Candy Canes

Children's Sweater

MATERIALS

3/3/4/5/5/6/7 skeins of Tweed Delight color 27 (Wisteria Bloom)
1 skein of Friends Wool color 02 (Off white)
1 skein of Friends Wool color 40 (Tomato)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8)
Tapestry Needle
Tape measure
Scissors
2 stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

 **Tweed Delight**, Hobbii
85% Wool, 10% Acrylic, 30%, 5% Viscose
50 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

 **Friends Wool**, Hobbii
100 % Wool
50 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 13 sts x 8 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
st = stitch
sc = single crochet
dc = double crochet
fpdc = front post double crochet
bpdc = back post double crochet
fo = fasten off

SIZE

0-6 months/6-12 months/1-2 years/3-4 years
/5-6 years/7-8 years/9-10 years

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 26/28/30/32/35/39/41 cm
10/11/12/13/14/15/16 inches

Length: 28/30/32/35/38/42/45 cm
11/12/13/14/15/17/18 inches

INFO AND TIPS

This sweater is made by sewing together a front and back panel and then adding on sleeves. Your turning ch does not count as a st. You will be able to make candy canes and attach them wherever you want on the sweater!

BODY PANELS

Ribbing: With your main colour yarn chain 36/39/41/44/48/53/55. Dc in the 3rd ch from the hook and in each st back to the start, turn (34/37/39/42/46/51/53). Ch2, fpdc in the first st and bpdc in the second. Do this, alternating fpdc and bpdc stitches until you reach the end, turn.

Row 1: Ch2, dc in each st until the end, turn (34/37/39/42/46/51/53).

Rows 2 - 19/20/21/24/26/28/30: Rep Row 1 as many times as needed for your size. After the final row turn but do not fasten off.

For your front panel follow 'Front Shoulders' below. For your back panel follow 'Back Shoulders'.

FRONT SHOULDERS

Row 1: Ch2, 8/9/10/11/13/13/14 dc, 18/19/19/20/20/25/25 sc, 8/9/10/11/13/13/14 dc, turn.

Row 2: Ch2, 8/9/10/11/13/13/14 dc, 18/19/19/20/20/25/25 sc, 8/9/10/11/13/13/14 dc, fasten off. Make another body panel and then follow the back shoulder instructions.

BACK SHOULDERS

Row 1: Ch2, dc in each st until the end (34/37/39/42/46/51/53). Turn.

Row 2: Ch2, dc in each st until the end (34/37/39/42/46/51/53). Fasten off leaving a tail for joining.

CANDY CANES

You are going to make and sew on the candy canes now - this is much easier to do before you sew your front and back panels together!

Grab your red yarn and ch20.

Row 1: Dc in the third ch from the hook, dc in each of the next 9 sts, 2dc in each of the next 7 sts, dc1 in the last st and fasten off leaving a nice long tail to sew the candy cane to the sweater.

Make as many of these as needed and then use the red tails to securely sew them onto your front panel. You might wish to lay them all out and decide on their positions before you sew any on. Once they are sewn on you can use your white yarn to sew the stripes over them.

JOIN TOGETHER

Lay your front and back panels out with the shoulders touching (and wrong side facing out for both). Use your main colour yarn to stitch them together across the dc from your front panel (leave the sc sts as this is your head hole) on each shoulder, then weave in your ends.

NECKBAND

If your head hole looks a little small you can add 2 increases on each side while doing the neckband. If the head hole looks a little big you can do 2 decreases on each side instead!

Row 1: Join your main colour yarn in any dc along the back of the neck and ch2. Dc in the next st and each st around, then sl st into the top of your ch2, do not turn.

Row 2: Ch1, sc in each st around then sl st into the top of your ch1. Fasten off.

SLEEVES

These are worked flat and then sewn on.

Take your main colour yarn and ch 20/22/24/26/28/30/32, dc in the 3rd ch from the hook, and dc in each ch along to the end, turn.

Row 1: Ch2, fpdc in the first st, bdpdc in the next, then continue alternating fpdc/bpdc along to the end, turn (18/20/22/24/26/28/30)

Row 2: Ch2, dc in each st, turn (18/20/22/24/26/28/30)

Row 3: Ch2, 2dc in the first st, 2dc in the second st, dc in each st until the last 2 sts, 2dc in the next st and then 2dc in the last st, turn (22/24/26/28/30/32/34)

Row 4: Ch2, 2dc in the first st, 2dc in the second st, dc in each st until the last 2 sts, 2dc in the next st and then 2dc in the last st, turn (26/28/30/32/34/36/38)

Row 5: Ch2, 2dc in first st, dc in each st until the last st, 2dc in final st, turn (28/30/32/34/36/38/40)

Row 6: Ch2, dc in each st until the end, turn (28/30/32/34/36/38/40)

Repeat row 6 until your total sleeve length including the ribbing is 18/20/22/26/30/32/36cm then fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing.

JOIN SLEEVES

Turn your sweater inside out and use the long tail to sew the sleeve on. Tip - fold the sleeve in half and use stitch markers to mark where the top and bottom of the join should go to keep it even.. Once you have sewn the sleeve on to the arm hole you will need to sew down the length of the sleeve.

Next sew from the armpit down to the waistband to close the side of the sweater. Weave in your ends, turn the right way around and you're all done with the sweater.
