MATERIALS

3 skeins of Tweed Dreams Color 25 (Spring Leaves)1 skein of Friends Wool color 02 (Off white)1 skein of Friends Wool color 40 (Tomato)

Crochet hook 5 mm (US H/8) Scissors Tapestry needle Tape measure

YARN QUALITY

Tweed Dreams, Hobbii
 100% Premium Acrylic
 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

Friends Wool, Hobbii

100 % Wool 50 g /1.75 oz = 100 m / 109 yds

GAUGE

10 cm x 10 cm (4" x 4") = 8 rows x 13 dc sts

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain st = stitch dc = double crochet fo = fasten off ws = wrong side rs = right side SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Width = 21cm (8.25 inches) **Length** = 117cm (46 inches)

3 x 50 g/1.75 oz balls makes this length but you can adjust as necessary, a ball should add about 40cm (16 inches) to the length

INFO AND TIPS

This scarf is made row by row so you can stop once you reach the right length for you! Ch2 does not count as a st. At the end you will make the candy canes in pairs and sew one on to the front and one on to the back (this way the ends are covered over and your scarf looks beautiful and neat on the front and back!)

START YOUR SCARF

Row 1: Using your main colour (I used green) ch 30 then dc in the 2nd ch from the hook and in each ch along, turn. (28) Row 2: Ch2, starting in the first st dc in each st along to the end, turn (28) Continue repeating row 2 until your scarf is long enough. Mine was made using 3 x 50g balls and measured 117cm (46 inches) long.

CANDY CANES

You are going to make and sew on the candy canes now. These will be made in pairs (one points to the left and one points to the right but both are right side facing) so you can sew one on the front and one directly behind it on the back to hide your ends. They don't have to line up perfectly they just need to cover the ends of the candy cane on the other side. Make one A and one B and check they line up when sewn on before you make more! A tip is to sew the first one on wherever you want and then turn the scarf over and use those ends as a guide for where to sew the second one on.

Candy Cane A

Grab your red yarn and ch20.

Row 1: Dc in the third ch from the hook, dc in each of the next 9 sts, 2dc in each of the next 7 sts, dc in the last st and fasten off leaving a nice long tail to sew the candy cane to the scarf.



<u>Candy Cane B</u>

Grab your red yarn and ch20.

Row 1: Dc in the third ch from the hook, 2dc in each of the next 7 sts, dc in each of the next 9 sts, dc1 in the last st and fasten off leaving a nice long tail to sew the candy cane to the scarf.

Make as many of these as needed and then use the red tails to securely sew them onto your scarf in pairs with one on the front of your scarf and another directly behind it on the back. Once they are sewn on you can use your white yarn to sew the stripes over them, and then hide the ends inside the middle of both candy canes.
