MATERIALS

1 (1, 1, 1, 1) (1, 2, 2, 2) skein of Winter Glow, colour 29

Crochet hook 4 mm (US G/6)

Embroidery needle

Stitch markers

Scissors

Tape measure

4 - 8 coconut buttons, flower 18 mm

YARN QUALITY

 **Winter Glow**, Hobbii

51% Wool, 49 % Acrylic

200 g / 7.1 oz. = 700 m / 766 yds.

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 18 hdc x 11 rows

SIZE

0-6mo (6-12mo, 12-18mo, 2yr, 4yr) (6yr, 8yr, 10yr, 12yr)

MEASUREMENTS

Chest: 44 (46.5, 48.5, 53.5, 58.5) (63.5, 67.5, 72, 76) cm

17.25" (18.25", 19", 21", 23") (25", 26.5", 28.25", 30")

PATTERN INFORMATION

Here is the Coral Cardigan for sizes 0-6 months to 12yrs. It is a super quick and easy cardigan to make using just one colour that gives such beautiful textures and finish.

The cardigan is worked top down.

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
 st = stitch
 PM = place marker
 slst = slip stitch
 sc = single crochet
 ex-sc = extended single crochet
 hdc = half double crochet
 dc = double crochet
 puff = puff stitch
 inc2 = increase by placing 2 stitches in 1 stitch
 inc3 = increase by placing 3 stitches in 1 stitch
 2tog = 2 stitches crocheted together
 {...} = end stitch count
 ... = repeat between **

SPECIAL STITCHES

Extended Single Crochet - insert hook into stated stitch, yarn over, draw through stitch, yarn over, pull through 1 stitch, yarn over pull through 2 stitches

Puff - *yarn over, insert hook around stated stitch, pull up a loop* 4 times, yarn over, pull through all 9 loops on the hook. DO NOT ch 1 to close puff

Standing dc - sc into stated stitch, insert the hook into the lowest loop of the sc at the front (shown by pic), yarn over, draw through stitch, yarn over, pull through 2 loops



INFO AND TIPS

Follow the instructions according to your size: 0-6mo (6-12mo, 12-18mo, 2yr, 4yr) (6yr, 8yr, 10yr, 12yr)

NECK RIBBING

Row 1: ch 7(7, 7, 8, 8) (9, 9, 10, 10), starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, sc in each ch across, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sts}

Row 2 - 72(74, 78, 82, 86) (90, 90, 92, 94): ch 1, turn, sc in 1st st, sc-blo to last st, sc in last st, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sts}

Turn the ribbing, you will now be working across the length. 1 sc is added across each row. For sizes 0-6mo, 6-12mo, 2yr, 6yr, 8yr, and 12yr you will need to place an increase in the middle to reach stitch count.

Ch1, add 73(75, 78, 83, 86) (91, 91, 92, 95) sc evenly across the ribbing, {73(75, 78, 83, 86) (91, 91, 92, 95) sts}

YOKE

Row 1 [RS]: ch1, turn, hdc 10(10, 11, 11, 12) (13, 13, 13, 14), inc3 (place marker in centre st of inc), hdc 14(14, 14, 16, 16) (17, 17, 17, 17), inc3 (place marker in centre st of inc), hdc 21(23, 24, 25, 26) (27, 27, 28, 29), inc3 (place marker in centre st of inc), 14(14, 14, 16, 16) (17, 17, 17, 17), inc3 (place marker in centre st of inc), 10(10, 11, 11, 12) (13, 13, 13, 14), {81(83, 86, 91, 94) (99, 99, 100, 103) sts}

Notes:

Follow the progress tables according to your size below to know which kind of following rows to work next.

Ch1 and turn for all rows (does not count as a st).

inc all: hdc to marker, inc3 in marked st, place marker in middle st, repeat all the way around

inc slvs & bk: hdc to marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc3 in marker, PM in middle st, hdc to next marker, inc3 in marker, PM in middle st, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to end

inc fnt & bk: hdc to marker, inc 2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in next marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to end

inc fnt: hdc to marker, inc 2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to last marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to end

inc slvs: hdc to marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to end

inc bk: hdc to second marker, inc 2 in marker, PM in first st of inc, hdc to next marker, inc2 in marker, PM in second st of inc, hdc to end



no inc: hdc to end of row, moving all markers up

SEPARATION OF YOKE

[WS] Divide for front, back and sleeves - keep markers in place

ch1, turn, hdc in next 18(18, 18, 20, 22) (24, 26, 28, 30) sts,

ch 3(4, 5, 6, 6) (8, 8, 9, 9),

skip next 28(30, 32, 34, 34) (35, 35, 37, 37) sts,

hdc in next 37(41, 42, 45, 50) (51, 53, 56, 61) sts,

ch 3(4, 5, 6, 6) (8, 8, 9, 9),

skip next 28(30, 32, 34, 34) (35, 35, 37, 37) sts,

hdc in next 18(18, 18, 20, 22) (24, 26, 28, 30) sts, hdc 1, {79(85, 88, 97, 106) (115, 121, 130, 139) sts}

The stitch count will remain the same from here onwards.

BODY

Row 1 [RS]: ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st across including the chs,

Row 2 [WS]: ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st across,

Row 3 [RS]: ch 1, turn, standing dc in first st, *dc 1 in next st (pic 1), puff around previous dc (pic 2), skip a stitch, ex-sc in next st (pic 3)* repeat until the end,



Row 4 [WS]: ch 1, turn, *hdc 1 in space between ex-sc and puff, hdc on top of puff, hdc in dc* repeat until the end, hdc in top of standing dc,

Repeat row 3 and 4 until the body is approx 9(10.5, 12.5, 14, 15.5) (19, 23, 25.5, 27)cm / {3.5(4, 5, 5.5, 6) (7.5, 9, 10, 10.5)in from the underarm, or until it has reached desired length allowing for 3(3, 3, 3.5, 3.5) (4, 4, 4.5, 4.5)cm of ribbing. Finish on WS with row 4. Do not fasten off.

HEM RIBBING

Note: Make sure you slst into the next stitch and not the same one as before. Your slst's should be made with the right side facing

Ch 7(7, 7, 8, 8) (9, 9, 10, 10),

Row 1: starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, sc in each ch across, slst in the next 2 stitches into the base (shown by pic), {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc and 2 slst's}



Row 2: turn, skip the 2 slst's, sc-blo to last st, sc in last st, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc}

Row 3: ch 1, turn, sc in first stitch, sc-blo in next 5(5, 5, 6, 6) (7, 7, 8, 8) stitches, slst in the next 2 stitches into the base, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc and 2 slst's}

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until you have worked your last two slst into the base and worked row 2. Do not fasten off, move onto the buttonhole band.

BUTTONHOLE BAND

Row 1: place sc evenly across the rows to the neck ribbing, place 1 sc in each st of the neck ribbing. Make sure it lays flat and doesn't ripple before continuing. Adjust the number of sc accordingly.

Row 2: ch 1, turn, sc in each st across. Attach 4 markers for smaller sizes and up to 8 markers for larger sizes, spaced equally, one at the top, one at the bottom and the remaining in between.

Row 3: ch 1, turn, add sc in each st across but ch 1 and skip the sts where you have attached the st markers. Ch 1 spaces will serve as buttonholes,

Row 4: ch 1, turn, sc in each st and each ch space. Fasten off.

BUTTON BAND

Join yarn at the top neck ribbing edging on the left side (as worn)

Row 1: place 1 sc in each stitch of the neck ribbing, place sc evenly across the rows to the hem ribbing. Make sure it lays flat and doesn't ripple before continuing. Adjust the number of sc accordingly.

Row 2-4: ch 1, turn, sc in each,

Fasten off.

SLEEVES

Round 1 [WS]: Join yarn in the 2nd(3rd, 3rd, 4th, 4th) (5th, 5th, 5th, 5th) ch from the separation of the yoke. Your first stitch will be back into the same stitch,

ch 1, hdc 1 into the next 1(1, 2, 2, 2) (3, 3, 3, 3) ch(s), hdc2tog the last ch and the st you worked your last hdc into from the yoke split (see image) to close the corner gap, hdc 28(30, 32, 34, 34)

(35, 35, 37, 37), hdc2tog the last stitch worked from the yoke split and the first ch, hdc 1 into the next 0(1, 1, 2, 2) (3, 3, 3, 3) ch(s), slst to the first hdc to join, {31(34, 37, 40, 40) (43, 43, 46, 46)}



Round 2 - 4(5, 4, 5, 7) (7, 6, 6, 7): ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {31(34, 37, 40, 40) (43, 43, 46, 46)}

0-6mo, 6-12mo, 12-18mo, 2yr, 4yr, 6yr ONLY

Round 5(6, 5, 6, 8) (8) - 12(15, 17, 19, 21) (24): ch1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {23(24, 24, 26, 26) (26)}

Round 13(16, 18, 20, 22) (25) - 14(18, 20, 22, 26) (30) or until desired length of sleeve minusing 3 cm for the ribbing: ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {23(24, 24, 26, 26) (26)}

Do not fasten off but proceed to sleeve ribbing.

8yr, 10yr, 12yr ONLY

Round (7, 7, 8): ch1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {42, 45, 45}}

Round (8, 8, 9): ch1, turn, hdc2tog, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {41, 44, 44}}

Round (9, 9, 10): ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {41, 44, 44}
Repeat round (7, 7, 8) to round (9, 9, 10) until you have (29, 32, 32) rounds, {27, 28, 29}

Round (30, 33, 33) - (32, 34, 36) or until desired length of sleeve minusing 4 cm for the ribbing: ch1, turn, hdc 1 in each st around, slst to the first hdc to join, {27, 28, 29}

Do not fasten off but proceed to sleeve ribbing.

SLEEVE RIBBING

Note: Make sure you slst into the next stitch and not the same one as before. Your slst's should be made with the right side facing

Ch 7(7, 7, 8, 8) (9, 9, 10, 10),

Row 1: starting in the 2nd ch from the hook, sc in each ch across, slst in the next 2 stitches into the base, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc and 2 slst's}

Row 2: turn, skip the 2 slst's, sc-blo to last st, sc in last st, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc}

Row 3: ch 1, turn, sc in first stitch, sc-blo in next 5(5, 5, 6, 6) (7, 7, 8, 8) stitches, slst in the next 2 stitches into the base, {6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) sc and 2 slst's}

Repeat rows 2 & 3 until you have worked your last two slst into the base and worked row 2

You will now join the cuff sides

Working now WS facing (you can turn the cardigan inside out to make this easier), loosely slst 6(6, 6, 7, 7) (8, 8, 9, 9) going through the blo on the row just worked and the remaining loops from your starting chain. Fasten off. Weave in your ends.

FINISHING OFF

Weave in all the ends and sew on buttons to correspond to the buttonholes.
