



CROCHET PATTERN

Lagoon Pouch bag

MATERIALS

3 skeins of Pearly Haze color 96 (Teal)

Crochet hook 6 mm / US J/10 Crochet hook 3.5 mm / US E/4

Gold metal buckle 31x28 mm Tapestry needle Scissors

YARN QUALITY

Pearly Haze, Hobbii 73 % Viscose, 27 % Wool 50 g / 1.75 oz = 110 m /120 yds

GAUGE

18 sts x 16 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4"

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain sc = single crochet hdc slpst = half double crochet slip stitch inc = increase (2 hdc slpst in the same st) dec = decrease (2 hdc slpsts together) blo = back loop only slpst = slip stitch

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 25 cm / 9.8" Length (without the strap): 18 cm / 7"

PATTERN INFORMATION

Lagoon bag is a beginner-friendly crochet project. It has a one-piece structure that folds perfectly into a small pouch bag (a perfect gift idea!). The stitch I chose creates a solid ribbed fabric that has stretch to it. Characterised by pearly finish that creates a fascinating iridescence, reminiscent of a calm ocean on a sunny day. The main hook needed is large, which makes it a simple and quick project to complete.

INFO AND TIPS

You can make your strap longer or shorter by changing the number of chains in row 45.

MAIN PIECE

With hook 6 mm, ch 42

Row 1: Skip first stitch, hdc slpst 41

Row 2: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 41

Row 3: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 35

Row 4: ch 1, turn, skip first stitch, hdc slpst blo 34

Row 5: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 34

Row 6: ch 1, turn, skip first stitch, hdc slpst blo 33

Row 7: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 33

Row 8: ch 1, turn, skip first stitch, hdc slpst blo 32

Row 9: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 32

Keep skipping one stitch and repeating these steps until you get to row 14 (29 stitches)

Row 15-32: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 29

Row 33: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 28, inc

Row 34: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 30

Row 35: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 29, inc

Row 36: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 31

Row 37: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 30, inc

Row 38: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 32

Keep increasing and repeating these steps until you get to row 44 (35 stitches)

Row 45: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 35, ch 90

Row 46: turn, skip the first chain, hdc slpst 89, hdc slpst blo 35

Row 47-50: ch 1, turn, hdc slipst blo 124

Row 51-52: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 35

Row 53: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 33, dec



Row 54: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 34 Row 55: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 32, dec Row 56: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 33 Row 57: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 31, dec Row 58: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 32

Keep decreasing and repeating this steps until you get to row 63 (28 stitches and 1 decrease)

Row 64-81: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 29 Row 82: ch 1, turn, inc, hdc slpst blo 28 Row 83: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 30 Row 84: ch 1, turn, inc, hdc slpst blo 29 Row 85: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 31 Row 86: ch 1, turn, inc, hdc slpst blo 30 Row 87: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 32

Keep increasing and repeating this steps until you get to row 92 (33 stitches and 1 increase)

Row 93: ch 1, turn, hdc slpst blo 35, ch 7 Row 94: turn, hdc slpst 6, hdc slpst blo 35



Join row 94 with the first chain by making 41 slip stitches (take the back loop from row 94 and a loop from the chain). Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing.

ASSEMBLE



Turn your work inside out. Insert you buckle in the short strap and sew by the middle with a tapestry needle.



With your 3.5 mm hook sc all the way around skipping your short strap with the buckle. This will make your bag sturdier (you can use a 2mm hook on the opening of the bag to make it tighter, just not the long strap). Fasten off and weave the ends.

Sew the bottom of the bag by inserting the tapestry needle on one loop of the first row and skipping the second row. Keep alternating until you get where you started. Fasten off and weave the ends.

Now you can adjust the long strap into the buckle.
