MATERIALS

Ribbon from Hobbii
1 skein of each color:
Natural White (02)
Light Sand (21)
Chocolate (40)
Sage (52)

Crochet hook 10 mm
Wool needle
Magnetic button 20 mm
Sewing thread and needle

YARN QUALITY

 **Ribbon**, Hobbii
100% Cotton
250 g = 125 m

GAUGE

10 x 10 cm = 8 sts x 9 rows

ABBREVIATIONS

ch = chain
sc = single crochet
sl st = slip stitch
rnd = round
st(s) = stitch(es)maske
inc = increase
dec = decrease

SIZE

One size

MEASUREMENTS

Length: 32 cm
Height: 33 cm

PATTERN INFORMATION

The Gaia bag is a chunky shoulder bag, worked with double thread of Ribbon and a big crochet hook. That is why this a project which can be relatively easily finished. The bag is worked from the bottom and up, and only needs assembly at the top of the strap. The techniques used to crochet the bag are very simple and are generally chains, single crochets and increases and decreases. The pattern is therefore beginner friendly- There are pictures throughout the pattern.

INFO AND TIPS

The bag is worked from the bottom and up. That means the first row of chains form the bottom of the bag. The bag is worked with double thread, and you can mix the colors any way you like, as long as you always have two threads on the hook. The picture below shows how to get two threads from the same skein by pulling the end out of the middle of the skein.



BAG

Ch 23.



Rnd. 1: Start in 2. st from hook. Work 1 sc in each ch through the row. Work 3 sc in the last ch. Now continue on the other side of the chs, working 1 sc in each ch on the other side. Again work 3 sc in the last ch. Finish the rnd with sl st in first ch, so you can work around.

The round is now 48 sts.



Rnd. 2: Ch1, 1 sc in next 23 sts, 3 sc in next st, 1 sc in next 23 sts, and 3 sc in next st.

Round is now 52 sts.

Rnds. 3-5: 1 sc in each st around.

Rnd. 6: 1 sc in next 24 sts, 1 dec (2 sc becomes 1), 1 sc in next 24 sts, and 1 dec.

Round is now 50 sts.

Rnds. 7-8: 1 sc in each st around.

Rnd. 9: 1 sc in next 23 sts, 1 dec, 1 sc in next 23 sts, and 1 dec.

Round is now 48 sts.

Rnds. 10-11: 1 sc in each st around.

Rnd. 12: 1 sc in next 22 sts, 1 dec, 1 sc in next 22 sts, and 1 dec.

Rnds. 13-15: 1 sc in each st around. (Do not fasten off).

STRAP

FIRST SIDE

Rnd. 1: Continue with the yarn from the rnd before and work 5 sc, ch 1, turn.

Rnd. 2: 10 sc, ch1, turn.

Rnd. 3: 9 sc, ch1, turn.

Rnd. 4: 8 sc, ch1, turn.

Rnds. 5-17: 7 sc, ch1, turn.

Rnd. 18: 7 sc, fasten off.

SECOND SIDE

Secure the yarn in the 13. st after the first side of the strap, and pull through to create a loop.

Omg 1: ch1, 10 sc, ch1, turn.

Omg. 2: 9 sc, ch1, turn.

Omg. 3: 8 sc, ch1, turn.

Omg. 4-17: 7 sc, ch1, turn.

Omg. 18: 7 sc, fasten off.

The bag now looks like this:

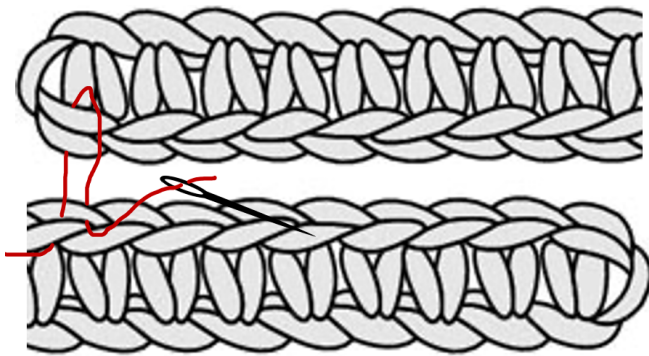


ASSEMBLY

Pull a 70 cm double thread through and fasten off. You will now use this thread to join the two sides of the strap. You do this by using a wool needle to sew through the first stitch outer loop from the front as shown here:



Then sew through both loops of the stitch on the other strap. The stitch is finished off by sewing through the back loop of the first stitch, as illustrated below:



Repeat this on all 8 sts so the strap becomes one.

Add the magnetic button with sewing thread in the middle of the opening of the bag, so it looks like this:



Weave all ends.
