MATERIALS

Friends Wool

4 (4) 5 (6) 6 (7) 7 skeins of col. Emerald 105
1 (1) 1 (1) 1 (1) 1 skein of col. Chocolate 12
1 (1) 1 (2) 2 (2) 2 skein(s) of col. Sunflower 24
1 (1) 1 (2) 2 (2) 2 skein(s) of col. Aqua 91
1 (1) 1 (2) 2 (2) 2 skein(s) of col. Buckthorn 29

Circular needles 3.5 mm, 60 cm
Circular needles 3.5 mm, 40 cm
Double pointed needles 3.5 mm
Stitch wire
Stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Friends Wool**, Hobbii

100 % Wool
50 g = 100 m

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm =
22 sts x 22 rounds

ABBREVIATIONS

V – in the report means knit 2 sts together
VX – in the report means that you should work the sts twisted together so that the correct pattern colour is placed in front
* - in the report means: pay attention to further explanations in the text.
st = stitch
p = purl
k = knit
tot. = in total

2 (3) 4 (5) 6 (7) 8 years

MEASUREMENTS OF THE GARMENT

Circumference:

approx. 60,5 (66) 71,5 (74) 76,5 (79,5) 82,5 cm

Total length: approx. 33 (35) 44 (45) 53 (53) 58 cm

PATTERN INFORMATION

Silly Owl - Sweater is a soft and warm sweater knitted from the bottom up with a round yoke. The sweater has ribbing at the bottom of the body, on the cuffs and the neck. In order for the sweater to be easy to put on and take off, and to avoid scratching in the neck, it has a wide neck. Feel free to knit the rib in the neck slightly tighter than the knitting tension so that the neck retains its shape. It's also possible to knit a transparent thin elastic into the neck to preserve its shape more easily during use. The sweater is a play with colours and is suitable for all little adventurers!

INFO AND TIPS

Read through the entire pattern before you start knitting.

For the smaller sizes, it may help to increase the last stitches on the sleeves on round 1 in the report, if you have not managed to do so during the increase on each side of the marker.

Pick a circular needle that matches the gauge. For example: if you're a tight knitter you should choose 4 mm needles so that the garment does not feel stiff and is too small compared to the measurements in the pattern..

Measures

Length before decreasing for sleeves:

approx. 23 (25) 35 (35) 41 (41) 46 cm

Sleeve length: approx. 23 (25) 30 (30) 36 (36) 40

Report A: approx. 10.5 cm

Report B: approx. 9.5 cm for sizes 2, 3, 4, 5 years

Report B: approx. 11.5 cm for sizes 6, 7 and 8 years

BODY

Cast on 132 (144) 156 (162) 168 (174) 180 sts with the main colour on needles 60 cm. Work rib for 5 cm, k1, p1. Then work in stockinette stitch until the piece measures approx. 13 (15) 23 (25) 30 (30) 35 cm or desired length. Continue with report A. On Round 22 in the report, place markers in each side: at the beginning of the round and at the 66. (72.) 78. (81.) 84. (87.) 90. st. Cast off 6 sts on each side of the marker. The work should now measure approx. 23 (25) 35 (35) 41 (41) 46 cm. Put the work aside and knit the sleeves.

SLEEVES

Cast on 30 (30) 30 (36) 36 (36) 36 sts on double pointed needles 3.5 mm. Work k1, p1 for 5 cm. On the next round, increase by 4 sts evenly spaced. Work in stockinette stitch until the work measures approx. 12.5 (14.5) 19.5 (19.5) 25.5 (25.5) 29.5 cm or desired length. At the

same time, place a marker at the beginning of the round and increase by 1 st on each side of the marker, evenly spaced after approx. 1 (1.5) 1.5 (1.5) 1.5 (2.5) 3 cm The total amount of stitches is now: 54 (54) 60 (60) 60 (66) 66 sts. Work report A. On Round 22, cast off 6 sts on each side of the marker. Now the sleeve measures approx. 23 (25) 30 (30) 36 (36) 40 cm. Put the work aside and knit the other sleeve.

YOKE

Put the stitches for the sleeves on the needle on each side of the body. The holes under the armpits can either be knitted together or sewn together at the end. Knit 1 round with the main colour. The total amount of stitches is now: 194 (204) 228 (233) 240 (258) 265 sts. Knit 1 more round with the main colour while simultaneously decreasing 32 (24) 30 (35) 24 (24) 13 sts evenly spaced. The total amount of stitches is now: 162 (180) 198 (198) 216 (234) 252. Start working report B in the joining in the back between the body and the left sleeve. Work report B and decrease sts as shown. Note that sts marked VX in the report are to be knitted twisted to ensure that the correct pattern colour is placed in front. Round * 21, 22 and 23 is worked in sizes 6, 7 and 8 years only. Change to shorter needles if required.

NECK

You now have 81 (90) 98 (98) 108 (116) 126 sts on your needles. Knit 1 round. On the next round decrease evenly spaced: 6 (6) 8 (8) 9 (16) 26 sts = tot. 74 (84) 90 (90) 99 (100) 100 sts.

(If you want a narrower neck, you can knit 1 more round and then work another round where you decrease your desired number of sts for a narrower neck. Make sure that the neck is not too tight when putting the sweater on.)

Then work in rib, a little tighter than the rest of the sweater, on 40 cm needles, k1, p1, until you reach the desired length and cast off loosely. Fold down and knit/sew to the wrong side.

Weave in ends, dampen the work and dry flat.
