, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 1
Row 19: k 4, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl,
Row 20: knit all sts and yarn-overs

## Size 40/41

Row 1: k 5, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 1
Row 2 and all even rows: knit all sts and yarn-overs
Row 3: k 4, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 2
Row 5: k 3, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 3
Row 7: k 2, *k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 4

Row 9: k 1*k2tog, yarn over, k 4* 4 times, k2tog, yarn over, k 5
Row 11: k 1, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 5
Row 13: k 2, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4
Row 15: k 3, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 3
Row 17: k 4, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 2
Row 19: k 5, *yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 4* 4 times, yarn over, k2tog tbl, k 1
Row 20: knit all sts and yarn-overs

## CUFF

CO $60(60,64)$ sts and divide onto 2 double pointed needles, Place a marker at the beginning of round. Work rib stitch in the round: *k $2, \mathrm{p} 2 *$, until the cuff measures 3 cm ( 1.2 inches). The beg of round will be at the beg of needle 1. NOTE: for size $40 / 41$ you will work k 1, p 2 *k 2, p 2*, k 1 to make the rib stitch pattern fit. The beg of round will then be between 2 knit stitches. Knit one round.

Now work the stitch pattern as instruction in the section named LACE STITCH PATTERN.
Work rows 1-20 3-5 times depending on how long you want the leg to be. End with row 20 of the stitch pattern.

## HEEL

The heel is worked across the $30(30,32)$ sts on the first needle.
The sts for the instep are left to rest on their needle.

## Heel flap

Row 1 RS: edge-st, knit all sts, edge st.
Row 2, WS: edge-st, k 2, purl across all sts until 3 sts remain, k 2, edge-st
Work these two rows back and forth across the $30(30,32)$ sts of the heel until you have worked $28(28,30)$ rows. End with a WS-row.

## Heel decreases

1st row, RS: knit 19, $(19,21)$ sts, k2tog tbl, turn.
2nd row, WS: purl $9(9,11)$ sts, p2tog, turn.
3rd row, RS: knit $9(9,11)$ sts, k2tog tbl, turn.
4th row, WS: purl $9(9,11)$ sts, p2tog, turn.
Repeat rows 3 and 4 until $10(10,12)$ stitches remain.
You will now continue around across both needles, still working the lace pattern across the top of the foot and working the sole in stockinette stitch.

On the next round pick up and knit $15(15,16)$ sts on each side of the heel flap. You will now have $40,(40,44)$ sts on your needles.

## Gusset heel

Gusset decreases

You will work the gusset in stockinette stitch. Decreases are worked at the beginning and end of the heel needle, k 1 , k2tog tbl at the beg of the needle and k2tog at the end of the needle, k 1 . Decrease every 2 . Round until $60(60,64)$ sts remain, evenly divided on the two needles.

## FOOT

Work in lace pattern across the instep and in stockinette stitch across the sole until work measures approx. $18,5(20,21) \mathrm{cm} / 7,3(7.9,8.3$ inches) from the heel. Be sure to end with row 10 or 20 of the lace pattern. You will work the toe in stockinette stitch.

Toe decrease

1st round: 1st needle: K 1, k2tog tbl, knit until 3 sts remain, k2tog, k 1.
2nd needle: K 1, k2tog tbl, knit until 3 sts remain, k2tog, k 1 .

2nd round: work one round without decreases.

You will decrease 4 sts on each round. Repeat decreases every 2. Round until $24(24,28)$ sts remain. Repeat decreases every round until 12 sts remain. BO all sts using the 3-needle-bind-off or cut the yarn and pull the tail through the remaining sts twice to close the gap. Weave in the end securely on the inside. Make the other sock the same way.
