MATERIALS

Flash It!

1 x Blue [09] as yarn A

2 x Silver [12] as yarn B

1 x Green [06] as yarn C

1 x Red [04]

1 x Pink [03]

Crochet hook 6.5 mm (US K) Scissors Yarn needle

Optional - for stiffening:

White PVA glue and soft brush
Pins and blocking board or foam tiles

YARN QUALITY

Flash it!, Hobbii 80 % Viscose, 20 % Metallic Fiber 50 g / 1.75 oz = 90 m / 98 yds

MEASUREMENTS

Width: 11cm / 4.3" Length: 13 cm / 5.1"

PATTERN INFORMATION

This decoration winks at the famous Shiny Brite Ornaments, very popular during the 1940s-50s in the United States. If you are nostalgic for that mid-century Christmas feeling, well this bauble allows you to recreate that colourful atmosphere!

ABBREVIATIONS

cc = change of colour
ch = chain
st (s) = stitch (es)
sl st (s) = slip stitches
sc = single crochet
hdc = half double crochet
dc = double crochet
dc blo = double crochet in back loop only
FPdc = front post double crochet
tr = treble
RS = right side
WS = wrong side
prev = previous
rnd = round

INFO AND TIPS

A delicious chunky ornament, which gives you a vintage feeling of mid-century Christmases. The typical indent, which allows a 3D effect to the bauble is created alternating colours (like in tapestry crochet) and using a textural stitch as the front post double crochet. I confess to you that both the second and third rounds of this pattern could be tricky for that reason, but the final result it's worth it!

Remember to pull gently the yarns after each colour change to avoid gaps in the decoration. The colour change is made by pulling the new yarn through the last pull through of the previous stitch, so as to make the next stitch using the new colour.



BAUBLE



Using a 6.5 mm (US K) hook and **yarn A**, chain 4 and sl st in 1st chain to make a foundation ring.

Round 1 (RS): 2ch (doesn't count as a st here and throughout), 12dc, sl st in top of first st switching to **yarn B.** DO NOT FASTEN OFF yarn A, but carry it around as in tapestry crochet. [12dc]

Round 2: 2ch and 1dc in top of first dc, cc to yarn A, 1FPdc around post of first dc, cc to yarn B, (1dc in top of next dc, cc to yarn A, 1FPdc around the post of same dc, cc to yarn B) 11 times, sl st in top of first st. [12dc, 12FPdc]

In the above picture you can check both round 1 and round 2.



Round 3: 2ch and 2dc in top of first dc, cc to yarn A, 1FPdc around first FPdc of prev rnd, cc to yarn B, (2dc in top of next dc, cc to yarn A, 1FPdc around next FPdc of prev rnd, cc to yarn B) 11 times, sl st in top of first st, fasten off yarn A. [24dc, 12FPdc] Using only yarn B:

Round 4: 2ch and 1dc in top of first dc, 2dc in next dc, 1FPdc around first FPdc of prev rnd, (1dc, 2dc in next st, 1FPdc around next FPdc of prev rnd) 11 times, sl st in top of first st. [36dc, 12FPdc]

In the above picture you can see both round 3 and round 4.





Round 5: 2ch, 48dc blo, sl st in top of first st. [48dc blo]

Round 6: 1ch (doesn't count as a st) and 1sc in same st space, 19sc, 1hdc, 1dc, 2tr, 3ch, 2tr, 1dc, 1hdc, 20sc, sl st in top of first st and fasten off. [40sc, 2hdc, 2dc, 4tr, ch-3 space]

In the above picture you can check both round 5 and round 6.

You can substitute yarn A with yarn C to obtain a different centre colour.







To obtain a slightly different effect from the bauble given in the pattern, you need to:

- Not fasten off yarn A at the end of round 3
- Fasten off yarn B at end of round 4
- Work round 5 and round 6 using yarn A!

Just look at the picture on the left to see what you can get just following these tips!

Weave in all ends.



HANGING LOOP

Cut the desired length of yarn, matching it with the yarn used for the last round of the bauble.

Pass it through the ch-3 space, knot the ends together and trim the excess of yarn.

STIFFENING (OPTIONAL)

Prepare a solution made 50% of water and 50% of white PVA glue.

Pin the ornament (WS facing you, between rounds 4 and 5), on a blocking board or foam blocks.

With the help of a soft brush spread the solution on the ornament and let it dry completely before using it.
