MATERIALS

10/11/12/13/14/15/16/17 skeins of TweedDelight color 16 (Pink Confetti)1 skein of Friends Wool color 02 (Off white)1 skein of Friends Wool color 40 (Tomato)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8) Tapestry Needle Tape measure Scissors 2 stitch markers

YARN QUALITY

Tweed Delight, Hobbii
 85% Wool, 10% Acrylic, 30%, 5% Viscose
 50 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

Friends Wool, Hobbii
 100 % Wool
 50 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE 10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 13 sts x 8 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain st = stitch sc = single crochet dc = double crochet fpdc = front post double crochet bpdc = back post double crochet fo = fasten off SIZE

XS/S/M/L/XL/2XL/3XL/4XL

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 45/50/55/60/65/70/75/80cm 18/20/22/24/26/28/29.5/31.5 inches

Length: 50/50/55/60/60/60/60/60 20/20/22/24/24/24/24/24 inches

Fits a bust up to: 80cm/90cm/100cm/110cm/120cm/130cm/ 140cm/150cm

INFO AND TIPS

This sweater is made by sewing together a front and back panel and then adding on sleeves. Your turning ch does not count as a st. You will be able to make candy canes and attach them wherever you want on the sweater!

BODY PANELS

Ribbing: With your main colour yarn (Tweed Delight) chain 60/66/74/80/86/92/98/104. Row 1: Dc in the 3rd ch from the hook and in each ch back to the start then turn (58/64/72/78/84/90/96/102).

Row 2: Ch2, fpdc in the first st and bpdc in the second. Do this, alternating fpdc and bpdc stitches until you reach the end, turn.

Row 3: Ch2, dc in each st until the end, turn (58/64/72/78/84/90/96/102).

Rows 4 - 37/37/38/45/45/45/45/45: Rep Row 3 the correct number of times for your size, turn but do not fasten off when you're finished.

If you are working on your front panel then you need to follow 'Front Shoulders' below. For your back panel follow 'Back Shoulders'.

FRONT SHOULDERS

Row 1: Ch2, 17/20/24/27/30/33/36/39 dc, 24 sc, 17/20/24/27/30/33/36/39 dc, turn Row 2: Rep Row 1 then fasten off. Now make another body panel and then follow the back shoulder instructions this time.

BACK SHOULDERS

Row 1: Ch2, dc in each st until the end (58/64/72/78/84/90/96/102). Turn. Row 2: Ch2, dc in each st until the end (58/64/72/78/84/90/96/102). Fasten off leaving a tail for joining in the next step.



CANDY CANES

You are going to make and sew on the candy canes now - this is much easier to do before you sew your front and back panels together!

Grab your red yarn and ch20.

Row 1: Dc in the third ch from the hook, dc in each of the next 9 sts, 2dc in each of the next 7 sts, dc in the last st and fasten off leaving a nice long tail to sew the candy cane to the sweater.

Make as many of these as needed and then use the red tails to securely sew them onto your front panel. You might wish to lay them all out and decide on their positions before you sew any on. Once they are sewn on you can use your white yarn to sew the stripes over them.

JOIN TOGETHER

Lay your front and back panels out with the shoulders touching (and wrong side facing out for both). Use your main colour yarn to stitch them together across the dc from your front panel (leave the sc sts as this is your head hole) on each shoulder, then fasten off and weave in your ends.

NECKBAND

If your head hole looks a little small you can add 2 increases on each side while doing the neckband. If the head hole looks a little big you can do 2 decreases on each side instead!

Row 1: Join your main colour yarn in any dc along the back of the neck and ch2. Dc in the next st and each st around, then sl st into the top of your ch2, do not turn.

Row 2: Ch1, sc in each st around then sl st into the top of your ch1. Fasten off.

SLEEVES

These are worked flat and then sewn on.

There are 2 sizes, once sewn on the smaller one measures 17.5cm width when laid flat, by 42cm long and the larger measures 18.5cm width when laid flat by 45cm. Choose whichever you prefer.

Ch 32/34 Dc in the 3rd ch from the hook, then dc in each st along to the end, turn (30/32) Row 1: Ch2, dc in each st, turn (30/32) Row 2: Ch2, *dc in next st, 2dc in next st* repeat until end, turn (45/48) Row 3: Ch2, dc in each st until end, turn (45/48)

Continue repeating row 3 until your total sleeve length including the cuff is 42/45 cm or 16.5/18 inches then fasten off leaving a long tail for sewing onto the body panels.



JOIN SLEEVES

Turn your sweater inside out and use the long tail to sew the sleeve on. Tip - fold the sleeve in half and use stitch markers to mark where the top and bottom of the join should go to keep it even.. Once you have sewn the sleeve on to the arm hole you will need to sew down the length of the sleeve, then fasten off.

Next sew from the armpit down to the waistband to close the side of the sweater. Weave in your ends, turn the right way around and you're all done with the sweater.
