# Fjerlet

## Scarf

Design: Garnstyrelsen | Hobbii Design




## MATERIALS

1 skein Friends Kid Silk, color Dune (07)

Circular needles 5.5 mm (US 9) 16 in or 24 in / 40 cm or 60 cm  
1 stitch marker

## YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Kid Silk**, Hobbii  
72% Mohair, 25% Silk, 3% Wool  
25 g (0.9 oz) = 200 m (218 yds)

## GAUGE

10 x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 14 sts x 24 rows

## ABBREVIATIONS

k = knit  
p = purl  
st(s) = stitch(es)  
r = row(s)  
edge st(s) = edge stitch(es)  
yo = yarn over  
M = stitch marker  
k2tog tbl = knit 2 stitches together through the back loops.

## SIZE

One size

## MEASUREMENTS

Approx. 54.3 in / 138 cm long  
Approx. 11.8 in / 30 cm wide

## PATTERN INFORMATION

This design is intended as an easy, quick and warming project that is also well suited for Friends Kid Silk yarn scraps.

Furthermore, the airy look of the scarf allows you to tone down a color that might otherwise appear overpowering.

If you want the scarf to be larger and/or longer, you can always add an extra skein of Friends Kid Silk.

The scarf is worked back and forth on circular needles.

I recommend that you read through the entire pattern first before starting to knit the scarf to get an overview of the pattern.

The pattern is also suitable for beginners/intermediate knitters.

# Pattern



## INFO AND TIPS

Edge stitches (edge sts) are defined as the first and last stitch on the row.

On the Fjerlet Scarf, they are worked in the following ways:

On both the right and wrong side, you knit the first st.

The last st on both the right and wrong side is slipped with the yarn in front. That way, you achieve a neat and uniform edge on your scarf.

You knit 2 stitches together through the back loops by inserting the right needle from the front through the back loops of the two stitches instead of through the front loops like a regular knit stitch.

## SCARF

Cast on 42 sts on circular needles 5.5 mm

The first and last stitch are edge stitches (edge sts)

Work the three first rows in garter stitch but working the edge sts as mentioned above to get a neat edge throughout the work.

Next, place a M on the side facing yourself to mark the right side of the work. By marking it from the beginning, you are not going to get confused during the work as to which side of the work you have reached.

Now you start the pattern, which is worked as follows:

Row 1 (right side): edge st, \*p 1, k 1, yo, k2tog tbl\*.

Repeat \* to \* the rest of the row until 1 st remains. Work this st as an edge st as described above.

Row 2 (wrong side): edge st, \*yo, k2tog tbl, p 1, k 1 \*. Repeat \* to \* the rest of the row until 1 st remains. Work this st as an edge st as described above.

Repeat the two pattern rows above until you are almost out of yarn or until the scarf has reached the desired length. At this point the scarf measures approx. 54.3 in / 137 cm.

Finish off the scarf with three rows of garter stitches and bind off all stitches evenly and not too tight.

### **ASSEMBLY AND WASHING**

Weave in all ends discreetly.

The scarf should be hand-washed in max. 30°C (86°F) water with an appropriate wool detergent og dry flat on a towel draped over a drying rack.
