# **ON THE GO - BAG**

Spacious and versatile single-strap bucket bag

#### **PROJECT SUPPLIES**

YARN: Hobbii Happy Place, DK weight (#3); 50% wool, 50% cotton [273 yards (250 m) per 100g skein]. Color 35 Solid, 1065 yards/974 m (4 skeins)

HOOK: US 7 4.5mm crochet hook

NOTIONS & SUPPLIES: Scissors, tapestry needle, locking stitch markers

#### **FINISHED DIMENSIONS**

SIZE: 13" (33 cm) wide, 22.5" (57 cm) long with strap included, 4" (10 cm) deep

GAUGE: 4" (10 cm) = 15 sc x 9 rows in pattern repeat.

## **PATTERN DIRECTIONS**

### NOTES

- Special Stitch Half Double Crochet 3 Together (*hdc3tog*). Yo, pull up a loop in the last st of the previous decrease, (yo, pull up a loop in the next st) 2 times, yo, pull through 6 loops, yo, pull through remaining 2 loops. Find a helpful tutorial video <u>HERE</u>.
- Standing stitches are used to join yarn in this pattern. Learn the standing double crochet and standing single crochet in this tutorial video <u>LINK</u>.
- The base of this bag is joined to the body using a single crochet join to make it sturdy. Learn this join method in this tutorial video <u>LINK</u>.
- Starting ch 4 counts as dc + ch 1.
- This pattern uses a very tight gauge that may irritate sensitive hands and joints. Plan to take breaks as you're stitching, and consider going up a hook size for a more agreeable gauge.
- This project is worked with yarn held double throughout. Collect one yarn end from the center of the ball, and the other yarn end from the outside of the ball. Hold them together to stitch this project.

#### **BAG PATTERN**

**ROUND 1 (WS)**: Holding yarn double, ch 102, sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and each ch across, without twisting the strand join with a sl st in first sc to work in the round, turn. (*101 sc*)

**ROUND 2 (RS):** Ch 4, sk sc at base of ch, (yo, pull up a lp in the next st) 3 times, yo, pull through 6 lps, yo, pull through 2 lps, ch 1, (hdc3tog, ch 1) around, join with sl st in  $3^{rd}$  ch of tch, turn. (50 clusters, + 1 dc)

**ROUND 3:** Ch 1, sc in st at base of ch, sc in each ch-sp and st around, join with sl st in first sc of round, turn. (*101 sc*)

ROUNDS 4-25: Rep Rounds 2-3.

Straps are created directly on the bag. Do not fasten off. Proceed to Strap A.

#### **STRAP A**

**ROW 1:** Ch 4, sk sc at base of ch **AND** next 2 sc, \*(yo, pull up a lp in the next st) 3 times, yo, pull through 6 lps, yo, pull through 2 lps, ch 1, (hdc3tog, ch 1) 22 times, sk 2 sc, dc in next sc. **Mark the last dc.** Turn. (*23 clusters + 2 dc*)

**ROW 2:** Ch 1, sc in st at base of ch, sc in each ch-sp and st to tch, sc in tch-sp, sc in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch of tch, turn. (49 sc)

**ROW 3:** Ch 4, sk sc at base of ch **AND** next 2 sc, (yo, pull up a lp in the next st) 3 times, yo, pull through 6 lps, yo, pull through 2 lps, ch 1, (hdc3tog, ch 1) to last 3 sc, sk 2 sc, dc in last sc, turn. (*21 clusters + 2 dc*)

**ROWS 4-19:** Rep Rows 2-3. Last row will have 5 clusters + 2 dc.

**ROW 20:** Rep Row 2.

**ROW 21:** Ch 4, sk st at base of ch, (yo, pull up a lp in the next st) 3 times, yo, pull through 6 lps, yo, pull through 2 lps, ch 1, (hdc3tog, ch 1) to last sc, dc in last sc, turn.

ROW 22: Rep Row 2.

ROWS 23-28: Rep Rows 21-22.

ROW 29: Rep Row 21. Fasten off.

#### STRAP B

With RS facing and yarn held double, join with a standing dc in the marked st, drop marker.

**ROW 1**: Ch 1, rep Row 1 of Strap A from \* to end of row.

ROWS 2-29: Rep Rows 2-29 of Strap A. Fasten off leaving a 10" (25 cm) tail for seaming.

#### ASSEMBLY, PART 1

- Use remaining tail from Strap B to whip stitch last rows of Straps together.
- Weave in all ends.

• With yarn held double and RS facing, join with standing sc at Strap seam, sc evenly around entire Strap opening, sl st in first sc of round to join. Repeat for the other Strap opening.

#### BASE


**ROW 1:** With yarn held double, ch 11, sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook and each st across, turn. (10 sc).

ROWS 2-38: Ch 1, sc in each st across row, turn. DO NOT TURN after Row 38.

**BORDER:** Sc 1 in same st as last st (this creates a 2sc corner), rotate to work along row ends, sc in the end of each row, 3sc in corner, rotate to work along starting ch, sc in each ch, 3sc in corner, rotate to work along row ends, sc in the end of each row, 3sc in corner, rotate to work along top edge, sc in each st across, sl st in first sc of round. Fasten off. (101 sc)

#### ASSEMBLY, PART 2

- Position Base inside the bottom of the bag. Use locking stitch markers to connect the corners of the Base to the corners of the bag.
- With yarn held double and RS facing, join with a standing sc in any marked st. Be sure to catch the stitch of the Base AND the corresponding stitch of the bag.
- Sc join around the entire bag. Sl st in the first sc of the round to join.
- Weave in all ends.



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
