MATERIALS

3 (3) 4 (5) 6 skeins of Diablo col. Candy Apple (46) 2 (2) 3 (4) 5 skeins of Diablo col. Black (09) 6 (6) 8 (9) 9 skeins of Friends Wool col. Tomato (40) 5 (5) 7 (8) 8 skeins of Friends Wool col. Black (124)

Circular needles 5 mm (US 8), 80 cm (31.5 in) Double pointed needles 5 mm (US 8) (Only if not using magic loop) Stitch markers Darning needle Stitch wire

YARN QUALITY

Friends Wool, Friends
100% Wool
50 g (1.76 oz) = 100 m (109.4 yds)

Diablo, Hobbii
40% Acrylic, 30% Mohair, 30% Polyamide
25 g (0.88 oz) = 225 m (246 yds)

GAUGE

10 x 10 cm = 16 sts x 22 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

Rnd(s) = round(s) K = knit P = purl Sm = stitch marker Beg = beginning Dec = decrease Inc = increase

SIZE

XS (S) M (L) XL

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 54 (56) 58 (60) 62 cm / 21.3 (22) 22.8 (23.6) 24.4 in (when folded down) Width: 39 (44) 50 (59) 74 cm / 15.4 (17.3) 19.7 (23.2) 29.1 in

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Lava Sweater is worked bottom up in the round using 5 mm (US 8) needles and 1 strand of Diablo held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool. The magic loop-technique is used in the pattern. Alternatively, 5 mm (US 8) double pointed needles can be used. The sweater consists of a part worked in rib-stitch and one worked in stockinette stitch, finishing off with folding part of it down. To finish the armholes are sewn or crocheted together. The Lava Sweater has a loose fit.

Estimate a positive ease of 5-8 cm/2-3.15 in. i.e. the final circumference of the sweater should be 5-8 cm/2-3.15 in larger than your own circumference.

INFO AND TIPS

The Lava Sweater offers a rustic look in this red- and black striped wool yarn. Held together with Diablo to give the sweater a soft contrast. The sweater is intended to be worn with the top part folded down for an off the shoulder fit.

SLEEVES

Cast on 32 (36) 40 (44) 48 sts with 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) and 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40) using 5 mm (US 8) double pointed needles or circular needles with the magic loop-technique.

Place sm and gather to knit in the round.

Rnds 1-11 (1-12) 1-13 (1-14) 1-15: *p1, k1*

Rnd 12 (13) 14 (15) 16: K throughout rnd while increasing in every 4th st (Now a total of 40 (45) 50 (55) 60 sts)

Rnd 13 (14) 15 (16) 17: Start with 1 inc and continue to k throughout rnd while increasing in every 5th st. (Now a total of 48 (54) 60 (66) 72 sts)

Rnds 14-24 (15-25) 16-26 (17-27) 18-28: K throughout rnd.

Change to 1 strand of Diablo col Black (09) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Black (124).

Rnds 25-48 (26-50) 27-52 (28-54) 29-56: K throughout rnd.

Change to 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40). Rnds 49-72 (51-75) 53-78 (55-81) 57-84: K throughout rnd.



Now, change back to 1 strand of Diablo col Black (09) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Black (124). Rnds 73-96 (76-99) 79-102 (82-105) 85-108: K throughout rnd.

Bind off 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 sts for the armhole (Now a total of 30 (34) 38 (42) 46 sts)

Break yarn and leave the sts on a scrap piece of yarn or a stitch wire. Make another sleeve following the same instructions.

FRONT AND BACK PIECE

Cast on 124 (140) 160 (188) 236 sts with 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40) using 5 mm (US 8) circular needles. Join to knit in the round.

Place sm like so:

Stitch marker 1: marks beginning of rnd.

Stitch marker 2: after 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 sts.

Stitch marker 3: after 62 (70) 80 (94) 118 sts.

Stitch marker 4: after 80 (90) 102 (118) 144 sts.

Rnds 1-24 (1-25) 1-26 (1-27) 1-28: *k2, p2*

Now, change to 1 strand of Diablo col Black (09) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Black (124).

Rnds 25-48 (26-50) 27-52 (28-54) 29-56: K throughout rnd.

Change to 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40).

Rnd 49 (51) 53 (55) 57: K until 2nd sm, *k2, make a right leaning dec by knitting 2 sts together (k2tog). K until 4 sts before the 3rd sm, make a left leaning dec by slipping 1 st, k1, pull the slipped st over. K2, k until next sm* Rnds 50-54 (52-55) 54-56 (56-57) 58: K throughout rnd.

Repeat rnds 49-54 (51-55) 53-56 (55-57) 57-58 until reaching a total of 94 (98) 102 (106) 110. **NOTE!** At rnd 73 (76) 79 (82) 85, change to 1 strand of Diablo col Black (09) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Black (124). (Now a total of 92 (100) 108 (116) 124 sts)

Rnd 95 (99) 103 (107) 111: *Bind off 18 (20) 22 (24) 26 sts for the armhole. K until next sm* (Now a total of 56 (60) 64 (68) 72 sts)

Do not break yarn, but rather continue straight on with the yoke, as described below:



YOKE

Remove all sm. Now you will gather the body (front- and back piece) and the sleeves on one needle, so the yoke can be worked with raglan decreases. You will work as follows:

Rnd 1:*K the 30 (34) 38 (42) 46 sts that make up the first sleeve, place sm, k until the bound off sts, place sm* x2

Change to 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40).

Rnd 2: *K until sm, k2, make a right leaning dec by k2tog. K until 4 sts before the next sm, make a left leaning dec by slipping 1 st, k1, pull the slipped st over, k2.* x2

Rnd 3: K throughout rnd.

Repeat rnds 2 and 3 until reaching a total of 12 (14) 16 (18) 20 rnds.

Rnds 13-48 (15-50) 17-52 (19-54) 21-56: P throughout rnd.

Now, change to 1 strand of Diablo col Black (09) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Black (124). Rnd 49-72 (51-75) 53-78 (55-81) 57-84: P throughout rnd.

Change to 1 strand of Diablo col Candy Apple (46) held together with 1 strand of Friends Wool col Tomato (40).

Rnds 73-100 (76-104) 79-108 (82-112) 85-116: P throughout rnd.

Rnd 101 (105) 109 (113) 117: *p1, make a right leaning purl inc, p1, make a left leaning purl inc*

Finish off the sweater using an italian bind off.

Fold the final 5 ends up, so the wrong sides are facing each other (purl against purl). Use a darning needle to sew along the edge, so the bind off will be hidden away on the inside. Sew or crochet the armholes together from the wrong side, and weave in all ends.
