#### **MATERIALS**

4 (4, 5, 5, 6) skeins of Umami in color 02 1 (1, 1, 1, 1) skein of Umami in color 14

Needles 12 mm (US17) Circular needles 10 mm (US15)

Cable needle Stitch markers Stitch holder Tapestry needle

# YARN QUALITY

**Umami**, Hobbii 78% Premium Acrylic, 22% Wool 150 g / 5.3 oz = 83 m / 91 yds

#### **GAUGE**

6 sts x 10 rows = 10 cm x 10 cm / 4" x 4" In stockinette stitch With 12 mm (US17) needles

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

K = knit

P = Purl

St(s) = stitch(es)

RS = right side

WS = wrong side

SKPO = slip - knit - pass over

PO = pass over

k2tog = knit 2 stitches together

2/2RC = 2/2 CABLE RIGHT

# **PATTERN INFORMATION**

Bobbio Sweater is knitted from the bottom-up where the body is worked flat, with one strand of Umami.
The sleeves are knitted flat too separately

The sleeves are knitted flat too separately and to be sewn together. There is an easy cable to do. Perfect for intermediate knitters.

If you are in between two sizes, I recommend choosing the bigger one if you would like a more oversized fit or choosing the smaller one for a more fitted look.

Please refer to the size information with the widths and lengths noted to double check the measurements will be to your liking.

#### **INFO AND TIPS**

Follow the instructions for the size fitting your chest circumference; keep in mind the first number refers to size 1, the second to size 2 and so forth.

When there is only one number given, it means it applies to all sizes. When there is a "0" on your size, it means that instruction doesn't apply to your size.

A comma separates each size indication. A dash separates instructions for the same size. The word '\*indications\* - repeat \*\*' means you have to repeat indications between asterisks across the row, if not differently subsequent specifications.

I recommend circling the number in the pattern which corresponds to the size you are making before starting to knit to prevent any confusion.

Remember a knitted garment will never be exactly the same as another. Each one is unique. It is absolutely normal that measurements will be a little bit different from the ones indicated in the pattern.

When the type of needle is not specified, knit with the 12 mm / US17 needles or needles used to obtain gauge.

Remember that if you change the number of rows or stitches to match the measurements specified in the pattern or to achieve a different fit, you will need to recalculate and adjust the other pattern instructions accordingly. If you don't feel confident in performing this calculation due to your level of experience, I advise you to avoid making such modifications.

#### **Cables**

2/2 RC A

Slip 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in back - k2 - k2 from cable needle.

2/2 RC B

Slip 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in back - k2 - p2 from cable needle.

2/2 LC A

Slip 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in front- k2 - k2 from cable needle.

2/2 LC B

Slip 2 sts onto a cable needle and hold in front- p2 - k2 from cable needle.



#### **BACK**

Cast on 35 (37, 41, 43, 47) sts with color B and 10 mm (US15) needles. Two are edge sts. Row 1 to Row 6: work in 1x1 rib stitch, starting the first row with a knitted st.

Change from color B to color A. Change from 10 mm (US15) to 12 mm (US17)needles.

Row 7 (RS): knit all sts.

Row 8 (WS): purl all sts.

Row 9 to Row 40 (42, 44, 46, 48): repeat Row 7 and Row 8, paying attention to the following decreases.

A. Row 13 (13, 13, 15, 15) or when the piece measures approx. 13 (13, 13, 15, 15) cm/ 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) in: k2 - SKPO - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until there are 4 sts remaining: k2tog - k2.

#### **Shoulder decreases**

B. Row 37 (39, 41, 43, 45) or when the piece measures approx. 37 (39, 41, 43, 45) cm/ 14.5 (15.5, 16, 17, 17.5) in: instructions as in point A.

Before beginning Row 39 (41, 43, 45, 47), place one st marker after 9 (10, 11, 12, 13) sts.

C. Row 39 (41, 43, 45, 47): k2 - SKPO - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - bind off 13 (13, 15, 15, 17) sts - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until there are 4 sts remaining: k2tog - k2.

Row 41 (43, 45, 47, 49): Bind off all the sts of the back right and all sts of the back left.

# **FRONT**

Cast on 35 (37, 41, 43, 47) sts with color B and 10 mm (US15) needles. Two are edge sts. Row 1 to Row 6: work in 1x1 rib stitch, starting the first row with a purled st.

Change from color B to color A. Change from 10 mm (US15) to 12 mm (US17) needles. Row 7 (RS): knit all sts.

Row 8 (WS): purl all sts.

Row 9 to Row 38 (40, 42, 44, 46): repeat Row 7 and Row 8, ending with a Row 8, paying attention to the following decreases.

D. Row 13 (13, 13, 15, 15) or when the piece measures approx. 13 (13, 13, 15, 15) cm/ 5 (5, 5, 6, 6) in : k2 - SKPO - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until there are 4 sts remaining : k2tog - k2.

# **Neckhole**

Before beginning Row 33 (35, 37, 39, 41) place one st marker after 13 (14, 15, 16, 17) sts.

E. Row 33 (35, 37, 39, 41) or when the piece measures approx. 33 (35, 37, 39, 41) cm/ 13 (14, 14.5, 15.5, 16) in: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - Bind off 7 (7, 9, 9, 11) sts - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*.

#### **FRONT RIGHT**

F. Row 35 (37, 39, 41, 43) and Row 37 (39, 41, 43, 45): k2- SKPO - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until there are 4 sts remaining: k2tog - k2. Leave on hold sts of the front left.



Row 39 (41, 43, 45, 47): Bind off all the sts of the front right.

#### **FRONT LEFT**

G. Pick up sts you left on hold of the front left. Row 35 (37, 39, 41, 43) and Row 37 (39, 41, 43, 45): k2- SKPO - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until there are 4 sts remaining: k2tog - k2.

Row 39 (41, 43, 45, 47): Bind off all the sts of the front left.

#### **SLEEVES**

#### **SLEEVE CHART**

- (A) = k4 p8 k4
- (B) = 2/2LC A p8 2/2RC A
- (C) = k2 2/2LCB p4 2/2RCB k2
- (D) = k2 p2 2/2LCB 2/2RCB p2 k2
- (E) = k2 p4 2/2RCA p4 k2
- (F) = k2 p2 2/2RCB 2/2LCB p2 k2
- (G) = k2 2/2RC B p4 2/2LC B k2

Cast on 40 (44, 46, 46, 50) sts with color A. Two are edge sts. Place one st marker after 12 (14, 15, 15, 17) sts.

Row 1(RS): \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (A) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 2(WS) and all even rows: knit sts as they appear: knit the knits and purl the purls. Row 3: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (B) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 5: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (C) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 7: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (D) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 9: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (E) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 11: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (G) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*. Row 13: \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\* until you meet the st marker - (G) - \*knit sts\* - repeat \*\*.

Row 15 to Row 38 (40, 42, 46, 48): repeat Row 1 to Row 13, ending with a Row 10 (12, 14, 4, 6).

Change from 12 mm (US17) to 10 mm (US15) needles. Change from color A to color B. Row 39 ( 41, 43, 47, 49) or when the piece measures approx. 39 ( 41, 43, 47, 49) cm/15 (16, 17, 19, 19) in: p1 - \*k2tog - p1\* - repeat \*\* until there are 3 (1, 3, 3, 1) sts remaining: k1-p1-k1 ( k1, k1-p1-k1, k1-p1-k1 , k1) .

You have 28 (30, 32, 32, 34) sts on your needle.

Row 40 (42, 44, 48, 50) to Row 42 (44, 46, 50, 52): work in 1x1 rib stitch, starting the first row with a knitted st.

Row 43 (45, 47, 51, 53): Bind off all the sts. Repeat for the second sleeve.



# JOIN

Join the neck by sewing the bound off edges of the fronts to the bound off edge of the back.

Join the sleeve hole by sewing 12 (12, 12, 14, 14) sts of the front left lateral side with 12 (12, 12, 14, 14) sts of the back left lateral side; do the same with the right side, as well.

Sew the side sleeve seams by stitching through the first and last stitch of each row of the sleeve.

Sew the sleeve to the body by aligning and joining all stitches of the sleeve with approximately 1/2 of the body stitches, in this way:

- SIZE 1: \*sew 2 sts skip 1 st sew 2 sts\* repeat \*\* until there are 3 sts remaining: skip 1 st sew 2 sts.
- SIZE 2: \*sew 2 sts skip 1 st sew 2 sts\* repeat \*\* until there are 2 sts remaining: sew all sts.
- SIZE 3 and SIZE 4: \*sew 2 sts skip 1 st sew 2 sts\* repeat \*\* until there are 6 sts remaining: skip 1 st sew 2 sts skip 1 st sew 2 sts.
- SIZE 5: \*sew 2 sts skip 1 st sew 2 sts\* repeat \*\*.

# **NECKLINE**

Work with 10 mm (US15) circular needles. Work with color B.

Pick up all sts of neckhole plus 2 sts at the corners of front central. I suggest to start from the back.

You have 42 (42, 46, 46, 50) sts on your needle.

Row 1 to Row 4: work in 1x1 rib stitch, starting the first row with a purled st.

Row 5: Bind off sts.
